Genesis

From ancient Bharat to modern India, higher education has always occupied a place of prominence in Indian history. In ancient times, Nalanda, Taxila and Vikramsila universities were renowned seats of higher learning, attracting students not only from all over the country but from far off countries like Korea, China, Burma (now Myanmar), Ceylon (now Sri Lanka), Tibet and Nepal. Today, India manages one of the largest higher education systems in the world*.

The present system of higher education dates back to Mountstuart Elphinstone's minutes of 1823, which stressed on the need for establishing schools for teaching English and the European sciences. Later, Lord Macaulay, in his minutes of 1835, advocated "efforts to make natives of the country thoroughly good English scholars". Sir Charles Wood's Dispatch of 1854, famously known as the 'Magna Carta of English Education in India', recommended creating a properly articulated scheme of education from the primary school to the university. It sought to encourage indigenous education and planned the formulation of a coherent policy of education. Subsequently, the universities of Calcutta, Bombay (now Mumbai) and Madras were set up in 1857, followed by the university of Allahabad in 1887.

The Inter-University Board (later known as the Association of Indian Universities) was established in 1925 to promote university activities, by sharing information and cooperation in the field of education, culture, sports and allied areas.

The first attempt to formulate a national system of education in India came In 1944, with the Report of the Central Advisory Board of Education on Post War Educational Development in India, also known as the Sargeant Report. It recommended the formation of a University Grants Committee, which was formed in 1945 to oversee the work of the three Central Universities of Aligarh, Banaras and Delhi. In 1947, the Committee was entrusted with the responsibility of dealing with all the then existing Universities.

Soon after Independence, the University Education Commission was set up in 1948 under the Chairmanship of Dr. S Radhakrishnan "to report on Indian university education and suggest improvements and extensions that might be desirable to suit the present and future needs and aspirations of the country". It recommended that the University Grants Committee be reconstituted on the general model of the University Grants Commission of the United Kingdom with a full-time Chairman and other members to be appointed from amongst educationists of repute.

In 1952, the Union Government decided that all cases pertaining to the allocation of grants-in-aid from public funds to the Central Universities and other Universities and Institutions of higher learning might be referred to the University Grants Commission. Consequently, the University Grants Commission (UGC) was formally inaugurated by late Shri Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the then Minister of Education, Natural Resources and Scientific Research on 28 December 1953.

The UGC, however, was formally established only in November 1956 as a statutory body of the Government of India through an Act of Parliament for the coordination, determination and maintenance of standards of university education in India. In order to ensure effective region-wise coverage throughout the country, the UGC has decentralized its operations by setting up seven regional centers at Pune, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Bhopal, Guwahati Bangalore and Delhi. The head office of the UGC is located at Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg in New Delhi, with two additional bureaus operating from 35, Feroze Shah Road and the South Campus of University of Delhi as well.

University Grants Commission Composition

- (1) The Commission shall consist of-(i) A Chairman, (ii) A Vice-Chairman, and (iii) seven other members, to be appointed by the Central Government.
- (2) The Chairman shall be chosen from among persons who are not officer of the Central government or of any State government.
- (3) Of the other member referred to in clause (iii) of sub-section (1) (a) two shall be chosen from among of the Central Government, to represent that Government (b) not less than four shall be chosen from among persons who are at the time when they are so chosen, teachers of Universities; and (c) the remainder shall be chosen from among persons:- (i) who have knowledge of, or experience in, agriculture, commerce, forestry or industry; (II) who are member of the engineering, legal, medical or any other learned profession; or (iii) who are Vice-Chancellors of Universities or who, not being teachers of Universities, are in the opinion of the Central Government, educationists of repute or have obtained high academic distinctions. Provided that not less than one-half of the number chosen under this clause shall be from among persons who are not officers of the Central Government or of any State Government.
- (4) The Vice-Chairman shall exercise such of the powers, and discharge such of the duties, of the Chairman as may be prescribed.
- (5) Every appointment under this section shall take effect from the date on which it is notified by the Central Government in the official Gazette.

The Annual Report of the University Grants Commission (UGC) for the period 2022-23 highlights the major initiatives taken by the UGC towards maintaining and coordinating higher education standards in India. During the 2022-23 period, which marked the second anniversary year of NEP 2020, the UGC undertook various transformative initiatives to advance higher education in India. These included introducing 'Indian Knowledge Systems' (IKS) as a subject in the National Eligibility Test (UGC-NET) and approving draft guidelines for faculty training in IKS. The UGC also implemented pioneering regulations for Twinning, Joint Degree, and Dual Degree Programs, aligning with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, emphasizing academic flexibility and global standards. Furthermore, the Commission's decision to launch the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) reflects its commitment to enhancing academic mobility and flexibility. The establishment of an e-resources portal with Common Service Centers (CSCs) of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) was also a significant step towards digital empowerment.

The UGC's commitment to academic excellence was further exemplified through its Research Grant/ Fellowship Schemes and initiatives like the 'Guidelines for Pursuing Two Academic Programmes Simultaneously' and 'Guidelines for Engaging Professors of Practice in Universities and Colleges.' In addition, the e-Samadhan Portal has made the grievance redressal process more efficient.

It is hoped that the data/information provided in this Annual Report would be helpful for teachers, students, researchers, and administrators in higher education.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my sincere thanks and gratitude to all the members of the Commission for their unwavering support in carrying forward the UGC's agenda.

I would also like to acknowledge the valuable contributions made by my colleagues in bringing the Annual Report in its present form. Executive Summary: 2022-23

The Executive Summary of the UGC Annual Report 2022-23 encapsulates the activities of the UGC undertaken in 2022-23 to achieve its mandatory objectives of coordination, determination and maintenance of standards of University Education. The physical targets achieved under various schemes/programmes implemented by the Commission during 2022-23 and the expenditure entailed on the same have been depicted in detail. The summary will give in a nutshell the composition and role of the UGC, statistical growth in the higher education sector, major decisions taken in the year, financial outlays to Universities and Colleges under various schemes and steps taken to promote Quality and Excellence, Research, Access and Equity including Skill Education, Open and Distance Learning and Online Learning.

1. Introduction

- The Commission consists of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Nine members (Secretary of Education, Additional Secretary-Expenditure, seven other members) appointed/nominated by the Government of India. The Secretary headed the Commission's Secretariat with 309 working staff including 69 Group 'A' and 151 Group 'B' officers, 84 Group 'C' officials and 5 Canteen Staff. Out of the working staff strength, 26.53% are Women, 24.91% are Scheduled Caste, and 5.82% are Scheduled Tribe employees.
- The UGC had decentralized its functioning by opening 6 Regional Offices and One Bureau office in UGC since 1994. As per the decision taken in the 558th commission meeting held on 06.05.2022, the UGC regional offices have been re-located to UGC New Delhi.
- During 2022-23 UGC received 16337 RTI applications, disposed off 10427 and of the 2104 appeals received, 1408 were disposed off. The RTI fee collected by the RTI cell was ₹25812/- and the additional fee as per RTI rules for providing the information was ₹13366/-.
- The Pay Scale Section is entrusted with the responsibility of coordinating the work of Pay Review Committees set by the Central Govt. from time to time and in the matters relating to Pay Scale and service conditions of teachers and other equivalent cadres viz. Librarians and Directors of Physical Education in Universities and Colleges. During the reporting year 2022-23, the following important decisions have been taken and conveyed to the Ministry of Education.
- Guidelines were issued on 14th November, 2022 for engaging Professors of Practice in Universities and Colleges [No.F.9-1/2010(PS/Misc.)PT-1]. Since one of the recommendations of NEP 2020 is to impart holistic and multidisciplinary education in higher educational institutions, the UGC has created a new position called "Professor of Practice" in which participation of experienced practitioners/professionals/industry etc., in the teaching-learning process is to be ensured.
- During the year 2022-23, the Vigilance Cell received one complaint from the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC), Three from Ministry of Education, Eight from CBI, Five CVC referred complaints forwarded by Ministry of Education and Fifteen from various Universities/Colleges and other agencies. The complaints received against Universities and Colleges were forwarded to the concerned bureau of UGC/Universities/Colleges/ Institutes for taking necessary action. Two RTI/Appeal applications were also received in Vigilance Cell offline and Seven RTI/Appeals were received online along with one parliament question.
- The UGC had been impleaded in 1024 cases filed in various courts of India during 2022-23 and an expenditure of ₹ 238.27 Lakh was incurred on the bills of advocates.
- The Desk-Parliament received 611 Parliament Questions during 2022-23. The number of starred questions was 67 and the rest had been disposed off.

- The Cell against Malpractices which deals with the menace of the existence and mushrooming of Fake Universities and degrees has identified a total of 20 institutions and initiated action on them. Presently, 20 fake universities/Institutions are enlisted in the list of fake universities maintained by UGC which is available on the UGC website (www.ugc.ac.in). Public notices/Press releases for awareness of public/students in newspapers at the beginning of the academic session cautioning aspiring students not to seek admission to Fake Universities/Institutions.
- During the period under report no fresh case was reported to the UGC Internal Complaints Committee on Sexual Harassment of Women at the workplace.
- UGC has nominated a Joint Secretary as Liaison Officer and he is assisted by the Education Officer to safeguard and watch the interest of officers/officials belonging to reserved categories.
- The Anti Ragging Cell which was set up in 2008 is responsible for eradicating the menace of ragging from Higher Educational Institutions. All Higher Educational Institutions have been asked to follow the UGC regulations about ragging. A nationwide 24x7 toll-free anti-ragging helpline 1800-180-5522 has been established with call centre facilities in 12 languages and has been made operational by the UGC for helping victims of ragging, besides facilitating effective coordinated action by all concerned. The complaints can also be filed through email at *helpline@antiragging.in.*, 858 complaints of ragging were recorded by the National Anti-Ragging helpline during 2022-23 and out of this, 797 complaints have been disposed off and 61 complaints were active. An expenditure of ₹ 20203723/- was incurred in executing, monitoring, evaluation and running a 24x7 Anti-Ragging helpline.
- To obtain the policy of zero tolerance, UGC has taken various measures to ensure the Safety of Women on campuses and Programmes for Gender Sensitization.
- UGC sends an advisory once a year to the Vice-Chancellors of all the Universities with the request to implement the guidelines of Gender Champions and inform the same to their affiliated colleges with a request to fill an online compliance of Gender Champion at the SAKSHAM web portal. Latest advisory has been uploaded on 10-06-2022.
- The Public Grievances Cell of UGC receives all the Grievances through online mode as a hard copy through the Ministry of Education. The Grievances received are forwarded to the Bureau Head for immediate reply. 2491 grievances were received out of which 2438 Grievances were disposed off.
- Publication Bureau has been bringing out various publications such as the UGC Annual Report, Annual Account and Guidelines for various schemes/programmes being implemented by UGC enactments reports UGC Conference Reports, Committee Reports, brochures and leaflets, etc. During 2022-23, the Publication Bureau incurred an expenditure of ₹ 1348396/-

Budget and Finances of UGC - The Budget and receipt of Grant-in-Aid for the financial year 2022-23 was to the extent indicated below:

- Total Grants received (Revenue & Capital) from the Ministry of Education under General Budget Head was ₹18069.86 Crores. An amount of ₹ 36.72 Crores as unspent balance (2022-23) was also used during 2022-23.
- Grants Received from the Ministries under Revenue and Capital (General) Budget during 2022-23 are as follows: (1) Ministry of Education New Delhi (General): ₹ 18069.86 Crores (2) Ministry of Social & Justice Empowerment, New Delhi: ₹ 74.59 Crores; (For National Fellowship for SC candidates & National Fellowship for OBC Candidates) (3) Ministry of Minority Affairs, New Delhi: ₹ 51.61 Crores.
- Revenue and Capital Grants (Fund Received =18069.86 + Unspent Balance of 2022-23 = 36.72 Crore) Grants amount to ₹ 17067.11 Crore released to Institutions during 2022-23. ₹ 10426.97

Crore had gone to Central Universities, ₹ 3041.53 Crores to colleges of Central Universities, ₹ 403.1 Crore to State Universities, ₹ 397.97 Crore to Institutions Deemed to be Universities, ₹ 15.04 Crore to Colleges of State Universities, ₹ 227.96 Crore to Inter university Centres, ₹ 0.05 Crores to Regional Centres, ₹ 1449.07 to online payment through Banks for Scholarships/ Fellowships, ₹ 9.00 Crore to Distance Education Bureau (DEB), ₹ 976.56 Crores to Institute of Eminence (IoE), ₹ 1.18 Crores to Miscellaneous/Non-Universities/ Institutions/, ₹ 118.76 Crores to Administrative Charges (HO) & (RO).

- The UGC set up a Joint Cadre Review Committee (JCRC) with the objective of recommending a complete framework of Uniform service conditions for the non-teaching staff (Group A, B & C) of central universities, the UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities and the Delhi Colleges. During 2022-23, JCRC resolved 58 cases of non-teaching staff received from CUs/DUs (100% funded).
- During 2022-23, University Grants Commission held 11 meetings out of which 08 meetings were conducted by e-Circulation. Major Decisions taken on matters relating to Standards; References from Government and other National Bodies; Special Programmes; Quality Programmes and Grants to Universities/Colleges are given in Chapter I from Page No. 60 80.
- During 2022-23, Special Activities/Initiative taken is given in chapter I from Page No. 82 to Page No. 89.
- The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 visualizes a paradigm shift in the Indian higher education system in terms of re-conceptualisation of the structure and system and new educational practices. As part of the one year of transformative reforms under NEP 2020, the University Grants Commission (UGC), in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, Department of Sports, All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), had organised eight webinars on various themes of the NEP. The themes were based on various aspects of the National Education Policy such as Equity and Inclusion; Multidisciplinary and Holistic Education; Skill, Entrepreneurship Development and Employability; Youth Empowerment and Sports Development; Indian Knowledge System, Languages, Arts and Culture; Quality Education, Accreditation and Teacher Development; Research, Innovation and Ranking; Use of Technology in Education.
- Some of the key initiatives undertaken by the UGC include Regulations on Academic Bank of Credits, Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes, Common Universities Entrance Test (CUET), Regulations on Academic collaboration with foreign Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) for Joint and Dual Degree Programmes, Guidelines for Professor of Practice, Guidelines on Pursuing two Academic Programmes simultaneously, Guidelines for Internship/ Apprenticeship embedded Degree programme, Guidelines for Admission and Supernumerary seats of International Students in Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes in Higher Educational Institutions in India, Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes, Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree, Guidelines for transformation into Multidisciplinary Institutions, Accessibility Guidelines and Standards for Higher Education Institutions and Universities, Regulations on Online and Open and Distance Learning (ODL) Education, Regulations on Credit Framework through SWAYAM, Guidelines for Internationalisation of Higher Education, Framework for Global Citizenship Education in Higher Education, Guidelines for the Establishment of Research and Development Cells in HEIs, Curriculum Framework for Undergraduate Education on basic facilities and amenities for Safe Secure Environment for Women and Women Cell (for Sensitization, Policy Implementation, Monitoring and Grievance Redressal) in Higher Educational Institutions, Guidelines on Fostering Social Responsibility and Community Engagement in Higher Education Institutions in India 2.0.

• Having come into being on 28th December, 1953, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has completed 70 years of its existence with its mandate for the co-ordination and determination of standards in universities. It has, thus, covered 70 milestones of its journey for qualitative improvement of higher education in the country.

2. Statistics: Growth of Higher Education

- The Commission is empowered under Section 12(h) and under Section 12(i) of the UGC Act, 1956 to collect information on all such matters relating the University education in India and other countries as it thinks fit and to require a university to furnish it with such information as may be needed related to the financial position of the University. To get timely and quality data in the Higher Education Sector which has an implication for human development, the Ministry of Education initiated an All India Survey of Higher Education to build a database and to assess the overall picture of Higher Education in the country.
- A dedicated portal (http://aishe.gov.in) has been developed with the help of the National Informatics Centre (NIC) for the collection and compilation of the data. All the institutions need to register on the portal to access the portal and upload the data. UGC, Information and Statistics Bureau from 2014-15 has stopped collecting data directly from Universities/Institutions/Colleges on all such matters relating to university education in India. In order to get timely and quality data in the education sector, compilation and estimation of data at all India levels is being made through the portal http://aishe.gov.in and this has made us shift to paperless exercise. AISHE portal is the only source of information for preparing educational statistics on student enrolment, foreign students, out-turn/Pass Outs and Teaching staff in universities and colleges. AISHE 2021-22 Report is in the final stage of printing so actual statistical figures on Higher Education could not be prepared for the year 2022-23. AISHE 2022-23 is in the process of collection of data so that statistical figures could not be included in UGC Annual Report 2022-23.
- Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) 2020-21 in Higher Education in India is 27.30% which is calculated for 18-23 years of Age Group. GER for the male population is 26.7% and for females, it is 27.9%. AISHE Report 2021-22 is not yet published.
- As on 31.03.2023, the number of Universities listed by the UGC under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act 1956 had gone up to 1,085 Universities 56 Central, 465 State Public, 433 State Private, 127 Deemed to be Universities, 4 Institutions established under State Legislation and 13,523 Colleges are listed under Section 2(f) and out of these colleges 10403 colleges are under Section 12B and 3,120 colleges under section 2(f) only in the Higher Education sector.
- During 01.04.2022 to 31.03.2023: 2 Central Universities, 15 State Public Universities, 24 State Private Universities, and 1 Institution Deemed to be a University and No Institute established under state legislature were included in the list of universities.
- During 01.04.2022 to 31.03.2023: 2 State Public Universities and 2 State Private Universities were declared fit to receive central Assistance under section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.
- During 2022-23 there are 47844* Colleges (Affiliated 44184, Constituent 2023, PG/Off Campus Centres 218, Recognised Centres 1419). (*Figures provisional).
- During the academic session 2021-22, the total student enrolment (estimated on simple average) in all courses and levels in regular and distance education Programmes was 41843704.
- During the year 2020-21, the total foreign Student enrolment (based on actual response) was 48035.
- During the year 2021-22, the total number of Out-turn/Pass-outs in all Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) (Provisional figure) was 10277472*. (*Provisional Figures based on actual response on AISHE Portal 2021-22)

- During the year 2021-22, out of a total of 1510957* Teachers, there were 848552 Male Teachers, 662228 Female Teachers and 177 Transgender Teachers (* Provisional Figures based on actual responses on AISHE Portal 2021-22) in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs).
- During the year 2021-22, out of a total no. of 1138779* Non-Teaching Staff, there were 635502 Male Non-Teaching Staff, 502951 Female Non-Teaching staff & 326 Transgender Non-Teaching Staff (*Provisional Figures based on actual response on AISHE Portal 2021-22) in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs).

3. Development Schemes and Assistance to Universities

General Development Grants are being provided to the Central, State and Deemed Universities for their overall development covering aspects like enhancing access, ensuring equity, imparting relevant education, improving quality, making the administration effective, enhancing facilities for students, augmenting research facilities and any other plans of universities. Maintenance Grants are also being provided to a limited number of universities to meet their recurring expenditure on salaries of both teaching and non-teaching employees, maintenance of labs, libraries, buildings and for obligatory payments such as taxes, telephone & electricity bills, postage, etc. The Central and a few Deemed Universities are being paid both Capital and Revenue (Salary and Recurring Expenditure) grants whereas the State Universities are being paid only Capital Grants. Private Universities give grants for teachers & students schemes only.

- During 2022-23, the number of Central Universities including South Asian University was 56. Out of these, Ten universities namely, (i) Central Agricultural University, Imphal, Manipur (ii) Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi (iii) Indian Maritime University, Chennai (iv) South Asian University, New Delhi (v) Nalanda University, Bihar (vi) Rajiv Gandhi National Aviation University, Uttar Pradesh and (vii) Rani Lakshmi Bai Central Agricultural University, Jhansi, Uttar Pradesh (viii) Dr. Rajendra Prasad Central Agricultural University, Pusa, Samastipur (ix) National Sports University, Koutruk, Manipur & (x) Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya, Vadodara are not funded by the UGC.
- During 2022-23, grants released to 45 Central Universities under Recurring Grant (31): ₹ 374411.50 Lakh, Salary Grant (36): ₹ 661085.00 Lakh and Capital Assets (35): ₹ 63725.00 Lakh.
- Grants of ₹ 21000.00 Lakh, ₹ 2625.00 Lakh and ₹ 7875.00 Lakh were released to the Institute of Medical Sciences (IMS, BHU) under Recurring, Capital Assets and Salary respectively during 2022-23.
- An amount of ₹ 15912.94 Lakh has been released to all Central Universities during 2022-23 under the Scheme of Non-NET Fellowship for M.Phil./Ph.D.
- An amount of ₹ 99.56 Lakh has been released to Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Lucknow during 2022-23 and 754 Students benefited during the financial year 2022-23 under Coaching Scheme for Residential Coaching Academies for Minorities/SC/ST/Women.
- UGC established Centres for Indigenous Languages in two Central Universities for the preservation and promotion of endangered Languages with the Scheme.
- UGC is providing funds to all Universities that are under section 2(f) & 12B of the UGC Act for establishing and strengthening the Internal Quality Assurance Cell existing in them.
- The Ministry of Education/Govt. of India, vide its Notification dated 25.05.2022 established a new Central University, namely Sindhu Central University. The University has been functional from a temporary campus at Tura Village UT of Ladakh from the academic year 2022-23 in accordance with the provisions of the Central Universities Act, 2009, as amended by the Central Universities (Amendment) Act, 2021. An amount of ₹8.50 lakh has been released to Educational Consultants India Limited (EdCIL) for the preparation of the DPR of Sindhu Central University.

- Common University Entrance Test (CUET) was introduced in the academic session 2022-23 for admission in all Central Universities and other participating Universities through the National Testing Agency (NTA). The CUET is conducted in a minimum of 13 languages.
- Guidelines on the Optimum Utilization of the resources available in Central Universities. The Government of India/UGC has been supporting Central Universities as well as other HEIs in setting up infrastructural facilities and resources to bring about qualitative improvement in research and development activities. Continuous funding is required for the upkeep and maintenance of the infrastructural facilities and therefore, it has been decided to share their infrastructure with other HEIs for optimum use of the available resources by charging on a nominal charges. This additional revenue would also help these institutions to maintain their resources in a better way, apart from making the state-of-the-art resources available to the needy ones. For this, HEIs may allow their resources, like libraries, laboratories, equipment, etc., to be shared /used during free time by students and researchers of other HEIs.
- The UGC has also decided that no Higher Educational Institution or its Faculties, Schools, Departments, Centres, or any other units therein, by whatever name called, shall be eligible for applying or receiving financial assistance from the Commission from 1st April, 2016 onwards, under any of its schemes without having undergone assessment and accreditation on or before 31st December, 2015. Out of 45 Central Universities: 43 Central Universities have obtained the NAAC accreditation. However, Central University of Andhra Pradesh, Anant Puram, Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh, Vijayanagaram & Sindhu Central University of Ladakh are not eligible for NAAC accreditation and Mahatma Gandhi Central University, Motihari has not received accreditation so far.
- As on 31st March, 2023, there were 465 State Public and 433 State Private Universities set up under laws enacted by the legislatures of various states. 267 State Public Universities and 26 State Private Universities are eligible for Central assistance under section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.
- An amount of ₹ 37,56,174/- was sanctioned as reimbursement under the General Development Assistance Scheme for the XI plan period, and ₹ 16,02,471/- was sanctioned as reimbursement under the Merged Scheme for the XI plan period.
- An amount of ₹ 29,40,34,792/- (from 01.04.2022 to 31.03.2023) has been sanctioned by way of reimbursement to State Universities under the General Development Assistance Scheme for the XII plan period.
- An amount of ₹ 278,09,10,000/- (from 01.04.2021 to 31.03.2022) was sanctioned to Punjab University, Chandigarh towards Non-Plan grant under Salary Head.
- An amount of ₹ 9,00,00,000/- (i.e.,01.04.2021 to 31.03.2022) was sanctioned to Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, Punjab, towards the Celebration of the 550th Birth Anniversary of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji.
- As on 30.03.2023, there are 127 Institutions Deemed to be Universities in the country. Out of these Institutions Deemed to be Universities 49 Institutions Deemed to be Universities are under Section 12B of the UGC Act 1956.
- Out of 127 Institutions Deemed to be Universities there are 8 identified Institutions Deemed to be Universities receiving funds GDA/Maintenance/Fixed Maintenance from the UGC.
- The UGC has released an amount of ₹ 39325.00 Lakh (Grant-in-aid General/Pension (31): ₹ 5500.00 Lakh & Salary Object (36): ₹ 33825.00 Lakh) to 8 Institutions Deemed to be Universities during the year 2022-23.
- As on 31st March, 2023, there were 433 Private Universities. 26 State Private Universities under

section 12B of the UGC Act 1956 are eligible for grants under teacher's student-centric schemes. Private Universities are regulated by the UGC through UGC (Establishment of and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulations 2003.

4. Development Schemes and Assistance to Colleges

- The focus of Development Assistance to colleges has been on supporting the teaching learning process by upgrading basic infrastructure. Emphasis has been on the expansion and consolidation of facilities in the existing institutions, improvement of standards through modernization, rationalization and diversification of UG courses especially to relate them to career opportunities.
- As on 31.03.2023, there were 46207 Colleges* (Affiliated & Constituent) (*Provisional Figure as per AISHE Portal) in the country. Out of these, only 3120 colleges are recognized up to 31.03.2023 under section 2(f) of the UGC Act. In total 13523 colleges 10403 are eligible to receive grants from the UGC under Section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956. All the schemes/programmes relating to the college sector are being implemented through the UGC. As per decision taken in 558th Commission meeting held on 06.05.2022, the UGC Regional Offices have been relocated to UGC Headquarter at New Delhi.
- During the year 2022-23, total Revenue Grant of ₹ 300382.53 Lakh as a maintenance grant had been provided to 53 Colleges of the University of Delhi. Capital Grant of ₹ 58184959 provided to 18 Colleges of University of Delhi towards Construction of building projects to conduct seminars/conference/workshop.
- During the year 2022-23 total Revenue Grant of ₹ 9614.00 Lakh as a maintenance grant was provided to 4 Colleges admitted to the privilege of Banaras Hindu University.

5. Quality & Excellence

- The University Grants Commission in pursuit of excellence in teaching and research in the Institutions of Higher Education has been providing substantial support to selected universities and colleges through various schemes like Colleges with Potential for Excellence (CPE), Centre with Potential for Excellence in Particular Area (CPEPA), University with Potential for Excellence (UPE) and New Scheme with a view to enable them to reach the world-class level and serve as a benchmark for other institutions in the country.
- To achieve excellence mainly in teaching and to initiate a research culture in colleges, the UGC has initiated a scheme "College with Potential for Excellence" (CPE). The scheme was continued during the XII Plan period, and under the Scheme, there were 314 approved institutions. Out of which 295 Colleges had the CPE Status and 19 Colleges had the College of Excellence (CE) Status under the CPE Scheme. During the year 2022-23, an amount of ₹ 23,46,000/- was released to the 03 Colleges/Beneficiaries under the CPE scheme.
- Under the Scheme University with Potential for Excellence (UPE), so far 16 universities have been selected during the XII Plan and the tenure of 16 all the universities is already over. During the financial year 2022-23, no grant was released to any UPE Universities.
- The University Grants Commission introduced the Scheme "Centre with Potential for Excellence in Particular Areas (CPEPA)" to promote quality and excellence and interdisciplinary approach in teaching and research activities. This initiative also was continued in the XII Plan period and there were 29 institutions that had CPEPA Status under the Centre with Potential for Excellence in a Particular Area (CPEPA). During the financial year 2022-23, no grant was released to any centre under the scheme CPEPA.

- The University Departments of Science including Bioscience, Engineering and Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences are being supported financially under the scheme of Special Assistance Programme (SAP) to achieve excellence in research and to improve the quality of Post Graduate teaching programme. As on 31.03.2023, the number of SAP-supported departments stood at 582. An Expenditure of ₹ 2.13 Crores was incurred on 42 beneficiary departments during 2022-23.
- To provide academic freedom for potential colleges which are recognized under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, the UGC has been conferring autonomous status on them. As on 31.03.2023 there were 903 Autonomous Colleges spread over 118 Universities and 25 States during 2022-23.
- A comprehensive Programme for the professional development of teachers through Human Resource Development Centers (HRDC) (Academic Staff Colleges ASC) has been carried out in different disciplines. UGC has sanctioned grants to 50 out of 66 HRDCs. The Grant could not be released to 16 HRDCs due to unsettled accounts/HRDCs not operationalizing the TSA for the years 2019-20, 2020-2021, 2021-22 & 2022-23. Approximately 95311 Teachers-participants have gone through the programmes/courses conducted by the 66 UGC HRDCs. An amount of ₹ 32,86,21,758/- (₹32.86 Crore) was released to 50 HRDCs for 2022-23.
- The University Grants Commission initiated the scheme of Human Rights Education in University Sector in 1985. Since then, the Higher Education Sector has been supported financially and for promoting Human Rights and Values and Human Development as well. There are three components of the Human Rights Education scheme (i) Human Rights and Duties, (ii) Human Rights and Values and (iii) Human Rights and Human Development.
- Towards the promotion of the Hindi Language, the Rajbhasha Cell of the UGC organized Essay, Noting & Drafting and Hindi typing competitions for its employees, conducted workshops/Hindi Pakhwara and celebrated Hindi Divas during the reporting year. In the year 2022-23, four meetings of the Official Language Implementation Committee were held on 28.04.2022, 06.09.2022, 22.12.2022 and 24.03.2023 through hybrid medium. Three officers were nominated for Hindi proficient training and all three passed the examination in first class. These three officers were given an incentive amount of ₹10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) paid lump on a one-time pay hike. Settlement of accounts by issuing a grant of ₹25 lakh to Mohanlal Sukhadia University and ₹12.50 lakh to Cochin University of Science and Technology, Kochi for the establishment of Hindi Cell in Central University and the establishment and upgradation of the Hindi Department in Central/Deemed/State Universities.
- UGC has been running Joint Research Programme with countries like the USA, UK, Israel, Norway, and New Zealand and has also facilitated Indian Scholars to realize their research potential through scholarship and research programmes, etc.
- Under the Indo-Israel Joint Research Programme, UGC and Israel Science Foundation (ISF), so far 43 projects have been awarded under the programme. The programme is open to all disciplines.
- UGC-UKIERI Thematic Partnerships are intended to be between Institution-based research teams in the UK and India of proven research ability. Under UKIERI Phase III, the Higher Education Leadership Development Programme for Administrative Staff of Indian Universities was implemented. The programme was conducted in two phases and the second phase concluded in March, 2022
- Indo-German Partnerships in Higher Education (IGP): On the basis of the MoU signed between the Ministries and Joint Declaration of Intent (JDI), an MoU was signed on 5th October 2015 between the University Grants Commission (UGC), India and German Academic Exchange

Service (DAAD), Germany on Indo-German Partnership in Higher Education (IGP) and MoU was exchanged in the presence of Honorable Prime Minister of India and Higher Education Chancellor of Germany. In the 1st cycle, 8 Institutional partnerships were awarded in 2016 for Four Years from 1st July, 2016 to 30th June, 2020 extended up to 31st December, 2020. In the 2nd cycle, 9 Institutional partnerships were awarded in 2020 for the project period of 4 years i.e., 1st July, 2020 to 30th June, 2024. An expenditure of ₹ 121.99 Lakh was incurred on Indo-German Partnerships in Higher Education (IGP) during 2022-23.

- The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and the University Grants Commission (UGC) in New Delhi have worked out a programme designed to intensify the scientific cooperation through funding of scholars who would participate in cooperative research projects primarily in the fields of Humanities and social sciences. Priority is given to young Ph.D. and Post-Doctoral scientists and scholars.
- Indo-US 21st Century Knowledge Initiative was announced in 2009 as an affirmation of the commitment to build an enhanced India United States strategic partnership in education.
- The University Grants Commission has offered these fellowships with the aim of providing an excellent opportunity for young Indian researchers and teachers of all disciplines to have international collaborative research training in advanced techniques and technologies in emerging fields. An expenditure of ₹ 3.98 Lakh was incurred on Raman Fellowships for Post-doctoral Research in the USA 2022-23.
- As per the provisions mentioned in the Indo-Hungarian Educational Exchange Programme, in the year 2022-23, 173 Indian students were selected by the Hungarian Scholarship Board under this scholarship programme. The Indian Government through UGC offers 35 scholarships for Hungarian students. An expenditure of ₹ 14.45 Lakh was incurred on the Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme.
- As per the Cultural Exchange Programme, four Indian scholars were nominated for participation in an International Seminar in Bulgarian language and culture organized by "St. Kliment Ohridski: Sofia University and "St. Cyril and St. Methodius" University of Veliko Turnovo.
- Indo- Norwegian Cooperation Programme in Higher Education and Research (INCP) is a new initiative that aims at enhancing higher education links between India and Norway during 2022-23.
- Foreign Language Teachers: The UGC has collaborative programmes which, inter-alia, provide for the appointment of foreign language teachers in Indian universities to teach foreign languages. As per the EEP and CEP, appointments of 22 foreign language teachers have been approved in various Higher Education Institutions in India.
- In line with the vision of NEP, 2020 and to make efforts towards the Internationalization of Higher Education in India, UGC has taken various initiatives. UGC has already issued necessary guidelines to all the Universities for the Establishment of the Office for International Affairs. So far, 167 Universities have established the Office for International Affairs.
- The National Eligibility Test (UGC-NET) is conducted to determine the eligibility of Assistant Professor and Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) to ensure minimum standards for the entrants in the teaching profession and research in several subjects of Humanities (including Indian and some foreign languages), Yoga, Social Sciences, Computer Science and Applications, Electronic Science, Forensic Science and Environmental Sciences. The test is conducted twice every year, generally in the month of June and December in 83 subjects. In UGC-NET of December 2022 5,46,679 candidates appeared, out of which 43,917 candidates i.e. 8.03% qualified.

- The CSIR on behalf of UGC, has been conducting NET in five core science subjects. December 2021 and June 2022 (in combined mode) & December 2022 and June 2023 (in combined mode) Joint CSIR-UGC Test, 14791 candidates qualified for the eligibility for Assistant Professor including 3300 candidates qualified for JRF under the UGC scheme.
- State Eligibility Test (SET) duly accredited by UGC for a fixed term. The pattern of SET is the same as that of UGC-NET. However, the University Grants Commission (UGC) in its 561st meeting held on 22.09.2022 has decided to permit the State Nodal Agencies identified by the respective State Governments to conduct State Eligibility Test (SET) without requiring accreditation from UGC.
- Under the Travel Grant Scheme, 37 College Teachers/Librarians had availed this facility for presenting their research papers at International Conferences during 2022-23. An amount of ₹ 39.55 Lakh had been paid to the beneficiaries during 2022-23.
- Nine Inter-University Centres (IUCs) set up as autonomous centres under clause 12(ccc) of the UGC Act,1956 are functioning in the Indian Universities System to provide common facilities, services and programmes to universities and research institutions, etc. by offering expertise in each field and providing access to the state—of—the—art equipment and excellent library facilities. During the reporting year 2022-23, the UGC had released an amount of ₹ 15441.15 Lakh, ₹ 9608.02 Lakh & 5498.00 Lakh under the 36, 31 & 35 Head to the Eight Inter-University Centers & Two EMMRCs/NFCs Centres.
- The UGC has established 4 National Facility Centres in selected Universities and assisted them regularly. During the year 2022-23, UGC released a grant of ₹ 550.35 Lakh to the Western Regional Instrumentation Centre under 36, 31 & 35 Head.

6. Promotion of Research

- The main objective of the scheme of "Research Projects for Teachers" is to promote excellence in research in higher education by supporting research programmes of University/College teachers in various disciplines. The emphasis is on such areas that cut across disciplines and subjects such as Health, Gerontology, Environment, Nanotechnology, Biotechnology, Stress Management, WTO and its impact on the economy, etc. and other areas as would be identified by subject experts. Major Research Project is an initiative of the UGC for financial assistance to the permanent, regular, working/retired teachers in the Universities and Colleges for undertaking research in their chosen areas. Total Amount of ₹ 1.28 Crore was released to 120 beneficiaries during 2022-23.
- The scheme Research Award is to provide an opportunity to permanent teachers of Universities/ Institutions having doctorate degrees to pursue research in their area(s) of specialization without undertaking any research guidance for a period of two years extendable by one year on the recommendation of the expert committee in exceptional cases. Selections are made for 100 slots in alternate years for all the disciplines. An expenditure of ₹ 0.24 Crore had been incurred towards payment to the awardees during 2022-23.
- To attract meritorious scientists of Indian origin, who may be working abroad, to promote high-quality research, the Scheme of Research Scientists was initiated and implemented in 1983. An expenditure of ₹ 4.95 Crore was incurred towards the salary and contingencies of these Research Scientists during 2022-23.
- The objective of Post Doctoral Fellowship for SC/ST scheme candidates who have obtained a doctorate and published research work to their credit for doing advanced research in their chosen areas. The total no. of slots available under this scheme was 100 per year. During 2022-23, the scheme was merged with the newly launched "Dr. S. Radha Krishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship",

- only the old cases are being settled. The Fellowship is for five years. An expenditure of ₹ 2.05 crore was incurred in the Financial Year 2022-23.
- The Post Doctoral Fellowship for Women scheme was to provide an opportunity to unemployed women candidates holding Ph.D. degrees and intending to pursue post-doctoral research in Science, Engineering and Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences. The total no. of slots available under this scheme was 100 per year. During 2022-23, the scheme merged with the newly launched "Dr. S. Radha Krishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship'. Only the old cases are being settled. ₹ 2.34 crore was incurred in the Financial Year 2022-23.
- Dr. S. Radha Krishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship in Humanities & Social Sciences including languages provides an opportunity to carry out advanced studies and research in Indian Universities and colleges. The total number of slots available under the Scheme is 200 per year. The scheme has been merged with the newly launched "Dr. S. Radha Krishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship'. Only the old cases are being settled. An expenditure of ₹ 2.21 lakh was incurred during 2022-23.
- D.S. Kothari Post-Doctoral Fellowship is provided to pursue Post-Doctoral Research in Basic Sciences/Medical/Engineering and Technology. During 2022-23, an amount of ₹ 25.99 Crores had been released to the 506 Fellows working in various institutions. The scheme has been merged with the newly launched "Dr. S. Radha Krishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship'. Only the old cases are being settled.
- To provide an opportunity for the continuance of research contributions in Basic Science Research by talented Science and Technology teachers who are nearing superannuation in state universities, the UGC started a scheme called UGC-BSR Faculty Fellowship. Teachers who are at the level of Professors/Associate Professors in Science and technology departments of universities are eligible. During 2022-23, ₹6.01 crores have been released to 78 BSR Faculty Fellows from 01.01.2022 to 31.12.2022.
- The Emeritus Fellowship Scheme is for providing an opportunity to superannuated teachers up to the age of 70 years, of all recognized Universities to pursue active research in their respective fields of specialization. The number of slots available under the scheme is 100 for science streams and 100 for Humanities and Social Sciences every alternative year at any given time basis. An expenditure of ₹ 1766/- had been incurred during 2022-23. The scheme has been re-launched as "Fellowship for Superannuated Faculty Members". Only the old cases are being settled.
- The scheme of Junior Research Fellowships (JRF) (Indian Nationals) JRF is provided to the Indian candidates who qualify for UGC NET conducted by either UGC or CSIR. The JRF carries the fellowship amount of ₹ 31,000/- p.m. for the first two years and ₹ 35,000/- p.m. for the remaining period with annual contingency amounts.
- In the reporting year, an expenditure of ₹ 1144.59 Crore had been incurred under JRF schemes for Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences. At present approx. 27,050 Scholars are pursuing an M.Phil./PhD under JRF.
- To minimize the social disparities in Higher Education, the UGC provides 2000 National Fellowships to SC candidates every year to undertake advanced studies and Research leading to M.Phil./Ph.D. degrees. During 2022-23, an amount of ₹ 69.24 Crores was disbursed to 3132 SC Fellows under the scheme.
- The Ministry of Minority Affairs has entrusted and funded the UGC since 2009 for the implementation of the Maulana Azad National Fellowship. The rate of fellowship are at par with the other UGC fellowships. During the financial year 2022-23 till September, an amount of ₹ 49.79 crore was disbursed to 2145 beneficiaries.

- Keeping Swami Vivekananda's ideas of women candidates and to achieve and promote girls education, UGC has introduced 'Swami Vivekananda Single Girl Child Fellowship' for research in Social Sciences during 2014-15. An amount of ₹ 6.15 Crores was disbursed to 187 beneficiaries during 2022-23.
- The "Research Fellowships in Sciences for Meritorious Students" (RFSMS) (BSR Fellowships) scheme has been implemented to provide opportunities to meritorious candidates to undertake advanced studies and research leading to Ph.D. degrees in sciences. The candidates who are registered for Ph.D. in Science subjects in Universities with Potential for Excellence/Centers of Advanced Studies and Departments of Special Assistance identified by the UGC are eligible for such fellowships. During 2022-23, a total grant of ₹ 0.54 Crores had been released to 75 JRF/SRF Candidates.
- Post-graduate Scholarships for SC/ST Students in Professional Courses have been implemented keeping in view the social background of the candidates from deprived sections of society and to provide them an opportunity to undertake post-graduate level studies. An amount of ₹ 9.45 Crore has been disbursed to 1212 Beneficiaries during the financial year 2022-23.
- The scheme of the Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarship for Single Girl Child is to achieve and promote girls' education by supporting through scholarships to such girls who happen to be the only child in their families and provide an incentive for the parents to observe small family norms. Girls who have been admitted to a master's degree programme in any recognized university or a PG College are eligible. The duration of the scholarship is for a period of two years with the scholarship amount of ₹ 3,100/- p.m. (for ten months a year). All eligible students will get the scholarship. The scheme has been on-boarded on the National scholarship portal since 2017. An amount of ₹ 13.90 Crore has been disbursed to the ongoing 3839 beneficiaries during the financial year 2022-23.
- To promote and encourage talented students to pursue PG education, the scheme of PG Merit Scholarship for university Rank Holders at the undergraduate level is in place. The awardees under the scheme can pursue their PG courses (professional courses are not covered) in any area of specialization as well as in any institution of higher learning in the country. The first and second-rank holders in general courses and only first rank holders in Honors Courses are eligible for the scholarship. The duration of the scholarship is two years with a scholarship amount of ₹ 3100/-p.m. (for ten months a year). The scheme has been onboarded on the National Scholarship portal since 2017. During the period 2022-23, an amount of ₹ 5.81 Crore has been disbursed to the ongoing 1564 beneficiaries.
- To help graduate students pursue PG studies in higher educational institutions, the UGC has been providing PG Scholarships for GATE-qualified students of M.E./MTech. /M. Pharma. with a Scholarship amount of ₹ 12,400/- p.m. (above 60 % marks in GATE/GPAT) and ₹ 1550/- per month (below 60% marks in first semester). During the Financial Year 2022-23, an amount of ₹ 10.43 Crore was disbursed to 1100 beneficiaries.
- Regarding the promotion of Higher Education in the Northeastern Region (NER) the UGC decided to launch the "Ishan Uday" Special Scholarship Scheme for the North Eastern Region from the academic session 2014-15. The rate of the scholarship is ₹ 5,400/- p.m. for General Degree Courses & ₹ 7,800/- p.m. for Technical and Professional Degree courses. 10,000 candidates are selected under the scheme for the Northeastern Region. An amount of ₹ 142.43 Crores has been disbursed to ongoing 25131 Beneficiaries during the financial year 2022-23.
 - Based on the recommendations of the Empowered Committee for Basic Scientific Research in Indian Universities the following Schemes are being implemented by UGC:

- To strengthen high-quality research in science-related disciplines at an internationally competitive level and to promote innovative teaching in universities through the induction of fresh talent in an academic faculty, the Faculty Recharge Programme is initiated. In the year 2011 for this purpose, a Cell had been established in Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, and a National Coordinator had been appointed to initiate the process of selection of teachers. At present 145 faculties are in position out of the total 373 faculties selected under the scheme. During 2022-23 ₹ 47.99 Crores were released in respect of salaries to 149 selectees.
- Under the scheme Start-up Grant for newly recruited faculty, all teachers who are newly appointed at the level of Assistant Professor with a Ph.D. degree with a minimum of two research publications in approved/cited journals are eligible to receive financial support. The quantum of support under the scheme is ₹ 10 Lakh. The applications received up to January 28, 2022, have been considered for selection, and the result was declared in September 2021. Thereafter, no fresh selection was made under the scheme. An amount of ₹ 9.12 Crores was released to 161 faculty members for various Universities/Institutions during 2022-23.
- Under the Mid-Career Award scheme ₹ 10.00 Lakh is provided for a teacher to do research. The grant could be utilized for minor equipment, Chemicals, contingency, and fieldwork. The applications received up to 28.01.2021 have been considered for selection and the result was declared in September 2021. After that, no fresh selection was made under the scheme. An amount of ₹ 0.76 Crore was released to 17 teachers who are pursuing their research in various Indian Universities/Institutions during 2022-23.
- The Research Grant for In-Service Faculty Members scheme aims to provide opportunities to regularly appointed faculty members to pursue research in their area(s). Faculty members up to the age of 50 years, who have a minimum of 10 years of service left in the University, are eligible under the scheme. The tenure of the fellowship is two years and there are 200 slots or, as may be decided by the Commission. One-time financial assistance of ₹10.00 Lakh is provided to the selected candidates. The scheme was launched in September 2022 and online applications were called. The selection process for the year 2022-23 is underway.
- Under the Scheme Dr. D.S. Kothari Research Grant for Newly Recruited Faculty Members purpose of the research grant is to provide opportunities to regularly appointed faculty members of Universities/ Institutes/ Colleges (here in after "Institutions") to pursue research in their area(s). All teachers who are newly appointed at the level of Assistant Professor against permanent posts in the University shall be eligible to receive financial support under the scheme. There are 132 slots under the scheme and the tenure of the fellowship is two years. One-time financial assistance of ₹10.00 Lakh is provided to the selected candidates. The scheme was launched in September 2022 and online applications were called. The selection process for the year 2022-23 is underway.

7. Gender and Social Equity

- The scheme of Development of Women Studies in Indian Universities and Colleges is for the expansion of women's studies through teaching, research and field action and encourage constant interaction with field reality through field action programme. As on 31.03.2023, as many as 159 Women Study Centres had been established and functioning in the university system. ₹ 12.00 Crores were allocated under the Scheme and out of that the grant of ₹ 10.57 Crores was released during 2022-23.
- Govt. of India and the University Grants Commission are continuously monitoring the Progress of implementation of the reservation policy of SCs, STs, OBCs and Persons with Disabilities for Teaching and Non-Teaching staff posts as well as admission to all level courses in universities.

The information on the above parameters is collected by the SC/ST/OBC Section regularly and provided to MoE for information and National Commission for SC & National Commission for ST for further necessary action.

- To support research on the issue of Social Exclusion and inclusion which has theoretical as well as policy importance, the UGC established teaching-cum-research centers in Universities called Centers for Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusion Policy. As on 31.03.2023, as many as 35 Centers are functioning in different universities. An amount of 1.20 Crore has been released during 2022-23.
- With the aim of not ignoring persons with disabilities in the Higher Education System and with an objective to develop courses for special teachers and counselors and to provide facilities in various forms for the differently able persons, the UGC had been implementing one scheme viz. Higher Education for Persons with Special Needs (HEPSN). These schemes are now looked at by a separate cell in the UGC and grants are being released by the Cell. UGC is monitoring the effective implementation of the reservation policy for Persons with Disabilities in employment and admission in Universities/Colleges.
- UGC issues instructions from time to time to all Central/State/Deemed to be Universities and Grants-in-aid Institutions for (i) implementation of SC/ST/PWD/OBC Reservation Policy of the Govt. (ii) display of reservation roster on the University website as per instructions issued by the DOPT O.M. No.36012/2/96-Estt. (Res.) dated 2nd July, 1997 and (iii) filling up of remaining identified backlog reserved vacancies of these categories in teaching and non-teaching posts. Instructions have been issued vide letter No.1-8/2014 (SCT) dated 29.11.2021.
- UGC informed all the Universities and Chief Secretaries of all the State Governments/UTs regarding the implementation of reservation for economically weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Higher Educational Institutions in accordance with the One Hundred and Third Amendment of the Constitution of India, for its immediate implementation and compliance.

8. Relevant and Value-Based Education

To promote a holistic understanding of the areas outside India with its cultural, social, economic and strategic specificities and to provide critical input to the policymakers, particularly in India's economic, strategic and political interests, the UGC has been identifying universities from time to time for establishing Area Study Centers during 2022-23.

To acquaint teachers and students with the thoughts and ideas of great social thinkers of India, there are 394 Study Centers established in Universities/Colleges under the Scheme 'Epoch Making Thinkers of India.

9. Integration of Information and Communication Technologies (ICT)

- The e-Governance Cell was established in the office of the University Grants Commission, New Delhi in 2019 with the help of INFLIBNET Centre (an IUC of UGC). A team of dedicated technical staff has been appointed in the e-Governance Cell to expedite the process of e-Governance in UGC. Web portals and Applications have been developed for inviting online applications and information from HEIs under various UGC schemes and activities to make the work environment transparent and paperless.
- e-Office premium version software of the National Informatics Centre (NIC) to achieve a simplified, responsive, effective and transparent working in the office of UGC has been implemented with the help of NIC.

- To ensure the optimum use of the e-office module of the NIC (including e-Noting), UGC has been organizing e-office training programmes for all UGC Officers and Officials from time to time with the help of NIC e-office facilities.
- The main objective of the UGC website is to share important information on various UGC schemes to end users/stakeholders. Stakeholders can submit/upload their various information including University Reports, Proposals for schemes, applications for scholarships/fellowships/ jobs etc. through UGC portal. The UGC website is being updated on a regular basis. A new UGC Website is being developed. "UGC is redesigning the UGC website to make it more user-friendly, informative, and dynamic.
- The University Activity Monitoring Portal (UAMP) of UGC serves as a one-point stop for events/ activities undertaken by HEIs from time to time. This portal is facilitating Universities to upload details of various events/activities undertaken by them. Universities are requested to login to this portal with the same user ID and password as provided to them by UGC for the UGC University portal. Also, Universities may regularly update their contact details on this portal.
- Total expenditure incurred in the Project (INFLIBNET E-Content) during 2022-23 is ₹ 28,02,100/-
- The Government has launched the SWAYAM portal that provides an integrated platform for online courses using information and communication technology (ICT). Through this, it would be possible for any student to join virtual courses offered by the best teachers in the Country, interact with the teacher, take tests, earn academic credits and this can add to their academic record.
- UGC has been entrusted with the responsibility of undertaking Local Chapter activity that includes the adoption and promotion of MOOC courses offered on the SWAYAM.
- Two hundred and Eighty-Nine (289) Universities have come on board to accept credit transfers for courses offered through the SWAYAM platform.
- To address the language barrier, to promote Indian languages and for flexibility of learning in the mother tongue, UGC is in the process of translating 27 PG SWAYAM Non-Engineering courses in 8 regional languages (Hindi, Bengali, Gujarati, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi, Tamil and Telugu).
- The UGC has Empanelled Six Vendors for Multimedia Related Works for SWAYAM Project of the Ministry of Education, Government of India on Rate Contract basis. Total expenditure incurred in the Project (MOOCs for SWAYAM) during 2022-23 is ₹ 16227889.62/-
- National Academic Depository (NAD) is a 24 × 7 online store house of all academic awards duly digitized and lodged by academic institutions/boards/eligibility assessment bodies. The Ministry of Education (MoE) has communicated and authorized UGC to implement NAD as a permanent scheme in co-operation with DigiLocker, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) as a single entity of NAD without levy of any user charge. As of 31 March 2023, 1937, Academic Institutions have been on-boarded and uploaded 12.94 Crores academic awards data through NAD-Digi Locker portal on NAD.
- Academic Bank of Credit: National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 recommends the establishment of an Academic Bank of Credit (ABC), which would digitally store the academic credits earned from various recognized HEIs so that the degrees from HEIs can be awarded considering credits earned. The major functions of ABC are registration of HEIs under the ABC scheme and opening, closure and validation of academic accounts of students, credit verification, credit accumulation, credit transfer/redemption of students and promotion of the ABC among the stakeholders. The ABC portal (https://www.abc.gov.in/) is open for registration of both Students and universities. ABC conducted an online meeting on 29th December 2022 with Vice-Chancellors of Central Universities and directors of IITs. Some representatives of State Universities, Deemed Universities and Private

- Universities were also present in this webinar. The total number of institutions onboarded ABC is 1182 and the student ID created is 84 Lakh (Approx.).
- UGC e-Samadhaan Portal was officially launched on 5th September 2022, replacing the existing Student Grievance Redressal Portal, which has some issues and concerns of various stakeholders. Because of the non-availability of a single window system, the stakeholders were lodging multiple complaints /grievances at various places. Due to that, the redressal mechanisms were at a slow pace, which was also causing further concerns to the stakeholders. To resolve the above issues, UGC came up with the "e-Samadhaan Online Grievance Registering and Monitoring System" (https://samadhaan.ugc.ac.in/). A Single Window system for all the stakeholders to register their complaints/ grievances on the portal, which would be available 24x7 with a click of a mouse. A toll-free No.1800-111-656, will also be available on the UGC website 24x7 for lodging complaints by the stakeholders on any issue faced by them.

10. Skill Development Initiatives

- The University Grants Commission has been facilitating Higher Educational Institutions to offer skill courses at the level of Certificate, Diploma, Advanced Diploma, B.Voc, M.Voc and Ph.D. under the National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF). 1560 Institutions were approved by UGC to offer skill-based programs under NSQF. An amount of ₹ 11.70 cr. was released to various HEIs under NSQF during 2022-23.
- UGC also notified the Guidelines for Higher Education Institutions to offer an Internship/ Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Programme to increase the employability of general degree students. As per these Guidelines, any UG degree programme in all disciplines as specified by the UGC under Section 22 (3) of the UGC Act, 1956 is eligible to embed apprenticeship/internship into the degree programme.

11. Open and Distance Learning and Online Learning

- Applications were invited from eligible HEIs and processed as per the provisions of notified Regulations. Accordingly, 72 HEIs have been recognized by UGC-DEB to offer ODL programmes for the academic year 2022-23.
- As per provisions stipulated under University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations, 2020, 3 HEIs have been accorded recognition to offer programmes through online mode for 2022- 23.
- University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations, 2020, HEIs entitled to start full-fledged online programmes without prior approval of UGC are required to submit an affidavit to ensure compliance with all the provisions of the notified Regulations. The compliance related to the four provisions i.e., Entitlement eligibility criteria of the HEI, Permissibility of proposed programmes to be offered under Online mode, Adherence to UGC Notification of Specification of Degrees, 2014 and its amendments and prior approval of Regulatory Authorities, wherever applicable, was ensured. Accordingly, a list of 68 Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) (which have submitted affidavits and were entitled to offer online programmes, found complying with the above-mentioned provisions) has been uploaded on the UGC website.
- UGC has provided financial assistance of ₹ 9.00 Crore to 09 State Open Universities to support the development of course materials, development and application of new technology, development of MOOCs, Digitalization, ICT and Quality Assurance measures, networking, etc. during the year 2022-23.

• UGC (ODL Programmes and Online Programmes) Second Amendment Regulations, 2022 have been notified in the official gazette on 18th July 2022.

12. UGC-Quality Mandate- Academic Activities Initiatives

- Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework The Quality Mandate of the UGC has given thrust on Curriculum Reform on a learning outcome-based approach with an aim to equip the students with knowledge, skills, values and attitudes. A new curriculum in 31 subjects which is based on the Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) has been developed and uploaded on the UGC website to facilitate universities to revise the curriculum.
- UGC has initiated Evaluation Reforms to revamp the current evaluation system to promote assessment-driven learning with continuous evaluation. Continuous and comprehensive evaluation embraces horizontal assessment modes instead of one single vertical mode. It can be used to assess the overall development of students, for example, critical thinking, problem-solving ability, right application of knowledge, and adherence to ethics. Accordingly, UGC has developed "Innovative Pedagogical Approaches & Evaluation Reforms" and published it on 22.12.2022.
- One of the Quality Mandate initiatives undertaken by the University Grants Commission to accomplish Quality in Higher Education is imparting Life Skills learning for students. There is an immense demand in the country for employable, exceptionally performing graduates with skills, knowledge, values, and ethics crucial for a fresh professional. To introduce the Life Skills curriculum in non-technical undergraduate education, UGC, with the help of a committee, has developed a curriculum for Life Skills (Jeevan Kaushal) in 2018. This curriculum has been revised as per the recommendations of NEP 2020. Has also prepared "Facilitators' Guidelines for the Curriculum on Life Skills (Jeevan Kaushal)" to effectively implement this Curriculum. The "Draft Curriculum on Life Skills (Jeevan Kaushal) 2.0" and "Draft Facilitators' Guidelines for Life Skills Curriculum (Jeevan Kaushal)" were uploaded on the UGC website on 24 February 2023 to solicit views/suggestions from stakeholders, including teachers, students, researchers and those involved in the related field latest by 10.03.2023.
- Trans-disciplinary Research for India's Developing Economy The Scheme for Trans-disciplinary Research for India's Developing Economy (STRIDE) aims to enhance research capacity and nurture research culture in general, particularly for trans-disciplinary research in Indian Higher Education Institutions (HEIs), to stimulate national development and entrepreneurship. Grant released during the financial year 2022-23 is 2.17 Crore. The number of beneficiaries till date is 14 Universities/ Colleges
- Consortium for Academic Research and Ethics- The UGC has entrusted the responsibility of journal analysis for the CARE List to the Centre for Publication Ethics, Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune and four Regional Universities identified by the UGC (henceforth named CARE Universities). A financial grant was released to UGC-CARE Cell journal analysis at Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU) and to four regional UGC-CARE Universities this year. A total grant of ₹ 50,00,000/- for two years, 2021-2023 to the Centre for Publication Ethics, SPPU and ₹ 5,00,000/- for each of the regional universities was released. To improve academic integrity and to disseminate the UGC's initiatives, the Present Status/ Statistics of UGC-CARE reference list of Quality Journal is available on the UGC Website.
- Paramarsh Mentoring of Non-Accredited Institutions- UGC has implemented the scheme of "Paramarsh" a new initiative for mentoring NAAC Accreditation Aspirants Institutions to promote Quality Assurance in Higher Education. UGC has approved 167 mentor institutions.

- In the National Statement at the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) CoP 26 Global Leaders' Summit in Glasgow, the Hon'ble Prime Minister's mantra was Lifestyle for Environment, and he also stressed setting a target for Net Zero Carbon Emissions by 2030.
- Tracking of Student's Progress –UGC in its 550th Meeting considered and approved the report on "Student Career Progression and Alumni Network" to track the students' career progress after completion of the course. UGC has already issued necessary guidelines to all Universities to set up the Alumni Connect Cell. So far, 164 Universities have set up the Alumni Connect Cell.
- To give effect to one of the major reforms of NEP 2020, the UGC developed guidelines for multiple entries and exits in academic programmes in HEIs and was notified on 29th July 2021. The UGC has notified the new UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for the award of Ph.D.) Regulations 2022 in the official Gazette on 07th November 2022. These new regulations are framed to encourage research scholars to become well-trained researchers and inquisitive explorers. The draft framework was placed in the public domain for feedback and shared with IITs, IISERs, NITs, IIMs, Statutory Councils and Industry bodies for input. Based on the inputs thus received, the framework was revised and the revised one was submitted for the consideration of the Commission through e-circulation and approved. The Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme was published on 12.12.2022 on the UGC website. To transform the HEIs into multidisciplinary institutions within the timelines suggested by the NEP 2020, therefore, is a challenge. To enable the transformation of HEIs into multidisciplinary institutions, the UGC constituted a committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. R. P. Tiwari. The Committee has suggested multiple ways, such as collaboration, merging and clustering between institutions, to achieve the characteristics of a multidisciplinary institution.

1.1 Role and Organisation of UGC

The University Grants Commission, which came into existence on 28th December 1953, became a statutory body of the Government of India by an Act of Parliament in 1956. Section 12 of the UGC Act provides that the Commission shall, in consultation with the universities concerned, take all such steps as it may think fit for the promotion and coordination of university education and for the determination and maintenance of standards of teaching, examination and research.

- As per Section 18 of the UGC Act, the Commission shall prepare once every year an Annual Report giving a true and full account of its activities during the previous year, and copies thereof shall be forwarded to the Central Government and the Government shall cause the same to be laid before both Houses of Parliament.
- The UGC serves as a vital link between the Union and State Governments and the Institutions of Higher Learning. In addition to its role of giving grants to universities and colleges, the University Grants Commission also advises Central and State Governments on the measures necessary for the improvement of university education. It also frames regulations such as those on the minimum standards of instruction and qualifications of teachers.
- In order to accomplish the multi-dimensional objectives of higher education and in the discharge of its cardinal function of coordinating and maintaining standards of higher education, the UGC has over the years evolved and implemented a wide variety of programmes for the realization of the goals of higher education.

1.1(i) Organisational Structure

The Commission consists of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and ten members appointed/nominated by the Central Government. The Chairman is chosen from amongst persons who are not officers of the Central Government or of any State Government. Out of ten members, two are selected from amongst the officers of the Central Government to represent the Government. Not less than four be elected from amongst persons who are, at the time when are chosen, teachers and Universities. The remainder members are chosen from among the following persons:

Who have knowledge of or experience in agriculture, commerce, forestry, or industry;

Who are members of the engineering, legal, medical, or any other learned profession; or


Who are Vice—Chancellors of Universities or who, not being teachers of Universities, are in the opinion of the Central Government, educationists of repute or have obtained high academic distinctions. Provide that not less then one half and the number chosen.


The Executive Head of the UGC is the Secretary. The Commission's Secretariat was headed by the Secretary with the staff during 2022-23.

Graph 1.1: The Commission's Secretariat Sanctioned & Working Strength during 2022-23






Graph 1.1: Level-wise Working strength of Commission's Secretariat: 2022-23

In the formulation, evaluation and monitoring of programmes, the UGC seeks the help of subject experts from Universities, Colleges, National laboratories and other Institutions.

1.2 Special Cell/Section Functioning in the UGC

1.2(i) Right to Information Act (RIA) Cell

The University Grants Commission is an autonomous body under the Ministry of Education, Government of India and provides information to the applicants under the Right to information Act, 2005. The RIA cell headed by the Nodal Officer receives the RTI Applications/Appeals and marks the RTI to the respective section and duly forward the RTIs/Appeal to different CPIOs/Appellate Authorities who have the relevant information. There are 23 Appellate Authorities and 36 CPIOs in the office of UGC, including the main office and branch offices. The RTI applications/appeals received from the applicants and notices/decisions from Central Information Commission (CIC) etc. are centrally received in the name of Nodal Officer at the main office and the same are forwarded to the concerned Central Public Information Officers (CPIOs) who have the requisite information. A copy of the RTI applications/appeals/notices/decisions is retained in the RIA cell for record. The Bureau Heads/Deputy Secretary with Independent charge in the UGC is designated as Appellate Authorities under RTI and the Deputy Secretaries/Account Officers/Under Secretaries/ Education Officers in the Bureau under them are designated as Central Public Information Officers. The data of quarterly report of number of RTI applications/appeals/fee etc. is prepared by RIA cell and is uploaded on the CIC portal. The record of the RTI fee collected from the applicants is also maintained by the RIA cell. The list of Central Public Information Officers/ Appellate Authorities is updated time to time and the same is uploaded in UGC website.

RIA section had organized two workshops/training for the UGC officials during the year 2022-23 as under:-

A two half-a-days workshop conducted by Quality Control of India on "Provisions and procedures, exemptions and exclusions and third-party information under Act, 2005 on 12th and 14th September, 2022 at UGC Head Officer. 51 Officers participated in the workshop.

A two-day Institute of Secretariat Training and Management (ISTM) Training on "Organisation Specific Training Programme" under Right to Information Act, 2005 conducted on 16th and 17th January, 2023. 25 participants were benefited from the training.

1.2(ii) Pay Scale Section

The Pay Scale Section is entrusted with the responsibility of coordinating the work of Pay Review Committees set by the Central Govt. from time to time and in the matters relating to Pay Scale and service conditions of teachers and other equivalent cadres viz. Librarians and Directors of Physical Education in Universities and Colleges. It also interacts with the national-level Organisations of teachers and other equivalent cadres. During the reporting year 2022-23, the following important decisions have been taken and conveyed to the Ministry of Education.

- 1. Guidelines have been issued on 14th November, 2022 for engaging Professor of Practice in Universities and Colleges [No.F.9-1/2010(PS/Misc.)PT-1] Since one of the recommendations of NEP 2020 is to impart holistic and multidisciplinary education in higher educational institutions, the UGC has created a new position called "professor of Practice" in which participation of experienced practitioners/professionals/industry, etc., in the teaching-learning process is to be ensured.
- 2. Public Notice has been issued dated 23rd December, 2022 regarding the eligibility criteria for CAS Promotions of University Teachers from Academic Level 12 to Academic Level 13A and Academic Level 13A to Academic Level 14[No.F.9-1/2020(PS/misc.)]
- 3. Public Notice was issued on 6th March, 2023 regarding criteria for promotion under CAS in terms of guiding Ph.D. **Scholars [No.F.9-1/2020(PS/Misc.)]**
- 4. Public Notice has been issued on 3rd February,2023 regarding the eligibility criteria for CAS Promotions of University Teachers from Academic Level 12 to Academic Level 13A and Academic Level 13A to Academic Level 14 [No.F.9-1/2020(PS/misc.)]
- 5. Public Notice was issued on 8th February, 2023 regarding awarding Ph.D. Degree certificates to candidates successfully completed viva-voce in compliance to UGC Regulations [No.F.3-2/2022(PS/PG/MoE)]
- 6. Public Notice has been issued on 14th June, 2023 regarding introducing a scheme called "Professor of Practice" [No.F.9-1/2010(PS/Misc.) PT-1]-Portal for common platform has been created by UGC for experts as well as higher education institutions where they can register and search for appropriate opportunities.
- 7. 3000- Pending court cases have been replied from 1st April, 2022 to 31st March 2023.

1.2(iii) Vigilance cell

The University Grants Commission has set up a Vigilance Cell in accordance with the instructions of the Government of India to keep a close watch on official work so that it does not indulge in acts of corruption. The Secretary, UGC is also functioning as C.V.O of UGC. The CVO is mainly responsible for the prevention and detection of corruption cases in the UGC, Universities / Colleges and for taking legal action wherever necessary. The CVO is to further ensure the following:

- Maintaining proper surveillance on officers of doubtful integrity.
 Ensure prompt observance of Conduct Rules relating to integrity, covering:

 (i) Statement of assets and acquisitions, (ii) Gifts, (iii) Relatives employed in private firms or doing private business, (iv) Benami transactions.
- Location of sensitive spots, regular and surprise inspections of such spots and proper scrutiny of personnel who are posted in sensitive posts.
- Introduction of preventive measures for bringing transparency and simplicity in the process of allocation and disbursement of grants to universities and colleges.

As directed by the Central Vigilance Commission, the UGC observed the Vigilance Awareness Week from 31st October to 6th November 2022. During the week various activities were undertaken such as - Essay writing competition on "Corruption Free India for a Developed Nation" एक-विकसित राष्ट्र के लिए भ्रष्टाचार मुक्त भारत", administering the pledge (online) and displaying banners during the period.

Vigilance Cell also advised all the universities to observe Vigilance Awareness Week as per the instructions issued by the CVC.

During the year 2022-23, the Vigilance Cell received 1 complaint from CVC, 3 from MHRD, 8 from CBI, 5 CVC referred complaints forwarded by MHRD and 15 from various Universities / Colleges and other agencies. The complaints received against Universities and Colleges have been forwarded to the concerned bureau of UGC/Universities/Colleges/ Institutes for taking necessary action. Enquiry Committees were constituted in some cases to look into the complaints regarding the misuse of the UGC funds. The Cell advises the concerned Bureaus to take action according to the findings of the enquiry on the complaints. The factual reports on the complaints were also sent to CVC/MHRD.

Besides the above, 02 RTI/Appeal applications were also received in Vigilance Cell by offline and 07 RTI/Appeals received online and 1 parliament question. The replies were sent in time.

1.2(IV) Legal Cell

The Legal Cell coordinates the Court Cases between Standing Counsels/Panel Advocates engaged in different courts, tribunals other Judicial bodies all over India and different Bureaus of UGC. Secondly, it also provides legal opinion on different matters to all the Bureaus of UGC. Presently, most of the running cases are regarding pay scales, qualifications, age of superannuation, selection of teaching and non-teaching staff of the Universities and Colleges, admission in Professional NET Courses, Common Entrance Test and Establishment of different Institutions / Fake Institutions etc. Some cases are regarding administrative matters of UGC staff also. A panel of Advocates in different courts, including the Supreme Court of India, has been prepared with the approval of the Competent Authority.

During the year 2022-23, UGC received 1024 cases and incurred and expenditure of 238.27 Lakh on the bills of advocates.

1.2(v) Desk Parliament

Desk Parliament in the UGC office coordinates the replies to Parliament Questions related to higher education received from various Ministries of the Govt. of India particularly Ministry of Education.

1.2(vi) Anti-Malpractice Cell (AMPC)

The Mal-Practice Cell was established on 30 May, 1996 and renamed as Anti-Malpractice Cell (AMPC) on 08.02.2016.

With the expansion of the higher education system, several types of Mal Practices have emerged which need to be addressed immediately to restore the credibility of the higher education system. AMPC is dealing with matters relating to the existence/functioning of fake or unrecognized universities/institutes in the country that are established/awarding degrees in contravention of the UGC Act, 1956.

These are not established under the State Act or Central Act or Provincial Act or Institution especially empowered to confer or grant degrees. Thus, the fake universities/Institutes are not recognized under Section 2(f) and Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956.

The basic objective of the AMPC is to examine the complaints regarding unrecognized Institutions received from the general public/students/parents, etc. News regarding fake institutions that appear in print/electronic media is also taken into cognizance, and necessary action is initiated against those institutions.

Presently, 20 fake universities/Institutions are enlisted in the list of fake universities maintained by UGC, which are available on the UGC website: www.ugc.ac.in.

1. Salient activities undertaken during 01.04.2022 to 31.03.2023 are as under:

- I. Public Notices were issued through the UGC website and in leading national daily newspapers to make the Public/students aware of the unrecognized status of universities/institutions and to warn them not to seek admission in such fake universities/institutes.
- II. Published public notices on the list of fake universities/institutes in leading Hindi and English newspapers.
- III. State-wise list of fake universities uploaded on the UGC website: www.ugc.ac.in.
- IV. Written letters to State Chief Secretaries, Education Secretaries and Principal Secretaries to act against the fake universities/institutes located under their jurisdiction.

1.2(vii) Sexual Harassment of Women at workplace Cell

To look into the grievances of women employees at the workplace, the UGC has an Internal Committee on "Sexual Harassment of Women at workplace," which is headed by the Joint Secretary, UGC. Various steps have been taken for wide publicity of the Committee. Notices have been put up at the main reception of UGC Head Quarter. The Constitution of the Committee, along with telephone numbers, have been uploaded on the UGC website for the general awareness of the public.

During the period under report, no fresh case was reported to the UGC Internal Complaints Committee on Sexual Harassment of Women at the workplace.

1.2(viii) Special Reservation Cell

UGC has nominated the Joint Secretary as Liaison Officer and he is assisted by the Education Officer to safeguard and watch the interest of officers/officials belonging to reserved categories.

1.2(ix) Anti Ragging Cell

Objective: Objective to curb the menace of ragging in the educational institutions and make India a ragging-free nation are as follows:

- 1. The programme must covers the entire nation.
- 2. Prevention is achieved through-
 - (a) improved communication among college authorities, parents and students
 - (b) effective monitoring of compliance with regulations and
 - (c) enhanced public awareness.
- 3. The programme also provides an effective mechanism for the redressal of students' complaints.
- 4. The Commission has made it mandatory for all institutions to incorporate in their prospectus the directions of the Government regarding prohibition and consequences of ragging.

During 2022-23 the ARC section of UGC undertook for curbing the menace of ragging in the HEIs.

- An Anti-Ragging toll-free "helpline" 1800-180-5522 in 12 languages has been made operational by the UGC with Call Centre facilities for helping victims of ragging, besides facilitating effective coordinated action by all concerned. The complaints can also be filed through email at *helpline@antiragging.in*
- UGC issued a circular to all universities dated 16.09.2022 with a request to take necessary steps to ensure zero tolerance of ragging and to adopt the initiative measures taken by UGC to create awareness in all the Universities/Colleges about the ill effects of ragging.
- An Anti-Ragging Committee Meeting held on 20th May, 2022 under the Chairmanship of Shri Rakesh Kumar Mishra (IPS) Retired to look into the issue of ragging and suggest on means of prevention in Educational Institutional. In the meeting the National Medical Commission was mainly sensitized to reduce the cases of ragging in medical colleges. All councils were requested to implement the best practices of other councils.
- The 14th meeting of Inter Council Committee Meeting to discuss the issues of Monitoring of Anti Ragging measures in institutions of higher education held on 12.04.2022. The committee took decision of amending existing regulation of anti-ragging as regulation are more than 10 years old and the same is under process.
- 5. Anti-Ragging Cell of UGC in Coordination with Monitoring Agency & Helpline follows up/close the case with the satisfaction of victim.

1.2(x) Internal Audit Cell

The Internal Audit Cell was set up in May, 1995 in the University Grants Commission on the recommendations of the Director General of Audit & Revenues to oversee the UGC accounts for better

maintenance and transparency. Since then, it has been functioning in the office headed by a Deputy Director, supported by an Audit/Junior Audit Officer who is on deputation from Govt. of India. The Internal Audit Cell advises UGC on various financial as well as administrative matters of the UGC. The cell is also entrusted with the work of pre-audit of pension payment cases, GPF/CPF final payment cases, pay fixation, contract documents and other matters entrusted from time to time and also post audit of accounts, test checks of the grant—in—aid registers and sanction, pursuance/settlement of objections taken in statutory audit and coordination with various concerned bodies in connection with replies to paras of audit report. The work of inspection of accounts and verification of utilization of funds released to Universities and other beneficiary institutions are also entrusted to the Cell.

1.2(xi) Gender Sensitization Cell/Gender Champion

Under this scheme, two schemes are being dealt by the GS section i.e. (i) Gender Sensitization and (ii) Gender Champion, the details are as under:

The UGC set up a Task Force to "Review the Measures for Ensuring Safety of Women on Campuses and Programs for Gender Sensitization" on 8th January, 2013, under the Chairmanship of Member UGC, to assess the situation prevailing in all institutions of higher learning to ensure the freedom, safety and security of girls and women, in particular, and the entire youth in general.

UGC has issued the following **Advisories** once in a year to the Vice-Chancellors of all the Universities (available on the UGC website i.e., *www.ugc.gov.in* and *saksham.ugc.ac.in*

- a. Annual return on cases of Sexual harassment: UGC sends advisory once in a year to the Vice-Chancellors of all the Universities with the request to send the information regarding Annual Return on cases of Sexual Harassment yearly and to constitute an Internal Complaint Committee and inform the same to your affiliated colleges with request to fill an online compliance of Gender Audit at SAKSHAM web portal. Latest advisory has been uploaded on 10-06-2022.
- b. To implement the guidelines of Gender Champions, UGC sends advisory once in a year to the Vice-Chancellors of all the Universities with the request to implement the guidelines of Gender Champions and also inform the same to your affiliated colleges with request to fill an online compliance of Gender Champion at SAKSHAM web portal. Latest advisory has been uploaded on 10-06-2022.
- c. To ensure that a Special Drive be conducted in Autonomous Bodies (Abs)/Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs)/Higher Educational Institutions on the following activities:
 - i. To conduct sensitization workshops for their employees to make them aware of the provisions of the Act.
 - ii. To observe the 25th of November as the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women.
 - iii. To observe Discrimination against Women in Pakhwada from 25th November to 10th December, 2022.
 - iv. Internal Complaints Committees to conduct a special drive to review the pending cases and take appropriate action before 9th December. This advisory has been issued on 22nd November, 2022.

Guidelines on Basic Facilities and Amenities for Safe Secure Environment for Women and Women Cell (for Sensitization, Policy implementation Monitoring and Grievance Redressal) in Higher Educational Institutions (2022) is available on the UGC website i.e. www.ugc.gov.in.

1.2(xii) Public Grievances Cell

Public Grievances Cell of UGC receives all the Grievances through online mode. The grievances received on the portal of UGC are forwarded to the Concerned Bureau Heads of UGC for immediate reply (within 30 days) to the applicant/petitioner electronically. A status report is prepared and sent to the MoE from time to time.

UGC Public Grievance Cell forwards all the Public Grievances received online on the same day to the respective Bureau Heads on their official ID for immediate reply. This PG Portal is monitored daily by the PG Cell and the Bureaus are requested through reminders in order to speed up the disposal of grievances and reduce the number of pending grievances.

Graph 1.4(iii): Grants Received (Capital & Revenue): 2022-23











1.5 Joint Cadre Review Committee (JCRC) for Central Universities and UGC maintained Institutions Deemed to be Universities

The objective of the JCRC section is to frame the Model Cadre Recruitment Rules of all Non-Teaching Posts in Central Universities and to resolve the pay anomaly cases of non-teaching staff of Central Universities and UGC funded deemed to be Universities. For this purpose, UGC has constituted a Standing Committee to examine the anomaly cases of non-teaching staff of Central Universities and UGC funded Deemed to be Universities. During the period, Standing Committee resolved 58 cases of the non-teaching staff received from various Central Universities/fully funded Deemed to be Universities. The meetings of the Standing Committee were conducted periodically. In some cases, the recommendations of the committee were forwarded to Ministry of Education for their concurrence. During the period, UGC has also finalized the "UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualification for Appointment of Registrar, Finance Officer and Controller of Examination in Universities and Colleges". The said Regulations is still under consideration of Ministry of Education. During the period, Model Cadre Recruitment Rules for 58 non-teaching posts for Central Universities has been notified. For the remaining posts, UGC is framing the Modal Cadre Recruitment Rules for which a committee has been re-constituted to frame the Rules.

(MATTERS RELATING TO STANDARDS)

- The Commission examine the possibility of introducing 'Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS)' as a new subject in National Eligibility Test (UGC-NET).
- The Commission approved the inclusion of 'Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS)' as a subject in National Eligibility Test (UGC-NET). An Expert Committee be constituted by the Chairman, UGC for framing the syllabus of this subject. Further, the Commission authorized the Chairman UGC to finalize the syllabus and modalities for implementing the conduct of UGC-NET in 'Indian Knowledge Systems' from the next UGC NET.

(SPECIAL PROGRAMMES, QUALITY PROGRAMMES ETC)

• The Commission consider notification of the revised draft University Grants Commission (Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Higher Educational Institutions to offer Twinning, Joint Degree and Dual Degree Programmes) Regulations, 2022 without prior approval from the Central Government.

The Ministry of Education vide its letter dated 4th April, 2022 has advised:

"Under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 26 of The UGC Act, 1956 it has been stated that previous approval of the Central Government is required for the regulations being made under clauses (a), (b), (c), (d), (h), (i) or (j) of sub-section (1) only. Previous approval of the Central Government is not mandated for the Regulations being notified under the provisions of clauses (f) and (g) of sub-section (1) of section 26 of the UGC Act, 1956."

The Commission approved that UGC shall notify Regulations without prior approval from the Central Government which come under the provisions of the clauses (f) and (g) of the sub section (1) of section 26 of the UGC Act, 1956.

The Commission approved University Grants Commission (Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Higher Educational Institutions to offer Twinning, Joint Degree and Dual Degree Programmes) Regulations, 2022 with the suggestion to incorporate the following clause suitably in the regulations:

"Fee structure should be reasonable so as to make quality Higher Education accessible and affordable to all sections of the society."

The Commission also resolved that UGC shall notify these regulations without prior approval from the Central Government.

The Commission consider the Integration of UGC's:

- (a) E-content developed under e-PG Pathshala Project
- (b) SWAYAM Courses already developed under UG and PG Non-Engineering and
- (c) 27 PG Non-Engineering SWAYAM Courses in 8 Regional Languages

for last mile content delivery through digitalseva.csc.gov.in a portal of Common Service Centres (CSCs)/ Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) in rural India, managed and operated by Village Level Entrepreneurs (VLEs)*.

The Commission Considered and approved the following: -

- 1. Common Service Centres (CSC) to specify Standard Operating Procedure (SoP) for integration of the UGC e-content/MOOCs with CSC's digitalseva.csc.gov.in portal.
- 2. Reasonable fee from the students on monthly basis to be discussed with CSCs team at Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY).

558th Meeting 06th May, 2022

The Commission confirmed the Minutes of the 557th meeting of the University Grants Commission held on 19th April, 2022.

- The Commission ratified the actions taken on certain matters related to recommendations of the Expert Committee constituted by the Commission with regard to approval of institutions under Sections 2 (f), 12 (B) and compliance under Section 13 of the UGC Act, 1956.
- The Commission ratified While ratifying the above, the Commission suggested that a committee may be constituted by UGC to develop a template for self-disclosure of information by private universities.

Any other item.

- The Commission considered and resolved to revisit the Autonomous Colleges Regulations to align with NEP 2020.
- It was considered and resolved to constitute a committee for developing a mechanism for the mandatory self-disclosure by Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs).
- It was considered and resolved by the Commission to review all the UGC Regulations to align with NEP 2020.
- The matter regarding extension of date for submission of thesis of M.Phil. / Ph.D. was considered by the Commission and it was resolved that an extension of up to six months, beyond 30th June, 2022, may be given to the students by their respective Higher Educational Institutions, on case-to-case basis based on the review of student's work by the Research Advisory Committee and on the recommendation of the supervisor and the head of the department of each individual case.

559th Meeting 13th June, 2022

- The Commission receive the action taken on the Minutes of the 558th meeting of the University Grants Commission held on 06th May, 2022. It was resolved that a copy of the constitution of various committees on Regulations/Guidelines and other important communications be shared with Commission members for their information.
- The Commission considered and approved the Annual accounts of UGC for the financial year 2021-22.

(MATTERS RELATING TO STANDARDS)

- The Commission considered the matter regarding amendment of the relevant provisions of rules, regulations and guidelines of the UGC requiring physical inspection of institutions and suggest alternative measures thereof.
- The commission considered and resolved that physical inspection of Universities and colleges of different rules, regulations and guidelines of UGC may be replaced with virtual visits. Only if need arises, physical inspection may be done on case-to-case basis. The Commission considered and resolved that physical inspection of Universities and Colleges as per the requirement.
- It was further resolved that Universities and Colleges should maintain all relevant information on their website as mandatory disclosure.
- The Commission considered NAAC accreditation mandatory for Higher Educational Institutions to become eligible for recognition under Section 12B of UGC Act, 1956.
- The Commission Considered and approved further resolved that Higher Educational Institutions, which have already been given 12B status, may be given maximum of Five Years to obtain NAAC accreditation to retain their recognition under 12B of UGC Act, 1956.
- The Commission considered the draft University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degrees) Regulations, 2022.
- It was further resolved that following changes and other minor corrections in the draft Ph.D. regulations may be incorporated before notification:
 - 1. In clause 11, title should be changed to "Ph.D. through Part Time".
 - 2. Clause 11.1 should appear as Clause 11.2.
 - 3. Clause 11.2 should appear as clause 11.1.

The Commission considered the recommendations made by the DEB Working Group in its thirteenth meeting held on 31st May, 2022.

- a. The Commission considered and approved that the virtual visits for new Higher Educational Institutions by Expert Committee will continue. Only in specific cases, if need arises, physical visit/onsite visits may be done on a case-to-case basis.
- b. After completion of the virtual visit, some institutions selected through system generated random sampling basis will undergo physical/onsite visit by the expert committee, to ascertain the credibility and verification of the documents/facilities.
- c. Reduction in funding pattern to six Deemed to be Universities which are privately managed by Trust/Society.
- d. The Commission considered the proposal and resolved that no appointment of Professor-Director of HRDCs shall be done on permanent basis.
- e. It was further resolved that for smooth management of HRDCs, the charge of HRDC may be given to a permanent Professor of the concerned University as an academic administrative responsibility.
- f. The Commission considered and approved the National Higher Education Qualifications Framework (NHEQF).
- g. The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Expert Committee constituted to decide the exemption application received from Maharishi Mahesh Yogi Vedic Vishwavidyalaya, M.P., as per the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh order dated 07 May 2022.

Any other item:-

- a. The matter related to UGC-CARE list of Journals was raised by one of the Hon'ble Members of the Commission.
- b. It was discussed and resolved that an Expert committee may be constituted for review of the UGC letter dated 16.09.2019 regarding UGC-CARE list.

560th Meeting 18th August, 2022

- The Commission confirm the Minutes of the 559th meeting of the University Grants Commission held on 13th June, 2022.
- The Commission confirm the Minutes of the Meeting of the University Grants Commission (by e-circulation on July 11, 2022).
- The Commission confirm the Minutes of the Meeting of the University Grants Commission (by e-circulation on August 02, 2022).

The Commission noted the following: -

- 1. The Commission received the action taken on the Minutes of the 559th meeting of the University Grants Commission held on 13th June, 2022.
- 2. The Commission received the action taken on the Minutes of the Meeting of the University Grants Commission (by e-circulation on 11th July, 2022).
- 3. The Commission received the action taken on the Minutes of the Meeting of the University Grants Commission (by e-circulation on August 02, 2022)

The Commission ratified and noted the action taken on the following certain matter: -

- (i) To report the inclusion of 132 Colleges (as approved by the Chairman, UGC) under Section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956 between 01.04.2022 to 31.07.2022 as per authorization given by the Commission at its meeting held on 24.08.2011.
- (ii) To report the notification of University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Second Amendment Regulations, 2022.
- (iii) To report the recommendations of the Expert Committee constituted by the Commission with regard to approval of institutions under Sections 2(f), 12 B and compliance under Section 13 of the UGC Act, 1956.

MATTERS RELATING TO STANDARDS

- The Commission considered relaxation of certain provisions of the UGC Guidelines of Special Assistance Programme (SAP) for the purpose of the settlement of accounts.
- The Commission considered and resolved to approve the agenda. However, the representative of the Ministry of Education expressed inability to give opinion owing to pending inputs from the Finance Section of the Ministry of Education. In view of this, the agenda was deferred.
- The Commission considered draft University Grants Commission (Conferment of Autonomous Status Upon Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations, 2022.
- The Commission considered and resolved that the inputs from the Commission Members may be obtained on the Draft Regulations and after suitably incorporating the inputs, they may be placed in the public domain for obtaining the feedback from the stakeholders and the public. Further, the Commission authorized the Chairman, UGC to finalize the Regulations after suitably incorporating the feedback.
- The Commission considered and resolved that the issue of NAAC or NBA accreditation or NIRF ranking as mandatory requirement for universities and colleges for recognition under

- Section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956, may be examined with the help of a Committee. The recommendations of the Committee may be placed before the Commission for consideration.
- The Commission considered and resolved the inclusion of Shivaji University under Category-I as per the UGC [Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy] Regulation, 2018.
- It was further resolved that the observations about Periyar University and University of Mumbai be obtained and examined by the concerned bureaus and presented for consideration under Category-I as per the UGC [Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy] Regulation, 2018.
- The Commission considered and approved the Guidelines for Credit Based Course on Pedagogical Aspects for Teaching Divyangjans and Specific Learning Disabilities (SLDs).
- The Commission considered the matters referred by the DEB Working Group in its 13th meeting held on 31stMay, 2022.

Agenda Items:

- Matter related to Category I HEIs
 The Commission after detailed deliberations decided to refer back this matter to the DEB Working Group for making explicit recommendations for consideration of the Commission.
- 2. Matter related to HEIs violating UGC regulations in ODL mode but offering Online programmes under Entitled Category and vice-versa.
 The Commission decided that punitive actions to be taken only for the mode; ODL or Online as the case may be; where violation has been confirmed. This means, HEIs found violating UGC regulations in ODL mode may continue to offer Online programmes and vice versa; punitive actions only for the respective mode violations.
- 3. Matter related to Gauhati University

The Commission considered the response received from the State Government and the recommendations of the DEB Working Group. After detailed deliberations and to promote ODL education, the Commission decided the following:

- i. Gauhati University, Assam should be permitted to apply afresh for the academic session beginning January-February, 2023.
- ii. The Online application submission portal has opened accordingly till 30th September, 2022 for the Gauhati University to submit the application, so as to ensure compliance for receiving application at least three months in advance from the beginning of academic session.
- iii. The Gauhati University may be informed as above for taking needful actions within the defined timelines.
 - UGC Regulations on appointment of Ombudsperson under University Grants Commission (Redress of Grievance Students) Regulations, 2019.
 - The Commission considered and resolved to examine the Regulations in view of the NEP 2020 through a committee.
 - The Commission re-consider the decision of Commission on the matter of audit observation captioned Excess payment and undue financial benefit to Dr. Neelima Mondal, Associate Professor of Jawaharlal Nehru University.
 - The commission considered and resolved that the matter be referred back to Ministry of Education for reconsideration in consultation with Audit.
 - Excellence (CPE / UPE / CPEPA) for the purpose of settlement of accounts.

The Commission considered and resolved to approve the agenda. However, the representative of the Ministry of Education expressed inability to give opinion owing to pending inputs from the Finance Section of the Ministry of Education.

In view of this, the agenda was deferred.

• To review the Guidelines for Admission and Supernumerary seats of International Students in Higher Educational Institutions in India.

The Commission considered and approved the Guidelines in principle with the input that HEIs may adopt a transparent admission process for admitting international students. The Commission further resolved that these Guidelines be placed in public domain for obtaining the feedback from the stakeholders and the public. Further, the Commission authorized the Chairman, UGC to finalize the Guidelines after suitably incorporating the feedback.

The Commission considered the draft guidelines and resolved as under:

- a. In clause no. 2 (i) Eligibility, the last sentence should be modified as below: Those who have proven expertise in their specific profession or role with at least 15 years of service/experience will be eligible for Professor of Practice.
- b. In clause no.8, Tenure, the second para should be modified as below: The maximum duration of service of Professor of Practice at a given institution should not exceed three years, extendable by one more year.
 - c. The last sentence "Professor of Practice cannot serve in the institution after attaining the age of 70 years or completion of four years in an institution whichever is earlier" should be removed.
 - d. The draft guidelines may be uploaded on the UGC website seeking inputs/suggestions from stakeholders.
 - The Commission considered the draft University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degrees) Regulations, 2022.

561st Meeting 22nd September, 2022

The Commission confirmed and noted: -

- The Commission confirm the Minutes of the 560th meeting of the University Grants Commission held on 18th August, 2022.
- To receive the action taken on the Minutes of the 560th meeting of the University Grants Commission held on 18th August, 2022.

The Commission ratified the action taken on the following certain matter: -

- (i) To report the inclusion of 40 Colleges (as approved by the Chairman, UGC) under Section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956 between 01.08.2022 to 31.08.2022 as per authorization given by the Commission at its meeting held on 24.08.2011.
- (ii) To ratify the decisions of the Standing Committee on Autonomous Colleges for grant of fresh autonomous status/ extension of autonomous status to colleges.

(MATTERS RELATING TO STANDARDS)

The Commission discussed and considered the agenda item in detail and after due deliberation, approved the Model Cadre Recruitment Rules for non-teaching staff of Central Universities with suitable modifications, wherever required, except for the post of school teachers and agriculture staff, which may be excluded. Further it was decided that UGC may send the Model CRRs to all Central Universities for taking appropriate action, wherever the CRRs approved by their competent authority are not available. The Universities having approved CRRs may continue with

- the recruitment processes for non-teaching positions as per their approved CRRs. Also, the dying cadre posts are not to be filled up.
- The Commission Considered and approved and resolve the Anomaly Cases of Non-Teaching Staff of Central Universities/Deemed to be Universities received in the JCRC Section.
- The Commission Considered and approved the proposals for establishment of Chairs in the Universities in the name of illustrious persons of India.

The Commission consider the Guidelines for

- 1. The Commission Considered and approved Basic Facilities and Amenities for Safe, Secure Environment for Women
- 2. The Commission Considered and approved Women Cell (for sensitization, policy implementation, monitoring and grievance redressal) in Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs)
- 3. Introduction of courses in Agriculture, Health and Law for Holistic and Multidisciplinary Education
- 4. It was further resolved that MOOCs on Agriculture; Health and Law for Holistic and Multidisciplinary Education be developed by the same Expert Committee. Additional subject experts may be coopted by the committee wherever required.
- 5. The Commission Considered and approved the Guidelines for Pedagogical Approaches and Evaluation/Assessment.
- 6. The Commission Considered and approved exemption of CEED from entrance examination for admission to Ph.D. in Universities under UGC.
- 7. The Commission Considered and approved the recommendations made by the DEB Working Group in its fourteenth meeting held on 1st September, 2022.

A. Discussion items:

- i) Matter related to Category I HEIs
 The Commission noted that matter is still under consideration of the Working Group.
- ii) Letter received from Principal Secretary, Higher Education Department, Secretariat, Chennai, Tamil Nadu regarding violations by Periyar University, Tamil Nadu and Bharathiar University, Tamil Nadu

a. Periyar University

The Commission approved the following recommendations of the DEB Working Group:

- i. The State Governments may be requested again for fact finding along with the needful action as required.
- ii. No new application to be considered from the University for recognition process for a period of '2' years, 2022-23 & 2023-24, as a punitive measure, as per the earlier decision of the Commission.

b. Bharathiar University

The Commission approved the following recommendations of the DEB Working Group:

- i. The State Governments may be requested again for fact finding along with the needful action as required.
- ii. No new application to be considered from the University for recognition process for the current academic year 2022-23, as a punitive measure.
- c. To consider the recommendations of Complaint Redressal Committee meeting held on 28th June, 2022

The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the DEB Working Group in respect of the following:

- 1. Bharati Vidyapeeth, Maharashtra
- 2. Madurai Kamaraj University, Tamil Nadu
- 3. University of Kalyani, West Bengal
- d. The Commission considered and decided on the letters received from Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and Jagan Nath University, Jaipur for opening UGC DEB web portal for inviting applications from all eligible HEIs to offer ODL/Online programmes for academic session January-February, 2023

The Commission approved the recommendation of the working Group that at present in the practice of inviting applications every year for July-August Academic Session only may continue.

Any other item with the permission of the Chair.

- i. Letter received from U.P. Rajarshi Tandon Open University regarding reconsideration of some provisions of UGC (ODL Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations, 2020 applicable to State Open Universities
 - The Commission noted that matter is still under consideration of the Working Group.
- ii. Methodology of Physical/ Onsite Visit of HEIs wherein virtual visits have been undertaken. The Commission approved the following recommendations of the Working Group:

 "10% of the HEIs accorded recognition based on virtual visits may be renderly selected."
 - "10% of the HEIs accorded recognition based on virtual visits may be randomly selected for on-site visits. This practice is to be initiated considering the academic sessions 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 combined by randomly selecting of 10% of HEIs falling in this category.
 - The remaining 90% of HEIs are to be carried forward to the next academic year along with new HEIs and will be considered for shortlisting 10% of HEIs for the academic year 2023-24. The same practice to be continued for subsequent years."
- iii. Extension of last date of according recognition by the UGC for academic session September, 2022

The Commission decided the following:

- Last date of according recognition by UGC 15th October, 2022.
- Last date of admission by the HEIs 15th November, 2022.
- Last date for uploading admission details on portal by the HEIs 30th November, 2022.
- iv. Information to State Governments regarding Regulations including staffing norms.
 - The Commission approved the recommendations of the Working Group that UGC may write to Education Secretary of all the States to inform that about Regulations and mandatory compliance of requirements including staffing norms for offering ODL and/or Online programmes by the universities in the state.
 - Further, the Commission also deliberated on the faculty related issues, especially in Open Universities and in the Distance Department of dual mode universities. The Commission observed that a mechanism needs to be put into place to ensure availability of competent and qualified faculty members on full time dedicated basis for ODL and/or Online Programmes. The mechanism may also ensure the compliance to salary/benefits norms of the UGC. The Commission decided that considering the importance of the matter, the Working Group may deliberate and recommend a mechanism for consideration of the Commission.
 - To consider the report submitted by the Expert Committee constituted to make recommendations on the feasibility of offering Yoga Programmes through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) and Online (OL) Mode.

The Commission considered and approved the report of the Expert Committee. Further, the Commission approved recommendations made by the Expert Committee.

The Commission also resolved that development and notification of model curriculum on Yoga be done expeditiously.

- The Commission considered and approved the draft University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022. The Commission considered the issues of faculty members working under Faculty Recharge Programme (FRP) of UGC, including those pertaining to peer review of performance and assessment, extension/elevation or termination of tenure and timely release of salary.
- The Commission Considered and approved that an extension of tenure on the same terms and conditions may be granted up to 31st March, 2023 to such FRP faculty members whose tenure of five years is already over or going to be over before 31st March, 2023.
- The Commission considered and approved allow the State Nodal Agencies identified by the respective State Governments to conduct State Eligibility Test (SET) without requiring the accreditation from UGC.
- To consider discontinuation of release of grants on reimbursement basis to HEIs in respect of the schemes whose tenure had got over at the end of 12th Five Year Plan or at the end of previous Plan periods but had been extended on year-to-year basis for the purpose of settlement of accounts.
 - It was further resolved to authorize Chairman, UGC to decide the cut-off date for discontinuation of reimbursement.
- The Commission Considered and approved the draft Guidelines for engaging Professor of Practice in Universities and Colleges.
- The Commission Considered and approved the amendments proposed by the Expert Committee in the UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education, 2018
- The Commission Considered and approved relaxation of certain provisions of the UGC Guidelines of Special Assistance Programme (SAP) for the purpose of the settlement of accounts.
 - The Commission Considered and approved that settlement of accounts be done with Utilization Certificate of amount released under both recurring and non-recurring grants within the approved allocation, but for approved items and Heads, within the approved tenure of the project, instead of insisting on year-wise break-up of expenditure.
 - It was further resolved to accept digital copy of documents including Utilization Certificate and Statement of Expenditure, duly signed by the competent authority received through e-mail from the Official e-mail ID of the Institution.
- The Commission Considered and approved the relaxation of certain provisions of the UGC guidelines for schemes of Excellence (CPE / UPE / CPEPA) for the purpose of the settlement of accounts.

Considered and approved that:

(i) Settlement of accounts be done with Utilization Certificate of amount released under both recurring and non-recurring grants within the approved allocation, but for approved items and Heads, within the approved tenure of the project, instead of insisting on year-wise break-up of expenditure.

- (ii) To allow relaxation of period of 18 months for utilization of non-recurring grants up to the approved period the project, subject to the condition that the grants-in-aid has been utilized for the purpose it was allocated.
- (iii) To allow the expenditure to be admitted beyond XIIth Plan period but up to the period of extensions allowed, in view of extensions granted for the schemes through Public Notice(s) and in view of the closure of institution during COVID-19 pandemic.

It was further resolved to accept digital copy of documents including Utilization Certificate and Statement of Expenditure, duly signed by the competent authority received through e-mail from the Official e-mail ID of the Institution.

Any other item:

Women Hostel

The matter regarding some requests for use of Women Hostel, constructed with the financial support of UGC in the colleges, for other academic purposes was discussed. It was resolved that in exceptional circumstances, where a college is unable to get any request for hostel facilities by Girl Students, women hostel may be used as Boys Hostel, if required, only till the time fresh requests from Girl Students for hostel facilities are received.

NEP 2020 Monitoring Portal

A portal for monitoring of NEP 2020 implementation initiatives is being developed by UGC. The link of the portal be shared with the Commission members.

Common Faculty Recruitment Portal

A common faculty recruitment portal for Central Universities is being developed by "Samarth", to provide an integrated platform for facilitating a seamless recruitment process and mapping of the faculty recruitment status.

Common University Entrance Test

Common University Entrance Test (CUET) has been successfully conducted for Undergraduate and Post Graduate courses by National Testing Agency (NTA), for the first time in the country for Central Universities. Many State Universities, deemed to be Universities and Private Universities also participated in it. The Commission placed its appreciation on records for NTA and all other Organisations and officials involved in the process.

562nd Meeting 28th October, 2022

The minutes of the 561st meeting was confirmed with the following amendments in Item No. 2.01 & Item No. 2.15:

Item No. 2.01:

As the library cadre is already covered under "UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in universities and colleges and other measures for maintenance of standard in Higher Education, 2018", the Commission resolved that –

"The Library Cadre is excluded from Model CRRs for non-teaching staff."

Item No. 2.15:

The Commission resolved that -

"The OC/RC requirements should be fulfilled by 31^{st} December 2023 or as notified by the Commission from time to time."

The Commission authorized the Chairman, UGC to finalize the amendments.

Following amendment is also done in Item No.2.02 of 559th Meeting of the Commission:

Item No.2.02 of 559th Meeting:

"NAAC accreditation is mandatory for Higher Education Institutions to become eligible for recognition under section 12B of UGC Act, 1956 and the HEIs which have already been given 12B status, may be given maximum of Five Years to obtain NAAC accreditation to retain their recognition under 12B of UGC Act, 1956." The Commission further resolved that –

"This decision will be applicable on the proposals received on or after the date of the Commission's decision i.e., 13th June, 2022. The proposals received prior to this date will be governed by the earlier 12B Rules."

 - The Commission Considered and approved the recommendations of the UGC Expert Committee constituted to consider the de-novo aspect of the application received for Deemed to be University status under De-Novo category in the name of Dr. Bharathi Rao's St. Mary's Advanced Comprehensive Rehabilitation Deemed to be University, Deshmukhi (V), Pochampally (M), Yadadri Bhuvanagiri Distt., Telengana under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956.

Books/Guidelines launched

- 1. UGC has framed the guidelines for pursuing two academic programmes simultaneously. A student can pursue two academic programmes, one in full time physical mode and another in Open and Distance Learning (ODL)/Online mode; or up to two ODL/Online programmes simultaneously. The Public Notice and guidelines were uploaded on the UGC website on 13.04.2022 and uploaded the same on UGC website www.ugc.gov.in.
- 2. In order to facilitate the internationalization of Indian HEIs, the University Grants Commission has framed the guidelines for admission and creation of supernumerary seats for international students with an objective to facilitate smooth and simple admission of international students in higher educational institutions of India, to create a favourable environment for attracting international students to Indian higher education system and to make India a preferred destination for international students. All Higher Educational Institutions and its affiliated colleges / institutions are requested to adopt and implement the above said guidelines for admission and Supernumerary seats of international students in a transparent manner. The Public Notice and guidelines were uploaded on the UGC website on 30.09.2022 and uploaded the same on UGC website www.ugc.gov.in.

1.8 Initiatives under National Education Policy – 2020 (NEP)

The National Education Policy (NEP), 2020, visualizes a paradigm shift in the Indian higher education system regarding reconceptualizing the structure and system and new educational practices. Since the launch of NEP 2020 on 29th July, 2020, the Indian education system has been undergoing transformational changes. The NEP 2020 is an overarching, innovative vision document for the 21st-century Indian education system. The Policy provides valuable insights and recommendations on various aspects of education that include Multi-disciplinary and Holistic Education; Research, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship; Governance and Capacity Building of Teachers; Quality, Ranking, and Accreditation; Digital Empowerment and Online Education; Equitable and Inclusive Education; Promotion of Indian Languages and Indian Knowledge Systems; Skill Development and Employability and Internationalization of Higher Education.

The policy aims at a "Light but Tight" regulation for higher education as well as at increasing access, equity, and inclusion. The NEP lays down that by 2040, all Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) shall aim to become multidisciplinary institutions. The policy envisages making "India a global knowledge superpower". One of the stated aims of the policy is to instill a "deep-rooted pride" in being Indian, not only in thought but also in spirit, intellect, and deeds. It focuses on developing knowledge, skills, values, and dispositions that support responsible commitment to human rights, sustainable development and living, and global well-being.

After the announcement of NEP 2020, all-out efforts are being made to disseminate the details of the Policy among various stakeholders. A widespread consultation process was initiated to invite suggestions for implementing the Policy. Also, the PMO and Hon'ble Minister of Education have taken periodic review meetings on the implementation of NEP 2020.

Apart from this, Expert Groups on various themes of NEP 2020 were constituted for each aspect of this Policy to achieve the goals of the Policy in a clear and phased manner. Nine such Expert Groups were constituted with the themes as (i) Multidisciplinary and Holistic Education, (ii) Equity and Inclusion in Higher Education, (iii) Research, Innovation, and Rankings, (iv) Global Outreach of Higher Education, (v) Motivated, Energized and Capable Faculty, (vi) Integrated Higher Education System, (vii) Governance and Regulation, (viii) Promotion of Indian Languages, Arts and Culture, and (ix) Technology Use and Integration.

As part of the one-year of transformative reforms under NEP 2020, University Grants Commission, in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, Department of Sports, All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), had organized eight webinars on various themes of the NEP. The themes were based on various aspects of the National Education Policy such as Equity and Inclusion; Multidisciplinary and Holistic Education; Skill, Entrepreneurship Development and Employability; Youth Empowerment and Sports Development; Indian Knowledge System, Languages, Arts and Culture; Quality Education, Accreditation and Teacher Development; Research, Innovation and Ranking; Use of Technology in Education. Various key stakeholders, government officials, vice-chancellors of universities, faculty, staff and students participated and shared their inputs.

The Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, UGC, AICTE and HEIs jointly organised Zonal workshops in the year 2022 with the support of States and UTs to discuss and deliberate on the various aspects of the implementation of NEP, 2020 for embarking on a journey towards academic excellence. For large-scale consultations and to steer the magnitude of transformation, the entire country was divided into three Zones, with each Zone further subdivided into three regions. Each of the Regions comprised 4 States/UTs.

Detailed consultations were held at the regional level, inter, and intra-zonal levels in the form of workshops to discuss the initiatives, best practices, concerns, and suggestions. Higher officials at the level of Chief Secretary, Additional Chief Secretary, Principal Secretary (Higher Education) of Government of States and UTs, Vice-Chancellors of Universities, Directors of IITs, IIMs, Faculty, representatives from FICCI, CII, ASSOCHAM, representatives from statutory councils like VCI, PCI, ICAR, NMC, NCTE participated in these workshops.

These workshops focused on three themes- Access, Quality and Future Readiness. Various aspects of these themes were grouped into sub-themes, and each of them was organised around three parameters - initiatives and best practices, areas of concern & suggestions and strategies. In a nutshell, these consultations emphasised various aspects of the NEP, 2020, recognised the concerns, and evolved future strategies to implement NEP, 2020, leading to the transformation of the Indian higher education system.

The Chairman and officials of UGC interacted with various stakeholders in the e-SAMVAD program on 13th May, 2022. In the continuation of the online dialogue, a second online SAMVAD was organized on 4th October, 2022, which was attended by Vice-Chancellors, Academicians, Faculty members, and students in large numbers. The telecast focused on the newly launched e-samadhan portal and was live on all social media platforms of UGC. The UGC addressed stakeholders queries regarding various higher education initiatives through online interactions.

NEP 2020 advocates for restoring high respect for teachers and inspiring the best to enter the teaching profession. In this regard, UGC requested all the Higher Education Institutions, including Human Resource Development Centres, to organise events/activities from 5th to 9th September, 2022 to commemorate ShikshakParv. The suggested activities included felicitation of faculty members, lectures by eminent scholars and personalities, panel discussions, screening of educational films, and exhibitions on IKS. UGC also organised a 5-day online National Level Panel Discussions from 5th to 09th September, 2022 on various subject themes chaired by eminent persons with distinguished panelists from the academic fraternity. On this occasion, the UGC also launched Research Grant/Fellowship Schemes and e-Samadhan Portal as a single window mechanism to resolve the issues and concerns of various stakeholders.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the Akhil Bharatiya Shiksha Samagam on 7th July, 2022, which was attended by 1200 participants. Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, Union Education Minister, delivered his opening remarks on the implementation of NEP 2020 in the gracious presence of Smt. Anandiben Patel, the Hon'ble Governor of Uttar Pradesh, Yogi Adityanath, Chief Minister, Uttar Pradesh and State Ministers for Skill and Education.

The Summit created further scope for all stakeholders to come together for effective, smooth and timely implementation of the NEP 2020, established strong linkages among various higher educational institutions, discussed challenges being faced by educational institutions and articulated solutions. The HEIs shared best practices, success stories, and methodologies by showcasing noteworthy initiatives in higher education and provided unique opportunities for Indian HEIs to learn, explore and execute future trends in higher education. The Akhil Bharatiya Shiksha Samagam helped boost the pace of implementation and has opened new horizons of academic best practices for all.

The various aspects of the NEP-2020 and their implementation strategies and action plans require careful and rigorous deliberation and cohesion. Carrying out the implementation in a phased manner and prioritising key areas, pre-empting bottlenecks are also crucial. In order to facilitate the universities to develop a road map for the effective implementation of NEP 2020, UGC has constituted six zonal committees (Southern, Northern, Western, North Eastern, Eastern and Central Zone) on 5th September, 2022 with Vice-Chancellors of Central Universities, State Universities, Private Universities and Deemed to be Universities. The committees will bring together the HEIs of the Zones and guide them to adopt

various initiatives for qualitative transformation of higher education, deliberate upon the strategies for implementation of NEP and challenges therein and share best practices. It will also help with documentation and reporting of the initiatives taken and progress made by various HEIs in the region. The Committees will have regular consultations with all stakeholders shortly. The first meeting of the Zonal Committees was conducted on 22nd December, 2022, under the Chairmanship of the Chairman, UGC, to discuss strategies for implementing the NEP 2020 in various zones.

The implementation of the NEP, 2020 needs collective efforts of the Centre, States, UTs, HEIs, Regulating Agencies and all other relevant stakeholders. Since its launch, UGC has been leading several initiatives for the timely and effective implementation of NEP. Some of the key initiatives undertaken by the UGC include Regulations on Academic Bank of Credits, Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes, Common Universities Entrance Test (CUET), Regulations on Academic collaboration with foreign HEIs for Joint and Dual Degree Programmes, Guidelines for Professor of Practice, Guidelines on Pursuing two Academic Programmes simultaneously, Guidelines for Internship/Apprenticeship embedded Degree programme, Guidelines for Admission and Supernumerary seats of International Students in Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes in Higher Educational Institutions in India, Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes, Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree, Guidelines for transformation into Multidisciplinary Institutions, Accessibility Guidelines and Standards for Higher Education Institutions and Universities, Regulations on Online and ODL Education, Regulations on Credit Framework through SWAYAM, Guidelines for Internationalisation of Higher Education, Framework for Global Citizenship Education in Higher Education, Guidelines for the Establishment of Research and Development Cells in HEIs, Curriculum Framework for Undergraduate Education on Basic Facilities and Amenities for Safe Secure Environment for Women and Women Cell (for Sensitization, Policy Implementation, Monitoring and Grievance Redressal) in Higher Educational Institutions, Guidelines on Fostering Social Responsibility and Community Engagement in Higher Education Institutions in India 2.0.

The Commission is empowered under Section 12(h) and under Section 12(i) of the UGC Act, 1956 to collect information on all such matters relating to university education in India and other countries as it thinks fit. Universities are required to furnish their information relating to their financial position or the studies in the various branches of learning undertaken, together with all the rules and regulations relating to the standards of teaching and examination with respect to each of such branches of learning.

The backbone of effective and informed policy formulation for social and economic development is to get timely and quality data in the education sector. Under the Scheme of Higher Education Statistics and Public Information System (HESPIS), the All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) has been launched by the Ministry of Education, Government of India in the year 2011. The survey is conducted to identify all institutions providing higher education and to collect comprehensive information online on various parameters from the HEIs. The entire survey is conducted through electronic mode and a dedicated portal (http:://aishe.gov.in) was developed for this purpose, thus making the exercise completely paperless. The survey intended to cover all the Institutions in the country engaged in imparting Higher Education. Data is being collected on several parameters such as Teachers, Student Enrolment, Programmes of study, Examination Results, Teaching Staff, Non-Teaching Staff, Finance, Infrastructure, etc. Indicators of educational development such as Institution Density, Gross Enrolment Ratio, Pupil-Teacher Ratio, Gender Parity Index, etc., are also calculated from the data collected through AISHE. These are useful in making policy decisions and research for the development of the education sector. The survey is being conducted on annual basis.

A dedicated portal (http://aishe.gov.in) has been developed with the help of the National Informatics Centre (NIC) for the collection and compilation of the data. All the Institutions need to register on the Portal for accessing the portal and uploading its data. The registration of the Institutions is approved by the appropriate level of officers at the State/Central Level and in case of colleges, by university nodal officers. The e-version of DCF (Distributed Coordination Function) expands according to the structure/ size of the Institution. No investigator is sent to the Institution to collect data. One unique feature is that the filled in DCFs are always available on the Portal, which can be accessed by the Institutions and

higher-Level authorities. The Information and Statistics Bureau of UGC has stopped collecting data directly from the Universities/Colleges, the compilation and estimation of data at all India level is being made through the portal *http://aishe.gov.in*. Every year the Survey Report brings out the official statistics on a large number of parameters based on data received from the Universities, Colleges and Stand-Alone Institutions of Higher Education in the country.

AISHE portal is the only source of information for preparing educational statistics on Students Enrolment, Foreign Students, Out-Turn/Pass Outs, Teaching Staff & Non-Teaching Staff in Universities and Colleges. AISHE 2021-22 is in the finalization stage of preparing the statistical figures on different parameters of Higher Education. However, AISHE report for the year 2021-22 & 2022-23 is not yet published. So statistical figures on Higher Education could not be prepared for the Year 2022-23 in the UGC Annual Report 2022-23.

In light of the NEP 2020, and for revamping the entire education system of the country, the data collection and statistical analysis of higher education have now become more important than ever before, for policy formulation and for assessing the status of Higher Education in the country vis-à-vis the important national and global indicators.


2.1 Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in Higher Education (18-23 Years) (2020-21)

2.2(i)(a): Universities listed by UGC under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC act, 1956

As on 31st March 2023, UGC listed 56 Central Universities, 465 State Public Universities, 433 State Private Universities, 4 Institutions established under the State Legislature Act and 127 Institutions Deemed to be Universities.

From 01.04.2022 to 31.03.2023, 15 State Public Universities, 24 State Private Universities, and 1 Institution Deemed to be University and none of the institute established under state legislature were included in the list of universities.

Graph 2.2(i)(b): Type wise Number of Universities as on 31.03.2023






2.2(ii) Colleges

Colleges means any Institutions, whether known as such or by any other name which provides for a course of study for obtaining any qualification from a university and which, in accordance with the rules and regulations of such university, is recognised as competent to provide for such course of study and present students undergoing such course of study for the examination for the award of such qualification. These are the institutions established or maintained by or admitted to the privileges of the University.

Colleges are generally of two types (1) Affiliated colleges and (2) Constituent Colleges

Off campus Centre/PG Centre is a Centre of the University established outside the main campus (within or outside of the state), operated and maintained as its constituent unit, having the university, compliment of facilities, faculty and staff.

A recognized centre is an institution attached with the university to award Degrees in respect of programmes being running in the institution, e.g Army Cadet College wing, Indian Military Academy, Deharadun is not affiliated with any University but the Degree in respect of the programmes running in the institute are awarded by Jawaharlal Nehru University.

Thus, there are four types of College/Institutions: (1) Affiliated Colleges, (2) Constituent Colleges, (3) PG and off Campus Centres (4) Recognized Centers.



2.3(ii) Foreign Students

Representation of Foreign students (AISHE Report 2020-21)-the total number of foreign nationals students enrolled in India is 48,035. The foreign students enrolled in India come from 163 different countries from across the globe. The highest share of foreign students come from the neighboring countries, of which Nepal contributes 28.25%, followed by Afghanistan 8.4%, Bangladesh 5.7%, and the United States 5.1%. The top 10 countries from where students come to India include the United Arab Emirates (4.8%), Bhutan (3.8%), Sudan (3.3%), Nigeria (2.9%), Tanzania (2.7%), and Yemen (2.3%).

The highest number of foreign students are enrolled in Undergraduate courses (75.9%) followed by Postgraduate (16.2%), enrolment in the rest of the levels constituting 7.9% of the total figure.












Graph 2.6 (i) Non-Teaching Staff in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) 2021-22




Development Schemes and Assistance to Universities



3.1 Assistance to Central Universities

University Grants Commission (UGC) provides financial assistance to Central Universities under various schemes/programmes.

During the period 2022-23, there were 56 Central Universities out of which 10 Universities namely (i) Central Agricultural University, Imphal, Manipur (ii) Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi (iii) Indian Maritime University, Chennai – 600 119 (iv) Nalanda University Rajgir, Dist. Nalanda, Bihar–803 116 (v) South Asian University, Akbar Bhawan Campus in Chanakyapuri, New Delhi– 110 021 (vi) Rajiv Gandhi National Aviation University, Rae Bareli, Uttar Pradesh (vii) Rani Lakshmi Bai Central Agricultural University, NH-75, Near Pahuj Dam, Gwalior Road, Jhansi (Utter Pradesh) – 284 003. (viii) Dr. Rajendra Prasad Central Agricultural University, Pusa, Samastipur - 848 125, Bihar (ix) National Sports University, Koutruk, Manipur – 795146 (x) Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya, Vadodara are not funded by the UGC and therefore, no grant being released to these Ten Central Universities. Thus 46 Central Universities are being provided financial assistance by UGC during the period 2022-23 under various schemes. A list of Central Universities is given in Chaper 2 & Table 2.2(i)(b)(ii).

3.1(i) Grant to Central Universities under Block Grant

From the financial year 2017-18, the Plan–Non-Plan classification of the Budget has been discontinued. The expenditure on salary and retirement benefits, etc., are met out of funds allocated under Object Head 36 and the expenditure on (a) Payment of pension and pensionary benefits; (b) Salary and TA/DA, etc., paid to consultants appointed under a scheme and (c) Salary/wages paid to contractual staff appointed under a scheme, etc. are met out of funds provided under object head 31 – Grants in aid – General.

3.1(ii) The following Schemes are funded by UGC in Central Universities: -

3.1 (ii)(a) Scheme for Non-Net Fellowship for M.Phil./Ph.D. in Central Universities

The Non-NET Fellowship scheme was implemented in Central Universities from 2006-2007 after approval of the Commission at its 433rd meeting held on 27th December, 2006. The quantum of fellowship is as under: -

An amount of ₹15912.94 lakh has been released to all Central Universities during 2022-23 under the Scheme.

3.1(ii)(b) Coaching Scheme for Residential Coaching Academies for Minorities/SC/ST and Women

The objective of the Residential Coaching Academy for Minorities/ SC/ST and Women is to provide equal opportunities to all sections of society for equitable growth by providing coaching to students belonging to Minorities, SC/STs and women with Hostel facilities along with free of cost/nominal fee, without tuition fee to the designated categories for entry into Central/State Government, private sector jobs and entry into IITs/Medical colleges.

This Scheme is being run in four Central Universities, namely Jamia Millia Islamia, Aligarh Muslim University, Maulana Azad National Urdu University and Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Lucknow. An amount of ₹99.56 lakh was released during the financial year 2022-23 and 754 students benefited under this scheme during the financial year 2022-23.

3.1(ii)(c) Establishment of Centres for Endangered Languages

UGC established Centres for Indigenous Languages in two Central Universities for the preservation and promotion of endangered Languages with the following Objectives of the Scheme:

- 1. To undertake inter-departmental and inter-disciplinary research related to endangered languages.
- 2. To undertake fieldwork, research, analysis, archiving and documentation of smaller endangered languages using state-of-the-art art speech and language technologies in formats that are universally acceptable, viz. Digitized textual, audio and video formats.
- 3. To produce and publish monographs, grammars, grammatical sketches, dictionaries and lexicons, ethno-linguistic and theoretical descriptions, collection of oral and folk literature and scholarly books on endangered languages.
- 4. To produce language and dialect atlases with special reference to minority and endangered languages.
- 5. To organize workshops and seminars aimed towards promoting advanced research related to endangered languages.
- 6. To train teachers and students from other departments/centres in Field Linguistics, Lexicography and techniques for data management and documentation. Field linguistics should constitute an indispensable part of the Centre.

- 7. The Centre should serve the indigenous and endangered language communities by making accessible the products of the research of the Centre i.e., digital and analogue archives of linguistic data, language teaching material, and language artifacts.
- 8. To promote and foster various domains of endangered languages to ensure minority/endangered language communities in maintaining and preserving language vitality, including the development of orthographical resources like scripts, books of letters and primers.
- 9. To digitize data collected in the course of the research in the centre and make it available to the public by the Internet.
- 10. In the initial phases, this Centre shall and may draw resources (such as manpower, labs, books, students, etc.) from other centres of languages, linguistics, folklore, anthropology, and literature in the University but eventually should conceive of forming independent centres purely devoted to the issues of endangered and indigenous languages.

3.1(ii)(d) Establishment of Internal Quality Assurance Cell in Central Universities

UGC is providing funds to all Universities that are under section 2(f) & 12B of the UGC Act for establishing and strengthening the Internal Quality Assurance Cell existing in them.

3.1(iii) Major initiatives taken during the year 2022-23

3.1(iii)(a) Operationalization of Sindhu Central University

The Ministry of Education/Govt. of India, vide its Notification dated 25.05.2022, established a new Central University, namely Sindhu Central University. The University has become functional from a temporary campus at Tura Village UT of Ladakh from the academic year 2022-23 in accordance with the provisions of the Central Universities Act, 2009, as amended by the Central Universities (Amendment) Act, 2021. An amount of ₹8.50 lakh has been released to EdCIL for the preparation of the DPR of Sindhu Central University.

3.1(iii)(b) Common University Entrance Test (CUET):

As per National Education Policy (NEP)-2020, the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) was introduced in the academic session 2022-23 for admission in all Central Universities and other participating Universities through the National Testing Agency (NTA). The CUET is conducted in a minimum of 13 languages.

3.1(iii)(c) Optimum Utilization of the Resources Available in Central Universities / HEIs:

UGC, vide its letter dated 11.01.2023, issued Guidelines on the Optimum Utilization of the resources available in Central Universities.

The Government of India/UGC has been supporting Central Universities as well as other HEIs in setting up infrastructural facilities and resources to bring about qualitative improvement in research and development activities. Continuous funding is required for the upkeep and maintenance of the infrastructural facilities and therefore, it has been decided to share their infrastructure with other HEIs for optimum use of the available resources by charging a nominal amount. This additional revenue would also help these institutions to maintain their resources in a better way, apart from making the state-of-the-art resources available to the needy ones. For this, HEIs may allow their resources, like libraries, laboratories, equipment, etc., to be shared /used during free time by students and researchers of other HEIs.

3.1(iv) Mandatory Accreditation of NAAC by each Central University

Assessment and accreditation in higher education, through a transparent and informed external review process, are the effective means of quality assurance in higher education to provide a common frame of reference for students and others to obtain credible information on academic quality across institutions thereby assisting student mobility across institutions, domestic as well as international.

Assessment is undertaken prior to the commencement of academic programmes in an Institution. Accreditation is undertaken after an institution attains certain years of existence (6 yrs.)/passing out of specified number of batches (two batches), whichever is earlier.

The UGC has also decided that no Higher Educational Institution or its Faculties, Schools, Departments, Centres or any other units therein, by whatever name called, shall be eligible for applying or receiving financial assistance from the Commission from 1st April, 2016 onwards, under any of its schemes without having undergone assessment and accreditation on or before 31st December, 2015.

Out of 46 Central Universities, 43 Central Universities have obtained the NAAC accreditation. However, Central University of Andhra Pradesh, Anantpuram and Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh, Vijayanagaram & Sindhu Central University of Laddakh is not eligible for NAAC accreditation and Mahatma Gandhi Central University, Motihari has not get accreditation so far.



3.2(i) General Development Assistance to State Public Universities


The UGC has been providing General Development Assistance (Block Grant) to 161 eligible State Universities which are recognized under Section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956, within the framework of norms and broad outlays specified by the UGC in order to facilitate the procurement of such infrastructural facilities which are not normally made available to them from the state government or other bodies supporting them. Assistance was being given for Buildings, Staff, Books and journals, Equipment, other items, etc.

The XII Plan General Development Assistance to Universities were being provided in the form of Plan Block Grants to State Universities, which included Construction/Renovation of Buildings (including renovation of heritage buildings), Campus Development, Staff, Books and journals, Laboratory Equipment and Infrastructure, Annual Maintenance Contract, Innovative Research Activities, University-Industry Linkages, Extension Activities, Cultural Activities, Development of ICT, Health Care, Student Amenities including Hostels, Travel Grant/Conferences/Seminars/Symposia/Workshops, Publication Grant, Appointment of Visiting Professor/Visiting Fellow and Establishment of Career & Counseling Cell, Day Care Centers, Basic Facilities for Women and Faculty Development Programme, ENCORE, Human Rights and Duties Education, Appointment/Honorarium of Guest Part-Time Teachers, etc.

- An amount of ₹37,56,174/- was sanctioned as reimbursement under the General Development Assistance Scheme for the XI plan period, and ₹16,02,471/- was sanctioned as reimbursement under the Merged Scheme for the XI plan period.
- An amount of ₹29,40,34,792/- was sanctioned as reimbursement under the General Development Assistance Scheme for the XII plan period.
- An amount of ₹278,09,10,000/- was sanctioned to Punjab University, Chandigarh, under Non-Plan Salary Head.
- An amount of ₹9,00,00,000/- was sanctioned to Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, Punjab, towards the Celebration of the 550th Birth Anniversary of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji.

3.3 Assistance to Institutions Deemed to be University

As on 31.03.2023, there are 127 Institutions Deemed to be Universities in the country. Out of these Institutions Deemed to be Universities, 49 Institutions Deemed to be Universities are under Section 12B of the UGC Act 1956.

University Grants Commission (UGC) provides Maintenance assistance to identified institutions deemed to be universities under various schemes/ programmes: -

GRANT-IN-AID

Grant-in-aid is given for the development of identified institutions deemed to be universities. The objective of development assistance is not only to improve and consolidate the existing infrastructure in the university but also to develop excellence in certain identified areas: -

Salaries & allowances, retirement benefits, pension and pensionary benefits, and grants in all identified institutions deemed to be universities.

The State Private Universities are established and notified by the concerned State Government by an Act of the State Legislature. All such universities that are established and notified by State Governments are included in the list of universities maintained by UGC under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956. It is mandatory for all such universities to follow concerned UGC Regulations and Guidelines issued from time to time for the maintenance of standards in higher education.

UGC regulation for private universities: -

The State Public Universities are maintained and funded by the respective State Government. The State Private Universities are managed by the Trusts/Societies/private bodies and are regulated by 'UGC (Establishment of and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003'.

The State Private Universities which are included under the list of universities maintained under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956, are empowered to award degrees with the approval of Statutory Bodies of the University and Statutory Council(s), wherever required, as per the norms and standards laid down by UGC and other relevant Statutory Council(s).

After the inclusion of the name of a State (Public/Private) University under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956, it can apply for inclusion of its name under Section 12B of the UGC Act.

As per section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956, the Central Government, the Commission, or any other organization can provide funds to a University only after the Commission, after satisfying itself as to such matters as may be prescribed, declares such University to be fit for receiving such grant.

Inspection of Private Universities by UGC

In accordance with the 559th commission decision, these Private Universities are inspected by the UGC with the help of Expert Committee (including representatives from the concern Statutory Council(s) to assess the fulfillment of minimum criteria in term of programme, faculty infrastructure facilities, financial viability, etc. as laid down by the UGC and other concerned Statutory Bodies.

4.1 Development of College

Colleges, which are responsible in a major way for undergraduate education and to a great extent, even for postgraduate education, are an important factor in Indian higher education. They are responsible for the maintenance of proper standards, ensuring optimum utilization of facilities, promoting innovation and change, linking education to emerging career patterns, and access and equalization of educational opportunities for the weaker sections of society, particularly the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and those belonging to the educationally backward areas. The focus of development assistance to the colleges is to support the teaching-learning process by upgrading basic infrastructure like a library, laboratory, connectivity, etc. However, the major emphasis is on expanding and consolidating facilities in the existing institutions and improving standards through modernization, rationalization, and diversification of undergraduate courses, especially to relate them to career opportunities.

4.2 Colleges under section 2(f) & 12B of the UGC Act 1956

The UGC had notified Regulations for recognition of colleges under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956. The colleges are brought under the purview of UGC in terms of these Regulations as and when they receive proposals for inclusion under 2(f) and are found fit for inclusion as per the provisions contained in the Regulations.

Apart from the inclusion of colleges under Section 2(f), the UGC includes the Colleges under Section 12B of its Act in terms of Rules framed under the Act. This makes the colleges eligible for central assistance from the Government of India or any organization receiving funds from the Central Government.

As on 31.03.2023, a total of 13523 Colleges has been recognized by UGC under Section 2(f) and 12B (3120 Colleges under Section 2(f) and 10403 Colleges under Section 12B) (details on next page), while a total number of colleges recognized by UGC under Section 2(f) and 12(B) as on 31.03.2023 is 13523 (3120 Colleges under Section 2(f) and 10403 Colleges under Section 12B).



4.2(i) Colleges Recognized by UGC for Financial Assistance

As of 31st March 2023, the country has nearly 46207* (*Provisional Figure from AISHE Portal) affiliated / constituent colleges. Out of them, only 13523 colleges are recognized by the UGC under section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956. Out of the recognized colleges, 10403 are eligible for central assistance under section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.

Government Colleges (Central/State), Constituent Colleges (Central/ State Universities), and Government-Aided Colleges under section 12B of the UGC Act 1956 are eligible for assistance under all schemes. Self-finance colleges under section 12B of the UGC Act 1956 are only eligible for assistance under student/teacher-centric schemes.

4.3 Grants to colleges by the UGC regional offices

As per decision taken in 558th Commission meeting held on 06.05.2022, the UGC Regional Offices have been relocated to UGC Headquarter at New Delhi as per the following:

The UGC decentralized its functioning by opening seven Regional Offices in the country in since 1994 in a phased manner for easy access and speedy release of grants and implementation of various schemes/programmes relating to colleges. Northern Regional Office (NRO), Ghaziabad, was converted into "Northern Region Colleges Bureau" and shifted from Ghaziabad to Delhi at 35, Feroze Shah Road, New Delhi w. e. f. 25.09.2001. The SERO, Hyderabad, North-Easternn Regional Office (NERO) Guwahati & SWRO have relocated to Delhi at 35, Feroze Shah Road, New Delhi, during the month of December 2022 under the ambit of College Development Bureau-I including NRCB, Delhi. 



5.1 Potential for Excellence-Teaching and Research

The UGC introduced the following Scheme of Excellence in Universities and Colleges. The details of the Schemes are as under: -

- 5.1(i) Colleges with Potential for Excellence (CPE)
- 5.1(ii) Centre with Potential for Excellence in a Particular Area (CPEPA)
- 5.1(iii) Universities with Potential for Excellence (UPE)

5.1(i) Colleges with Potential for Excellence (CPE)

The scheme for Colleges with Potential for Excellence (CPE) was started during the X Plan period. Under the scheme, Colleges were financially supported to improve their academic infrastructure, adopt innovations in teaching, learning and evaluation and introduce a flexible approach in the selection of courses at the degree level. The objective of the scheme envisaged to help selected colleges achieve excellence mainly in teaching activity and initiate a research culture in such Colleges. The scheme was continued during the XII Plan period, and under the Scheme, 314 institutions were approved. Out of which, 295 Colleges had CPE Status and 19 Colleges had CE Status under the CPE Scheme.

5.1(ii) Centre with Potential for Excellence in a Particular Area (CPEPA)

The UGC came out with another initiative in the form of a Scheme named as "Centre with Potential for Excellence in a Particular Area (CPEPA)" with objective to encourage and facilitate the chosen departments at the selected university to work together by associating their likeminded faculty members to cooperate and collaborate in their programmes and activities on a regular basis, by cutting across departmental and discipline barriers. This initiative also was continued in the XII Plan period and there were 29 institutions were having CPEPA Status under the Centre with Potential for Excellence in a Particular Area (CPEPA).

5.1(iii) Universities with Potential for Excellence (UPE)

Similarly, the UGC during the IX, X and XI Plan periods, adopted a strategy to identify a few Universities

with Potential for Excellence (UPE) in teaching and research activities. This initiative continued during the XII Plan period. In the XII Plan period, there were 16 Universities had UPE Status under the Universities with Potential for Excellence (UPE)Scheme. To identify a few more universities that have the potential to achieve excellence not only in teaching and research but also in all related functions that could contribute to the holistic development of the Universities.

The tenure of the above Schemes has now been completed for fresh induction and the schemes of CPE, CPEPA and UPE have now been closed.

- I) During the year 2022-23 from the period (01.04.2022 to 31.03.2023) total 03 Colleges/ Beneficiaries sanctioned letters of ₹23,46,000/- have been issued for payment under the CPE Scheme.
- II) During the year 2022-23 from the period (01.04.2022 to 31.03.2023) no grant was released to any UPE Universities.
- III) During the year 2022-23 from the period (01.04.2022 to 31.03.2023) no grant was released to any Centre under the CPEPA Scheme.

5.2 Special Assistance Programme (SAP)

The SAP scheme was initiated in 1963 by University Grants Commission keeping in view the recommendations of the Education Commission to facilitate the selected number of University Departments having some potential in research and teaching. The programme is intended to encourage the pursuit of excellence and teamwork in advanced teaching and research to accelerate the realisation of international standards in specific fields. The first such programme was initially started as the 'Centre of Advanced Study (CAS)' in 1963. Some of these Centers also received recognition and financial support from UNDP/UNESCO. The 'Department of Special Assistance (DSA)' and 'Departmental Research Support (DRS)' programmes were started in the Departments during 1972 and 1977 respectively to create feeder departments for CAS.

1. Special Assistance Programme (SAP) Levels

- A. Departmental Research Support (DRS)
- B. Department of Special Assistance (DSA)
- C. Centre of Advanced Study (CAS)

2. Objectives

The major objectives of the Special Assistance Programme (SAP) are as follows: -

- a) To identify and support university departments that is having potential to undertake quality teaching and research in various educational disciplines including allied disciplines.
- b) To promulgate research in universities to be relevant to societal needs, have society and industry interaction.
- c) To make research a catalyst for good teaching and introduction of new courses relating to identified thrust areas.
- d) To have linkages with research and to use their expertise innovatively to support research in the universities.
- e) To enhance infrastructure facilities.
- f) To utilize the output of research for the development of the nation and society.
- g) To train and create quality human resources in identified thrust areas.
- h) To search for newer/generic area(s), of research, its promotion and nurturing.

To fulfill the above objectives, linkages with research organisations such as, DST, CSIR, DRDO, DBT etc. should be encouraged. Priority should be given to interdisciplinary research in all fields.

3. Eligibility

A University department which qualifies under Section 2 (f) & 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956 and has potential to undertake quality teaching and research can submit its proposal for induction under SAP. The department should have at least Six teachers (including one Professor) to become eligible for induction under SAP.

4. Duration of the Programme

The tenure of the Special Assistance Programme (SAP) will be for a period of FIVE YEARS for a particular phase. The UGC will not provide financial assistance for more than Three terms (5 years each) at the same level of DRS and DSA. If the performance of the department improves significantly at the level of DRS/DSA, the department shall be considered to be upgraded to the next level of DSA/CAS. If the performance of the department does not improve significantly after receiving a grant for Three terms at the level of DRS/DSA, UGC shall discontinue the programme. The effective date of implementation of the approved phase/tenure will be 1stApril of the ensuing year. The department must accept terms & conditions and implement the programme within Six months from the date of approval or 1st April of the next financial year whichever is earlier, otherwise UGC shall be at liberty to cancel the approval of the programme.

5. Nature of Assistance

The maximum limit of financial assistance for a period of five years at different levels of the programme will be as under:

The financial Assistance includes-

- 1. Salary of Project Fellows.
- 2. Non-recurring as well as recurring items of expenditure.

6. International collaboration

The University Grants Commission, on the basis of the recommendations of the University and the Advisory Committee, may consider well-defined collaborative research programme for sending up to two teachers in a year from SAP departments to the identified foreign University/ Research Institute for a period of two to Six months.

7. Selection Procedure

All the proposals duly prepared as per the guidelines of the programme received from the eligible university departments through proper channels from the university are scrutinized and shortlisted by the Subject Expert committee. The Shortlisted proposals are considered by the Subject Induction Committee, which identifies 2 or 3 thrust areas or group areas not too narrowly based on the excellence in the department. The Committee also identifies two Advisory Committee members from the related field.

8. Release of Grant

Based on the recommendations of the Induction Committee and its acceptance by the UGC, the financial approval/assistance shall be conveyed to the selected department of the concerned university, subject to certain terms and conditions. On receipt of the acceptance of the terms and conditions, UGC will sanction total non-recurring and recurring grants for the first year of the programme. However, a Non-Recurring grant is released only after the settlement of the accounts of the earlier phase in case of ongoing programmes, which must be done within a period of two years.

9. Monitoring/Evaluation of the Departments

Monitoring/Evaluation and Review of the progress, performance, achievements made by the Departments supported under the SAP are done through the Advisory Committee and Final Review Committee.

5.3 Autonomous Colleges

In 1964-66 Education Commission pointed out that the exercise of academic freedom by teachers is a crucial requirement for the development of the intellectual climate of our country. Unless such a climate prevails, it is difficult to achieve excellence in our Higher Education system. With students, teachers and management being co-partners in raising the quality of higher education, it is imperative that they share a major responsibility. Hence, the Education Commission (1964-66) recommended college autonomy which, in essence is the instrument for promoting academic excellence.

- 1. Role, terms and conditions of an Autonomous College: The role, terms and conditions of an Autonomous College in general and subject to the provisions of Regulations will be as under:
 - 1.1 Review existing courses/programmes and restructure, redesign and prescribe its own courses/programmes of study and syllabi.
 - 1.2 To formulate new courses/programmes within the nomenclature specified by UGC as per the specification of degrees 2014 as amended from time to time.
 - 1.3 Evolve methods of assessment of students performance, conduct of examinations, and notification of results.
 - 1.4 To announce results, issue mark sheets, and other certificates; however, the degree shall be awarded by the parent University with the name of the College on the degree certificate.
 - 1.5 Autonomous Colleges need not pay affiliation fees to the parent University.
 - 1.6 Prescribe rules for admission in consonance with the reservation policy of the state government/national policy.

- 1.7 Autonomous Colleges may fix fees as per the norms of the State Government/ Statutory Council(s) at their own level as applicable.
- 1.8 Constitute own Governing Body, Academic Council, Finance Committee and Board of Studies.
- 1.9 The teaching staff and Principal in all the Autonomous Colleges shall be appointed as per the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in Universities and Colleges and other measures for the maintenance of standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2018 as amended from time to time or any regulations notified by UGC in this regard from time to time.
- 1.10 Autonomy granted to the College is at the institutional level and is not partial and shall cover the programmes at all levels of U.G. and P.G. offered by the College. The courses introduced by the College after the conferment of Autonomous status shall automatically come under the purview of autonomy.
- 1.11 Ph.D. programmes shall be offered strictly as per the UGC Regulations notified in this regard from time to time.
- 1.12 Autonomous status shall be granted initially for a period of Five or Ten years as per Clause 7 of these regulations.
- 1.13 Further extension of autonomy shall be for a period of Five or Ten years as per Clause 8 of these regulations.

2. Eligibility

- 2.1 Affiliated or Constituent Colleges of any discipline whether Government aided partially aided or unaided/self-financing are eligible provided they are under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act.
- 2.2 The College should have at least 10 years of existence.
- 2.3 The College must be accredited either by NAAC or by NBA for at least Three programme(s) or from a UGC-empaneled accreditation agency. However, if the number of programme(s) being run by the College is less than Three, then each of the eligible programmes must be accredited as per NBA norms. Accreditation status must be valid for at least One year at the time of application.
 - The constituent colleges shall also undergo independent accreditation.
- 2.4 The Commission may exempt a college from Clauses 6.2 and 6.3 of these Regulations if it offers programmes in any of the following focus areas:
 - Unique discipline(s), e.g., special education, Indian knowledge system, yoga, defence studies
 - Addressing the strategic needs of the country
 - Engaged in the preservation of Indian cultural heritage.
 - Preservation of the environment
 - Dedicated to Skill Development, Sports and languages
 - Any other discipline(s)/ field(s) so determined by the Commission.

3. Conferment of Autonomous Status:

3.1 A College fulfilling the eligibility as per Clause 6 of these regulations, intending to become Autonomous, shall submit the application on the UGC portal anytime during the year. However, in the case of proposals for the grant of autonomy/extension of autonomy which have already been received and are under consideration by UGC before the notification of these regulations no fresh application will be required, and UGC will consider all such pending proposals as per these Regulations, subject to the condition that the accreditation

- status is valid for Six months at the time of notification of these Regulations or has applied for reaccreditation in case the validity of accreditation is less than Six months.
- 3.2 The parent University will examine the application of the College for Autonomous status on the UGC portal and give its recommendations along with reasons/justification within 30 working days from the date of submission of the application on the UGC portal. If the parent University does not respond on the UGC portal within 30 working days, it shall be presumed that the parent University has no objection to the processing of the application by the UGC for conferment of Autonomous status.
- 3.3 A Standing Committee of UGC shall examine the application of the College for conferment of Autonomous status. The recommendations of the Standing Committee shall be considered by the Commission and its decision may be communicated to the parent University and the College.
- 3.4 Autonomous status shall be granted initially for a period of Five years from the commencement of an academic session in case the College is accredited either by NAAC or by NBA for at least Three programme(s); or from a UGC-empaneled accreditation agency. However, if the number of programme(s) being run by the College is less than Three, then each of the eligible programme must be accredited as per NBA norms. Accreditation status must be valid for at least One year at the time of application submission;
- Autonomous status shall be granted initially for a period of Ten years from the commencement of an academic session in case the College is accredited either by NAAC with a minimum "A" Grade (with a score of 3.01 and above on a 4-point scale of NAAC) or by NBA for at least Three programme(s) with a minimum score of 675 individually, or a corresponding accreditation Grade/score from a UGC empaneled accreditation agency. However, if the number of programme(s) being run by the College is less than Three then each of the eligible programme as per NBA norms, should secure 675 or more marks. Accreditation status must be valid for at least One year at the time of application submission;
- 3.6 If the application of a College for the conferment of Autonomous status is rejected by the UGC for any reason whatsoever, the College shall be eligible to reapply on the UGC portal, but not before One year from the date of rejection of its earlier application.
- 3.7 An Autonomous College can merge with another Autonomous college(s)/institution(s) run by the same parent Body of the Autonomous Colleges, with the prior approval of the Parent University/Universities.

4. Extension of Autonomous Status

4.1 If an Autonomous college has accreditation either by NAAC; or by NBA for at least Three programme(s); or from a UGC-empaneled accreditation agency; (if the number of programme(s) being run by the College is less than Three, then each of the eligible programme should be accredited as per NBA norms) on the last day of completion of Autonomy period, the College shall be eligible for grant of an extension of Autonomous status for further Five years, provided that the College has followed the procedure stipulated in Clause 8.3 below. The College shall apply for an extension of Autonomous status on the UGC portal at least Three months before the completion of the autonomy period. The Autonomous College shall also inform the Parent University about its application for the extension of Autonomous status. The Standing Committee of UGC shall examine the application of the Autonomous College for extension of Autonomous status. The recommendations of the Standing Committee shall be considered by the Commission and its decision may be communicated to the parent University and the Autonomous College.

- If an Autonomous college has NAAC with a minimum "A" Grade with a score of 3.01 4.2 and above on a 4-point scale of NAAC or by NBA for at least Three programme(s) with a minimum score of 675 individually or a corresponding accreditation Grade/score from a UGC empaneled accreditation agency (if the number of programme(s) being run by the College is less than three, then each of the eligible programme as per NBA norms should secure 675 or more marks) on the last day of completion of Autonomy period, the College shall be eligible for grant of an extension of Autonomous status for further Ten years, provided that the College has followed the procedure stipulated in Clause 8.3 below. The College shall apply for an extension of Autonomous status on the UGC portal at least Three months before the completion of the autonomy period. The Autonomous College shall also inform the parent University about its application for the extension of Autonomous status. The Standing Committee of UGC shall examine the application of the Autonomous College for extension of Autonomous status. The recommendations of the Standing Committee shall be considered by the Commission and its decision may be communicated to the parent University and the Autonomous College.
- 4.3 Autonomous colleges are required to apply for reaccreditation Six months before the end of the cycle of the accreditation period as mentioned in the Accreditation Certificate issued by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council/NBA/UGC empaneled accreditation agency. For Autonomous Colleges that have applied for reaccreditation Six months before the end of the cycle of the accreditation period in case there is a delay in the accreditation process by the accrediting body, the delay period between two consecutive accreditations shall be condoned. Autonomous colleges that have not applied for reaccreditation Six months before the end of the accreditation period should get the accreditation within one year from the end of the last accreditation cycle, failing which the autonomy automatically stands withdrawn.
- 4.4 In case an Autonomous College fails to obtain the required accreditation Grade/score as per clauses 8.1, 8.2 and 8.3 above, the autonomy to such College stands automatically withdrawn, and no fresh admissions will be done under autonomy mode after withdrawal of Autonomous status. No communication from the parent University and UGC will be needed in this regard. It will be the responsibility of the College to inform the parent University and UGC regarding the withdrawal of autonomy. However, for students admitted during the autonomy period, such withdrawal shall take effect only after the last batch of students enrolled under autonomy passes out.
- 4.5 Such Colleges whose autonomy is withdrawn shall be eligible to apply for fresh autonomy on the UGC portal but not before one year from the effective date of withdrawal of autonomy.

5. Monitoring of Autonomous Colleges

- 5.1 IQAC shall be established in the Autonomous College for regular monitoring of the College. The IQAC shall have an external peer team comprising of 2 or more members who shall be academicians of repute not below the rank of Professor. The report regarding the performance of the Autonomous College shall also be put in the public domain on the website of the College. The external peer review shall be conducted at least once a year.
- 5.2 On its own or in case of an adverse report by the external peer team of IQAC or on receipt of any information/complaint, UGC may cause an inspection by constituting an Expert Committee for scrutiny and may revoke the Autonomous status of the College after giving due opportunity of hearing to the management by way of notification and by passing a speaking order.
- 5.3 The Autonomous College shall without fail upload on its website information regarding the courses offered by it, the fees for the courses the details of the faculty along with qualification

- and unique ID, the admission procedure, the details of relevant infrastructures, research activities of the Autonomous College along with the details of Ph.D. students enrolled, if any, with the date of enrolment, topics and supervisor.
- The Autonomous College shall also put on its website the constitution of various Committees/ Cells as mandated in the various UGC Regulations notified from time to time. The Autonomous College shall conduct the meetings of the statutory bodies regularly and upload the minutes of the meetings on the college website.
- 5.5 The Autonomous College shall also upload such information on such web portals as may be specified by the Commission from time to time.
 - As of 31.03.2023, there were 903 Autonomous Colleges spread over 118 Universities and 25 States.

5.4 Human Resource Development Centre (HRDC)

With an aim to maintain high standards of teaching in Universities and Colleges the Scheme of Academic Staff Colleges was introduced in 1986-87. At present, there are 66 HRDCs (formerly known as PSCs) all over India. These centres, so established are conducting specially designed Orientation Programmes now FIP (Guru Dakshta) of Four weeks duration for newly appointed Assistant Professors and Refresher Courses of three-week duration for is service teachers.

The HRDC Section has sanctioned grants to 50 HRDCs out of 66 HRDCs. The grant could not be released to the remaining 16 HRDCs due to not settling the accounts/not operationalisation of TSA for the years 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 & 2022-23.

Approximately 95311 Teachers-participants have gone through the programmes/courses conducted by the 66 UGC HRDCs.

Allotment of courses of Faculty Induction Programme (Guru Dakshta). Refresher Courses, Short Term Programmes, Workshops & others for 2022-23 in respect of 66 Human Resource Development Centres (HRDCs) in this regard, the Standing Committee Meeting was held on 28.03.2022.

An amount of ₹32,86,21,758/- has already been released to 50 HRDCs for 2022-23

5.5 Human Rights & Value Education (HRVE)

Human Rights are in themselves ends as well as means. They are ends in terms of standards to be attained and are means as they enable and empower the people to use the rights and enjoy the rights. It is both an area of academic enquiry and also a part of everyday life experience of humans as members of society. Accordingly, the University Grants Commission initiated the scheme of Human Rights Education in University Sector in 1985. Since then, the Higher Education sector has been supported financially and for promoting Human Rights and Values and Human Development as well. There are Three components of the Human Rights Education scheme:

(i) Human Rights and Duties, (ii) Human Rights and Values and (iii) Human Rights and Human Development.

Coverage of the target group including number of beneficiaries (Universities, Colleges, Teacher, Students, Women, SC/ST etc.)

Total 612 (Universities, Colleges & Institutions) had been funded with UGC's financial assistance for Seminars, Workshop, Symposium, Promotion of ethics, P.G. degree course, P.G. diploma course, Certificate course, Foundation course, Undergraduate course.

Settlement of Accounts (Pending utilisation certificates) of XIth & XIIth plan are being done on the basis of the utilisation certificate and statement of expenditure received from the Institutions. Refunds are also being sought wherever applicable.

Important decisions/ resolutions of the Commission

The Commission at its meeting held on 10th May, 2013, the scheme of Human Rights Education has been grouped with GDA.

5.6 Promotion of Rajbhasha

The University Grants Commission Act, 1956 stipulates that an annual report of the organization is prepared every year in respect of each activity/scheme/programme, its performance achievements and policy formulation for the Development of Higher Education. Copies of the annual report in Hindi as well as in English are laid in Parliament through the Ministry of Education. The University Grants Commission Act, 1956 stipulates that an annual report of the organization is prepared every year in respect of each activity/scheme/programme copies of the annual report in Hindi and English regarding its performance achievements and policy formulation for the development of Higher Education and is laid in Parliament through the Ministry of Education. Therefore, the information of the annual report given by the University Grants Commission for the year 2022-23 (April 01, 2022 to March 31, 2023).

Efforts are being made by the Official Language Section of the University Grants Commission to do more and more work in Hindi and instructions are issued from time to time for promotion and excessive use of Hindi. According to the orders of the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Ministry of Education, approval has been given by the Commission for the establishment of Hindi cell in aided central universities and for the establishment and upgradation of Hindi departments in central/deemed/state universities for the promotion of Hindi.

- Settlement of accounts by issuing a grant of ₹25 lakh to Mohanlal Sukhadia University and ₹12.50 lakh to Cochin University of Science and Technology, Kochi for the establishment of Hindi Cell in Central University and the establishment and up gradation of the Hindi Department in Central/Deemed/State Universities.
- Hindi translation of the documents (general orders, memorandum, resolutions, notifications, rules, agreements, contracts, tender notices, parliamentary questions, etc.) issued under section 3(3) of the Official Language Act, 1963, has been translated.
- In the year 2022-23, Three officers were nominated for Hindi proficient training and all Three passed the examination in first class. These Three officers were given an incentive amount of ₹10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) paid lump on a one-time pay hike.
- The work of translation in Hindi of the material received for translation from various sections of the Commission has been done by the Rajbhasha Section.

Annual Accounts, 2021-2022, as well as administrative tender notices, formats of various holidays prescribed by the administration (earned leave/casual/child care/medical leave encashment, joining, resignation etc.), information related to Right to Information and Letters, administrative office orders, memorandums, transfers, postings, retirements, disciplinary orders, semi-official letters and advertisements received by sections, circulars and medical supply medicine forms for officers and employees serving in the commission, for maintenance of standards in Higher Education other Measures Regulations, 2022 (Second Amendment).

• During the year 2022, various competitions such as essays, Hindi computer-type writing, noting and drafting, self-composed poems and debates were organized for the officers/employees of the Commission. Cash prizes and certificates of ₹4,000/-, ₹3,000/-, ₹2,000/- and

- ₹1,000/- respectively, were given to the first, second, third and incentive place winners in the competition.
- Hindi Pakhwara (Fortnightly) has been organized from September 16-30, 2022 and Hindi Day (Hybrid) has been organized on September 29, 2022. A total of Rs 1,10,000/- (₹ One lakh Ten Thousand only) was spent for organizing Hindi Diwas and distribution of prizes.
- During the year, two virtual meetings of the Town Official Language Implementation Committee (TOLIC) were organized on 29.08.2022 and 16.01.2023, in which officers and employees of the Commission participated.
- Half yearly progress report related to the progressive use of the official language Hindi from 01.04.2022 to 30.09.2022 has been sent to the Town Official Language Implementation Committee.
- According to the Annual Program 2022-23 of the Ministry of Home Affairs, all efforts have been made to achieve the targets.
- To ensure compliance with Section 3(3) of the Official Language Act, 1963, all the documents covered under Section 3(3) of the Official Language Act, 1963 are issued simultaneously in bilingual form and while issuing, it is kept in mind that the Hindi version, is above English.
- In the Ministry of Education, an office memorandum has been issued for the creation/ strengthening of checkpoints for compliance with the rules made under the Official Language Act/Rules
- Official language inspection of 3 Central Universities has been done by the Inspection Committee of the University Grants Commission.

Important policy decisions/resolutions of the Commission in the context of schemes/ programmes during the year 2022-23.

For the establishment and upgradation of the Hindi department in aided universities by the University Grants Commission, grant-in-aid was provided to the universities in the past and reminders were issued to withdraw the unspent amount from those universities that have not completed the expenditure of the aided amount.

Every effort has been made to comply with the instructions given in the Annual Program 2022-23 issued by the Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs.

Webinars

Four Official Language Implementation Committee meetings and Four workshops were organized by the Official Language Section of the Commission through webinars.

Online Workshop/Programme.

In the year 2022-23, Four meetings of the Official Language Implementation Committee were held on 28.04.2022, 06.09.2022, 22.12.2022 and 24.03.2023 through the hybrid medium.


5.7 Bilateral Cultural and Educational Exchange Programmes

The University Grants Commission, on behalf of the Government of India, has been implementing various collaborative academic programmes between India and foreign countries. UGC has implemented Joint Research Programmes with countries like the USA, UK, Israel, Norway, New Zealand, and Germany has also facilitated Indian scholars to realize their research potential through scholarship, fellowship and research programmes such as Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarships, Raman Fellowships for Post-doctoral research in the USA, Project-based Personnel Exchange Programme.

5.7(i) JOINT RESEARCH PROJECTS

5.7(i)(a) Indo-Israel Joint Research Programme:

The Joint Research Programme aims to encourage research cooperation between Israeli and Indian scientists.

The programme is activated through an agreement of cooperation between the University Grant Commission (UGC) and the Israel Science Foundation (ISF) and is funded by the Indian and Israeli governments through the two funding agencies each funding its own scientists according to their respective regulations. The programme is open to all disciplines.

So far, 43 projects have been awarded under the programme.

5.7(i)(b) UGC-UKIERI Thematic Partnerships

The UK India Education and Research Initiative (UKIERI) was started in April, 2006 with the aim of enhancing the educational link between the two countries.

Under Phase-I of UKIERI (2006-2011), a Joint Workshop was organised in India in 2009 wherein 14 HEIs of both countries participated. The expenditure on holding the workshop was borne by UGC.

On 16.08.2011, an MoU was signed between India and the UK for phase 2 of UKIERI. It was decided to implement a joint research programme under thematic partnerships.

Under Phase II (2011-2016), a total of 61 projects were awarded.

Under Phase–III (2016-2021), a total of 43 joint research projects were awarded.

Under UKIERI Phase III, the Higher Education Leadership Development Programme for Administrative Staff of Indian Universities was implemented. The programme was conducted in two phases and the second phase concluded in March, 2022. More than 100 Indian University staff members were trained by UK trainers. The programme was implemented by UGC, British Council and Advance Higher Education UK. As the programme was delivered online, there was no financial liability on the part of UGC.

5.7(i)(c) Indo-German Partnerships in Higher Education (IGP):

An MoU was signed between the MHRD (now MoE), India and Federal Ministry of Education and Research, Germany on 11th April 2013 at Berlin on the occasion of 2nd Indo-German Inter-Governmental Consultation.

Through this MoU, both sides agreed on a new funding programme called Indo-German Partnerships in Higher Education (IGP). The responsibility for the concept and financial and Organizational administration of the programme lies with UGC and DAAD.

Based on the MoU signed between the Ministries and Joint Declaration Intent an MoU was signed on 5th October 2015 between the University Grants Commission (UGC), India and the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), Germany on Indo-German Partnership in Higher Education (IGP). In the 1st cycle, 8 Institutional partnerships have been awarded in 2016 for the project period of Four years w.e.f. 1st July, 2016 to 30th June, 2020 extended up to 31st December, 2020.

In the 2nd cycle, 9 Institutional partnerships have been awarded in 2020 for the project period of Four years w.e.f. 1st July, 2020 to 30th June, 2024.

An expenditure of ₹ 121.99 Lakh was incurred on Indo-German Partnerships in Higher Education (IGP) 2022-23

5.7(i)(d) Project-Based Personal Exchange Programme (PPP):

The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and the University Grants Commission (UGC) in New Delhi have worked out a programme designed to intensify the scientific cooperation through funding of scholars who would participate in cooperative research projects primarily in the fields of humanities and social sciences. Priority is given to young Ph.D. and Post-Doctoral scientists and scholars.

5.7(i)(e) Indo-US 21st Century Knowledge

Indo-US 21st Century Knowledge Initiative was announced in 2009 as an affirmation of the commitment to build an enhanced India – United States strategic partnership in education. As a part of its implementation, the UGC announced an open competition under Indo-US 21st Century Knowledge Initiative and invited proposals for Joint Research from the institutions recognized under Section 2(f) and 12B of UGC Act and Institutions of National Importance in the following areas:

- Energy study,
- Sustainable Development,
- Climate Change,
- Environmental Studies,
- Education and Educational Reforms,
- Community Development and Innovation.

5.7 (ii) Fellowships, Scholarships and Exchange of Scholars:

5.7(ii)(a) Raman Fellowships for Post-doctoral Research in USA

The University Grants Commission has offered these fellowships with the aim of providing an excellent opportunity to young Indian researchers and teachers of all disciplines to have international collaborative research training in advanced techniques and technologies in emerging fields, thereby furthering their research capacity and ability to contribute to Higher Education with a global perspective and forging long-term relationships with distinguished experts in USA.

An expenditure of ₹ 3.98 Lakh was incurred on Raman Fellowships for Post-doctoral Research in USA 2022-23.

5.7(ii) (b) Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme

As per the provisions mentioned in the Indo-Hungarian Educational Exchange Programme, signed between the Ministry of Human Capacities of Hungary and The Ministry of Human Resource Development of the Republic of India on 19th November, 2014 UGC invite applications from Indian students to pursue graduate, post-graduate and doctoral studies in Hungary. Under this agreement, the Hungarian Government provides scholarships to 200 Indian Students, and the expenditure towards their airfare is borne by UGC after completion of their studies. In the year 2021-2022, 173 Indian students were selected by the Hungarian Scholarship Board under this scholarship programme. The Indian Government, through UGC offers 35 scholarships for Hungarian students.

An expenditure of ₹ 14.45 Lakh was incurred on Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme 2022-23

5.7(ii)(c) Indo-Bulgarian CEP

As per the Cultural Exchange Programme, Four Indian scholars are nominated for participation in the International Seminar in Bulgarian language and culture organized by "St. Kliment Ohridski: Sofia University and "St. Cyril and St. Methodius" University of Veliko Tarnovo.

5.7(ii)(d) Indo-Norwegian Cooperation Programme (INCP)

Indo-Norway Cooperation programme in Higher Education and Research (INCP) is a new initiative that aims at enhancing Higher Education links between India and Norway. The programme is based on the MoU on cooperation in Higher Education between India and Norway signed on February 14, 2014 and on the Agreement on Academic Cooperation between the University Grants Commission (UGC) India and the Norwegian Centre for International Cooperation in Education (SIU).

INCP is jointly financed through matching grants by the Indian Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA). UGC, INDIA and SIU, Norway are the implementing agencies for this programme.

Under INCP, UGC, India and SIU Norway invited applications for Joint Research Projects and selected 13 projects in the year 2014 for a period of 3 years. 1st January, 2015 to 31st December, 2017 and extended up to 31st December, 2018.

5.7(iii) Foreign Language Teachers

The UGC has collaborative programmes which, inter-alia, provide for the appointment of foreign language teachers in Indian universities to teach foreign languages. They are appointed in the Universities in consultation with the Mission of country concerned and the respective Universities. While providing language teacher to a university, it is generally ensured that the university has proper infrastructure for teaching foreign languages.

As per the Educational Exchange Plan (EEP) and Continuous Educational Plan (CEP) appointment of 22 foreign language teachers have been approved in various Higher Education Institutions in India.

5.7(iv) NEP, 2020 and Internationalisation of Higher Education:

In line with the vision of NEP, 2020 and to make efforts towards internationalisation of Higher Education in India, UGC has taken a few initiatives, which are as follows:

Office for International Affairs:

The establishment of an Office for International Affairs at the institutional level will facilitate and operationalize effective approaches towards the internationalisation of the Higher Education system. This office will be responsible for undertaking various activities including, but not limited to:

- Coordinate all matters relating to welcoming and supporting foreign students,
- Single point contact for carrying out all collaborative activities with foreign institutions,
- Act as a liaison body between the foreign students and the sponsoring agency,
- Address the grievances of foreign students in all matters,
- Single point contact for foreign student registration with FRRO/e-FRRO,
- Facilitate networking of international students with fellow students,
- Extend all possible help to the foreign students to adapt to the new cultural environment and make their stay in India comfortable and enriching,
- Provide support services for integration of international students into institution's academic and social activities,
- Disseminate information related to the admission process among prospective foreign students,
- Conceptualizing and engaging in promotional activities and effective approach towards brand building campaign abroad,
- Addressing the concern of Indian students, under Twinning arrangement,
- Implementing and monitoring institution-level strategies for internationalisation,
- Maintaining records and disseminating information related to internationalisation,
- Maintain database of foreign students, including alumni and carry out surveys on their needs and priorities.

UGC has already issued necessary guidelines to all the Universities for establishment of Office for International Affairs.

So far, 167 Universities have established Office for International Affairs.

Alumni Connect Cell:

Alumni of foreign origin as well as Indian alumni living abroad can play a crucial role in brand building of the Indian Higher Education Institutions abroad and making India a global study destination. Higher education institutions in India need to create a culture for alumni to reconnect, devise suitable vehicles

for brand building and give due recognition to their contributions. The "Alumni Connect" encourages Indian HEIs to engage with Alumni (foreign origin and Indians living abroad). To maintain a continuous engagement with the alumni, the HEIs may undertake several activities, such as:

- Establish an alumni cell and maintain a detailed database of the alumni living abroad (both Indian and foreign),
- Sharing with the alumni regarding the latest initiatives of the institution,
- Virtually connecting with the alumni and inviting them for participation in conferences/ webinars.
- Networking get-togethers among the alumni including through video conferencing,
- Providing brochure, pamphlets and other advertising materials about the institution, programmes and courses for its dissemination abroad,
- Engage in community service activity with help of Alumni,
- Honouring distinguished alumni for supporting in brand building exercise as well as overall development of the institution.

UGC has already issued necessary guidelines to all the Universities for setting up Alumni Connect Cell. So far, 164 Universities have set up Alumni Connect Cell.

Regulations on Joint Degree and Dual Degree:

The National Education Policy-2020 recommended that research collaboration and student exchanges between Indian institutions and global institutions will be promoted through special efforts. Credits acquired in foreign universities will be permitted, where appropriate as per the requirements of each HEI, to be counted for the award of a degree".

In line with NEP, 2020, the University Grants Commission has approved University Grants Commission (Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Higher Educational Institutions to offer Twinning, Joint Degree and Dual Degree Programmes) Regulations, 2022.

The key features of the Regulations are as follows:

- For a "Joint Degree programme", the curriculum shall be designed jointly by the collaborating Indian and Foreign Higher Educational Institutions and, upon completion of the programme; the Degree is awarded by the Indian Higher Educational Institution and the collaborating Foreign Higher Educational Institution with a single Certificate.
- The students must earn at least 30 percent of the total credits from each of the Indian and Foreign Higher Educational Institutions. Credits to be earned by the Indian students from the foreign institution and credits earned by the foreign students from Indian institutions shall be obtained through conventional mode of study.
- Credits earned for the course(s) in an institution shall count towards the degrees jointly awarded by both the institutions.
- "Dual Degree Programme" shall be a programme jointly designed and offered by the Indian and Foreign Higher Educational Institutions in the same disciplines/subject areas and in the same level. The degrees for such programme shall be conferred by the Indian and Foreign Higher Educational Institutions, separately and simultaneously, upon completion of degree requirements of both the institutions. This shall not in any way be construed as two-degree programmes in separate disciplines/subject areas and levels being pursued simultaneously.
- The students must earn at least 30 percent of total credits from the Indian institution. Credits to be earned by the Indian students from the foreign institution and credits earned by the foreign students from Indian institutions shall be obtained through conventional mode of study.

- Credit earned for the course(s) in an institution shall count towards degrees to be awarded by both the institutions.
- The Indian and Foreign Higher Educational Institutions shall be eligible to offer Twinning, Joint Degree and Dual Degree programmes under these regulations provided they fulfill the following eligibility criteria:-
 - Any recognized Indian Higher Educational Institution which is accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) or any other Agency authorised in this behalf, with a minimum score of 3.01 on a 4-point scale at the time of application or which figures in the top 1000 of Times Higher Education or QS World University ranking at the time of application or which figures in the top 100 in university category of National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) at the time of application,
 - Any Foreign Higher Educational Institution figuring in top 1000 of Times Higher Education or QS World University ranking at the time of application.

5.8 National Educational Testing (NET): Development of Human Resource for Teaching and Research

National Eligibility Test (UGC-NET) is conducted to determine eligibility for Assistant Professor and Junior Research Fellowships (JRF) in order to ensure minimum standards for the entrants in the teaching profession and research in several subjects of Humanities (including Indian and some foreign languages), Yoga, Social Sciences, Computer Science and Applications, Electronic Science, Forensic Science and Environmental Sciences. The Test is conducted normally twice every year in several cities spread across the country, generally in the months of June and December in 83 subjects, apart from Paper-I, which is for examining the candidates on their general awareness, verbal reasoning, logical ability, teaching aptitude and acumen for research.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) was conducting the test for determining the eligibility for the award of Junior Research Fellowships (JRF) since 1984 in order to ensure greater comparability as well as higher degree of validity and reliability in the field of research. In order to maintain a uniform standard of teaching and research in the country, the Government of India, as per its New Education Policy, 1986 envisaged that "only those candidates who, besides fulfilling the minimum academic qualifications prescribed for the post of lecturer, have qualified in a comprehensive test to be specifically conducted for the purpose will be eligible for appointment as Lecturers". The University Grants Commission held wideranging consultation on the issue of evolving the qualifying test for appointment as Assistant Professor/ Lecturer with groups of academicians and educational administrators like State Education Secretaries. Accordingly, UGC coalesced the proposed examination with the test for JRF already being conducted by it and conducted the first National Eligibility Test for Junior Research Fellowship and Eligibility for Lectureship (UGC-NET) on 24th December, 1989 in the subjects falling under Humanities including languages, Social Sciences and some science subjects. Simultaneously, the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) conducted the Joint CSIR-UGC Test for JRF and Eligibility for Lectureship on 31st December, 1989 for disciplines falling under the basic sciences. Since then, UGC-NET and Joint CSIR-UGC test have mostly been conducted twice every year, generally in the months of June and December.

The University Grants Commission conducted the UGC-NET by itself till June 2014. Thereafter, the conduct of UGC-NET was outsourced to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) from December 2014 to July 2018. Subsequently, the conduct of UGC-NET has been entrusted to the National Testing Agency (NTA) constituted by the Government of India. Consequently, UGC-NET held from December 2018 onwards is being conducted by NTA.

The Joint CSIR-UGC Test is being conducted under the aegis of CSIR in the five core science subjects, viz., Chemical Sciences; Earth, Atmospheric, Ocean and Planetary Sciences; Life Sciences; Mathematical Sciences and Physical Sciences in the months of June and December.

The candidates who desire to pursue research and avail fellowship from UGC can opt to appear for a Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) either under the UGC-NET and under the Joint CSIR-UGC Test. The candidates with higher merit who qualify for JRF can pursue research in the UGC-recognized universities and institutions. They are also eligible to be considered for the post of Assistant Professor in universities and colleges throughout the country. Over 3200 JRFs are awarded by UGC under each UGC-NET and 1500 JRFs (including 300 fellowships of Basic Science Research Bureau of UGC) are awarded through each Joint CSIR-UGC Test. Fellowship is available for a maximum period of five years.

5.8(i) Performance in UGC-NET

A brief overview of candidates who registered, appeared and qualified for Eligibility for Assistant Professor and Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) in UGC-NET is presented in Table 5.8(i).

5.8(i)(a) Concession/Relaxation for the Under-Privileged Categories

In conformity with the policy of the Government of India, the University Grants Commission had been taking a slew of measures for ameliorating the lot of underprivileged sections of the society. A Considerable number of concessions and relaxations were being provided to them. Now that UGC-NET has been outsourced to the National Testing Agency, it is also continuing to extend full support to the underprivileged sections in the following ways:

(i) In Fee: While the fee for candidates belonging to the General category is ₹ 1150/-, it is only ₹ 600/- for OBC candidates, as per the Central Government list, who are not covered under the creamy layer and for the candidates belonging to the EWS category. The candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, trans genders and persons with disabilities (PWD) are required to pay a nominal fee of ₹ 325/- only.

- (ii) In Age for JRF: The upper age limit for the General category to appear in JRF is 30 years. A relaxation of up to 5 years is provided to the candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC (Noncreamy layer)/PWD/transgender categories and to women applicants.
- ➤ In Eligibility Conditions for NET:

1.	General Candidates (Including EWS category)	55% mark in Master's Degree (without rounding off)
2.	OBC (Non-Creamy Layer)/PWD /SC/ST/ Transgender Candidates	50% mark in master's degree (without rounding off)

In Qualifying Criteria for UGC-NET: The candidates are required to obtain the following minimum marks in aggregate of Paper-I and Paper-II to be considered for final preparation of result as presented in Table below:

As is apparent, the minimum required marks for OBC, SC, ST and PWD categories in NET are lower than that for the General category. Moreover, the reservation policy of Government of India is being employed in the UGC-NET to allocate the slots for JRF as well as for Eligibility for Assistant Professor. The subject-wise cut-off for transgenders are the lowest among those for SC/ST/ PwD/ OBC-NCL categories in the corresponding subject.

5.8(i)(b) Provision for Personnel from the Armed Forces

To apply for Junior Research Fellowship (JRF), a relaxation of up to 5 years is provided to the candidates who have served in the armed forces, subject to the length of service in the armed forces till first day of the month of concerned UGC-NET.

5.8(ii) Joint CSIR-UGC Test

The Joint CSIR-UGC Test is conducted under the aegis of CSIR, normally twice every year in the months of June and December. Among the candidates declared qualified for 'Both JRF and Eligibility for Lectureship/Assistant Professor' by the Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR), 1500

JRFs are awarded under the UGC scheme. CSIR declares a certain number of candidates qualified for Eligibility for Lectureship/Assistant Professor only on behalf of UGC.

Table 5.8(ii) (a) depicts the core science subjects in which the Joint CSIR-UGC Test is conducted by CSIR and Table 5.8(ii)(b) displays the number of candidates qualified for JRF and Eligibility for Lectureship through the Joint CSIR-UGC Test.

5.8(iii) Demand for UGC-NET Qualified Candidates for Employment in the Public Sector

The UGC-NET has come to be recognized as an authentic source of talent pool in the last few years, being viewed with prestige among public sector undertakings of the Government of India. The University Grants Commission has been formally approached by several premier government bodies for permission to utilize the UGC-NET scores of candidates in various disciplines for recruiting its officers. Even in the year 2021-22, a request was received from Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL) to be allowed to use NET scores in their recruitment process for administrative, managerial, legal and financial posts. In all, the following public sector undertakings have approached UGC to be allowed to utilize UGC scores in their recruitment process. They are:

- Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL)
- Oil and Natural Gas Commission (ONGC)
- Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL)
- Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPL)
- THDC India Limited
- Power Grid Corporation of India Limited (PGCL)

- Rashtriya Chemicals & Fertilizers Limited (RCFL)
- Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL)
- Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited (BHEL)
- Rashtriya Ispat Nigam Limited (RINL)
- Power System Operation Corporation Limited (POSOCO)
- National Hydroelectric Power Corporation Limited (NHPC)
- NMDC Limited, Hyderabad
- Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL)
- Northeastern Electric Power Corporation Limited (NEEPCO)
- Damodar Valley Corporation (DVC), Kolkata

The University Grants Commission has already conveyed its willingness to share its data in this regard and it is also providing inputs to the public sector undertakings on requests received from time to time.

5.8(iv) State Eligibility Test (SET)

In accordance with the mandate of the Government of India through its notification dated 22.07.1988, UGC, on request of State Governments, decided to have State Level Eligibility Test (SLET), now known as State Eligibility Test (SET) duly accredited by UGC for a fixed term. The pattern of SET is same as that of UGC-NET.

However, the University Grants Commission (UGC), in its 561st meeting held on 22.09.2022 has decided to permit the State Nodal Agencies identified by the respective State Governments to conduct State Eligibility Test (SET) without requiring accreditation from UGC.

However, while conducting the SET, the Nodal SET Agencies will be bound to adhere to the qualifying criteria and the procedure of declaring the result of SET strictly on the pattern of UGC-NET. Moreover, nomenclature and the syllabi of SET subjects will be same as those of UGC-NET / Joint CSIR-UGC Test. Also, the structure of question papers shall be as prescribed for UGC-NET / Joint CSIR-UGC Test.

Summary

- National Eligibility Test (UGC-NET) is conducted to determine the eligibility of Assistant Professor and Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) in order to ensure minimum standards for the entrants in the teaching profession and research in several subjects of Humanities (including Indian and some foreign languages), Yoga, Social Sciences, Computer Science and Applications, Electronic Science, Forensic Science and Environmental Sciences. The test is conducted twice every year, generally in the month of June and December in 83 subjects. In UGC-NET of December 2022, in all, 5,46,679 candidates appeared, out of which 43,917 (8.03%) qualified.
- The slots of December 2021 were merged with the June 2022 Joint CSIR-UGC Test.
- The University Grants Commission (UGC), in its 561st meeting held on 22.09.2022, has decided to permit the State Nodal Agencies identified by the respective State Governments to conduct State Eligibility Test (SET) without requiring accreditation from UGC.

5.9 Travel Grant

Travel Grant Scheme is for providing financial assistance to permanent teachers and librarians of colleges and Vice-Chancellors of State Universities, deemed to be Universities and Central Universities, recognized under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act. The objective of the scheme is to encourage college teachers to present research papers at international conferences conducted by foreign educational

institutions abroad and to study the working mechanism of Higher Education in those countries. In addition, this facility is available to the permanent teachers of Institutions of National Importance with a cap of 10% of the total approved cases in a year. The Commission members and UGC Officers at the level of Education Officer/Under Secretary and above are also eligible to apply under this scheme. The maximum age limit for College Teachers/College Librarians/UGC Officers is up to the age of superannuation and for Vice-Chancellors and Commission Members they should be in position.

The permanent teachers and librarians of the colleges enlisted under Section 2 (f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956, are being provided with 100% grants for travel, registration fees, per diem allowance, visa fees, etc., in a period of Three years. Whereas, Vice-Chancellors of State Universities, deemed to be Universities and Central Universities recognized under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956 Commission Members, UGC Officers and SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) college teachers will be provided financial assistance on 100% basis once in a period of two years. Applications for assistance under the UGC Travel Grant Scheme are to be submitted two months prior to the commencement of the Conference, along with a research paper to be presented and an acceptance letter from the organizers of the conference.

Proposals received under the said scheme are evaluated by the Expert Committee constituted by the Hon'ble Chairman, UGC and the recommendations given by the subject Experts are being considered by the Commission.

5.10 Inter University Centers (IUCs)

The University Grants Commission has established various Inter University Centres (IUCs) since 1984 under section 12(ccc) of the UGC Act, 1956. The Inter-University Centers are Autonomous bodies within the University system with a view to providing centrally state-of-the-art equipment and facilities, which are not generally available at many Universities due to cost factors, for the benefit of researchers working in different Universities. UGC has established 9 Centers so far, mainly in the fields of Science, Technology and education. The Inter-University Accelerator Centre (IUAC), New Delhi (formerly Nuclear Science Centre), was the first among such centres established in 1984 in New Delhi. The main objectives to establish these Inter University Centers were/are: -

- To provide common & advanced centralized facilities/services for universities that may not invest the larger shares of their receipts in infrastructure and other inputs,
- To play a vital role in offering the best practices & expertise in each field of Higher Education to teachers and researchers across the country,
- To provide access for the research community and teaching faculty to state-of-the-art equipment and excellent library facilities that are comparable to international standards.

The UGC has remained instrumental for a long in producing more than a Thousand educational films and programs through various Educational Multimedia Centers established in selected Universities in the country under the guidance and coordination of the Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC), New Delhi. The first countrywide classroom (CWCR) programmer was telecasted on the National Network on 15th August 1984.



Graph 5.10(b) The grant released to the IUCs/EMMRCs/NFCs for the financial year 2022-23 (₹ in Lakh)




Highlights of Various Inter-University Centers

5.10(b)(i) Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC), NEW DELHI

Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC) is an Inter-University Centre (IUC) on electronic media established by the University Grants Commission (UGC) on 26th May, 1993 under section 12(ccc) of UGC Act, 1956. It is mandated to address the Higher Education needs by developing educational multimedia content and its dissemination through various modes such as TV, Radio, CEC Gurukul, web portals and through offline mode. It has 21 Educational Media Research Centers (EMRCs) as Consortium Members located across India with state-of-art equipment and technical manpower to produce quality digital educational content.

Major focus areas of CEC fall under Three main domains: -

- A. Production
- B. Dissemination
- C. ICT Environment Building

Focus Areas:

Library: Storage and Upkeep of the Educational Content,

Production: Gurukul live transmission, uploading content on CEC You tube Channel,

Preview: Content validation of Educational Programs.

Educational Videos:

CEC and its media centers are engaged in the production of two types of educational video programmes: Curriculum based and Enrichment based (for supplementary learning). These programs cover different subjects across 4-streams:

- 1. Language/Literature/Art and Culture,
- 2. Social Sciences,
- 3. Management and other Professional Subjects,
- 4. Natural and Applied Sciences.

CEC has a knowledge repository of 43663 educational video programmes on different topics and subjects available in English and Hindi. A further 1827 Video Programmes on various subjects and topics were added this year as received from CEC's media centers. The entire collection of video programmes is being digitized to render them more user friendly and digitally compatible ensemble for a long shelf life and enhanced portability.

Preview of the Video Programmes:

The educational programs produced by CEC and its Media Centres undergo a preview process to ensure the quality and to authenticate the content. The preview process is basically an overall process of analyzing the content at macro and micro levels which includes analysis of conceptual clarity and authentication of the content and overall structure of the programmes and analysis of technical adequacy with respect to video and audio quality. The preview committee evaluates the educational programmes and recommends whether the programmes can be accepted or they should be revised. In some cases, the programmes are rejected for not meeting standards. The errors in presentation, caption/graphics, of the programmes produced are noted and rectified prior to releasing them in the public domain.

Programs Developed Under Gap Areas for MOOCs under Gurukul Live Transmission: -

The Gurukul Transmission was revived in January 2019 with the philosophy to provide live feed to Vyas Higher Education Channel and to repurpose live programs for further use to disseminate through Swayam Prabha DTH Channels. It was further agreed upon to develop series on gap areas identified by the academic committees. Accordingly, software unit has developed Six courses (video quadrant) in the subject given below:

The lectures are based on emerging knowledge fields, fundamentals of the subjects and career orientation. Learners from different parts of the country can ask questions and give feedback through e-mail and toll-free number provided during the lectures.

5.10(b)(ii) National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bengaluru

As an outcome of the National Policy on Education (NPE), 1986 and Programme of Action (POA), 1992 the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) was established on 16th September 1994 under Section 12-ccc of the UGC Act of 1956 and its headquarters at Bengaluru.

The NAAC functions through its General Council (GC) and Executive Committee (EC), where educational administrators, policymakers, and senior academicians of a cross-section of the system of Higher Education are represented. The Chairperson of the UGC is the President of the GC of NAAC

and The Chairperson of the EC is an eminent academician nominated by the President of GC. The Director is the academic and executive head of NAAC and is also the member-Secretary of both the GC and the EC. The NAAC has core staff, supplemented by consultants, to undertake its various functions.

The philosophy of NAAC is ameliorative and enabling rather than punitive or judgmental so that all constituencies of institutions of higher learning are empowered to maximize their resources, opportunities and capabilities.

(i) Vision

To make quality the defining element of Higher Education in India through a combination of self and external quality evaluation, promotion and sustenance initiatives.

(ii) Mission

- ✓ To arrange for periodic assessment and accreditation of institutions of Higher Education or units thereof, or specific academic programmes or projects,
- ✓ To stimulate the academic environment for promotion of quality of teaching-learning and research in Higher Education institutions,
- ✓ To encourage self-evaluation, accountability, autonomy and innovations in higher education,
- ✓ To undertake quality-related research studies, consultancy and training programmes and
- ✓ To collaborate with other stakeholders of Higher Education for quality evaluation, promotion and sustenance.

(iii) Value Framework

To promote the following core values among the HEIs of the country:

- Contributing to National Development.
- Fostering Global Competencies among Students.
- Inculcating a Value System among Students.
- Promoting the Use of Technology.
- Ouest for Excellence.

(iv) Focus Area and Objectives:

The prime agenda of NAAC is to assess and accredit institutions of higher learning, universities and colleges or one or more of their units, i.e., departments, schools, institutions, programmes, etc.

(v) The main objectives of assessment and accreditation are to:

- a) Grade institutions of Higher Education and their programmes,
- b) Stimulate the academic environment and quality of teaching and research in these institutions,
- c) Help institutions realise their academic objectives,
- d) Promote necessary changes, innovations and reforms in all aspects of the institutions working for the above purpose,
- e) Encourage innovations, self-evaluation and accountability in higher education.

(vi) In order to meet its mandate NAAC has been taking the following steps:

a) Review periodically and revise and update as and when considered necessary in the light of experience gained the techniques and modalities of assessment,

- b) Communicate the results of assessment and grading to the concerned institution in a form and manner appropriate for corrective action, rectification and self-improvement,
- c) Help and encourage the institutions to develop their own procedures, techniques and modalities for self-evaluation,
- d) Initiate research studies in the planning and evaluation of educational institutions, programmes, etc,
- e) Ensure an optimized use of resources and the achievement of the identified goals of institutions of higher learning,
- f) NAAC may collaborate with institutions, Indian and foreign, engaged in work of a similar nature and may be also undertake on request assessment and accreditation of institutions of higher education, abroad.

(Viii) New developments:

a) A new website of NAAC was released for the convenience of the stakeholders that was designed by KELTRON and hosted in the NIC server. The web-based portals facilitate HEIs to submit online applications for IIQA and online SSR through the HEI Portal link available on the website as per the new methodology.

b) MoE Dashboard

To synchronize and share the day-to-day progress of work with MoE, a dashboard was designed and shared with MoE. This dashboard is the dynamic dashboard and represents the concurrent work status of different activities like IIQA, SSR, DVV, Peer Team Visits and Results. The dashboard covers end-to-end work status with NAAC for Assessment and Accreditation.

c) Streamlining DVV

Data Validation and Verification are at the heart of RAF and is the crucial component in determining the quality of the institution. The process of DVV is well streamlined and stabilised. The Standard Operating Procedures are finalized and hosted on the website to bridge the gap between the understanding of the metrics and the sharing of the documents. Through this, it is being ensured that the DVV partners who verify the institution's data and the institution that provides the data are in the same page of understanding with the metrics that NAAC has provided.

d) Mechanism to Deal with Appeals

The modalities to process appeals were finalized and implemented. Appeals also are being made ICT enabled from end-to-end. Any aggrieved institution has been enabled to appeal within the stipulated time. The Appeal Committee can suggest a course of action and the same can be implemented online. The end results of the appeal are also communicated to the institution online. More than 400 appeals have been processed online.

e) NAAC Video Tutorials

Hand holding of the HEIs to the digital RAF was a great challenge. Digital literacy with the HEIs in remote landscapes was an issue of concern to NAAC. To overcome the same, video tutorials were prepared to guide the institutions step-by-step in the process of assessment and accreditation and the know-how of the portals were also provided in the same. These videos were produced in-house by the academic staff. This has proved to be the sigh of relief for the institutions and guides them end-to-end giving them the glimpses of the portal and frequently asked questions are addressed here. These videos are elaborate and are hosted on the NAAC website for the institution's download and use.

f) Infrastructure Development and Modernization of Infrastructure

- Design, Supply, Installation and commissioning of Solar Hot Water system 5KW Heat pump with 500 litres pressurized solar water heater and 11.5KW Heat pump with 1000 litres pressurized solar water heater. Replacing existing light fixtures with LED lighting and LED strip lighting in the NAAC Campus. LED strip lighting work was done at the office entrance garden area to increase the beauty of the campus.
- Construction of Compound wall at newly allotted 5 Acres land from Bengaluru University.
- Construction of Bio-Diversity Park: In Biodiversity Park, pond constructed to store the rainwater and runoff water from the ground. It is the 1st part of the biodiversity park. Further, we are planning for a pedestrian path, chain link fencing, streetlight & sitting area around the park.
- Construction of ICT block at Additional five acres of land: The work consists of the Construction of a single-floor building, parking area, surface roads including drains, rainwater harvesting pits, electrification works, etc. Now, the agency has cast the Roof slab and Solid block masonry work is in progress.
- Additional Building Certification for NAAC:
 The NAAC got a Platinum Rating from IGBC to the administrative building on 19th August 2022.

(ix) Implementation of Budget Announcement/Cabinet decisions:

As approved by the Hon'ble Cabinet of India on 29th July 2020, the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP-2020), all the NAAC manuals have incorporated information related to NEP readiness for colleges and universities in India.

In addition, the readiness of the Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) has also been incorporated in the manuals, as requested by the Election Commission of India (ECI).

5.10 (b)(iii) Inter University Accelerator Centre (IUAC), NEW DELHI

The objective of Inter-University Accelerator Centre (IUAC) is to provide front ranking, accelerator-based research facilities to create possibilities for internationally competitive research within the university system using resources optimally. The Centre's accelerator systems and experimental facilities are hectically used by several universities for research in the areas of Nuclear Physics, Materials Science, Atomic Physics, Radiation Biology, Radiation Physics and Accelerator Mass Spectrometry leading to high impact journal publications and Ph.D. thesis.

New Developments

Commission in grand testing of an intense THz radiation and electron beam facility at the Compact THz-Free Electron Laser facility – an upcoming accelerator facility of IUAC

• The Compact THz-Free Electron Laser facility – an upcoming accelerator facility of IUAC

Major events: The electron beam of energy ~ 1.3 MeV (estimated) was demonstrated from the copper photocathode. This is the first time when Photo-electron beam was produced at IUAC.

New Developments:

- 1. Installation of the High-power RF systems along with the high-power circulator was completed,
- 2. The magnetic field measurement of the Undulator magnet was successfully performed,
- 3. Beamline up to the end of the first bending magnet after the undulator was commissioned.

National Geochronology Facility:

The objective of the project is to develop a comprehensive Geochronology facility at IUAC that will permit measurement of quality isotopic data for Geo-chronological purposes including relevant characterization at the highest international level. The dedicated geochronology facility at IUAC will enable researchers from Indian Universities and research institutes to study different aspects related to Earth Sciences.

1.7: MV (5SDH-2) Pellet on Accelerator based Ion Beam Analysis Facility:

The 1.7 MV Pellet on accelerator for Rutherford Backscattering Spectrometry (RBS), Channeling, RBS resonance, Elastic Recoil Detection Analysis (ERDA) measurements is in continuous operation. In the year 2022, a total of 816 IBA measurements were performed till December, 2022, 35 users from 20 Universities, Colleges and Institutes were associated. Around 15 publications including conference proceedings resulted using the above facility.

5.10(b)(v) Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre, Gandhinagar

The Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre was established as a project of IUCAA on 27th February 1991 and was recognized as an independent, Autonomous Inter-University Centre (IUC) of the University Grants Commission (UGC) in May 1996 located at Infocity, Gandhinagar. Major activities and services of the Centre are geared towards the modernization of academic libraries and information centres, to promote information transfer and access, to support scholarship, learning and academic pursuits. The Centre acts as a nodal agency for networking of libraries and information centres in universities, institutions of higher learning and R&D institutions in India.

The General Council (GC) is an apex body of the Centre chaired by its President, ex-officio Chairman of the UGC. Governing Board (GB) manages ad Minister's, directs and controls the affairs of the Centre as per Rules and Byelaws of the Centre. The Finance Committee makes recommendations to the Governing Board on i) Budget proposals of the Centre; ii) Scrutiny of the Audited Accounts and replies to the annual Audited Report; iii) Approval of sanctioned and additional positions; and iv) any other matter on which the Board seeks its recommendations. For achieving its defined objectives, the Centre employs administrative, scientific & technical personnel, the scientific and technical personnel are mostly qualified in library and information science, and computer science. As on 31st December 2022, there are 30 numbers of scientific & technical, and 16 numbers of administrative and supporting staff working in the Centre headed by a director. All the scientific and technical manpower available in the Centre is clustered into the various working groups based on functional requirements of the Centre. Major scientific and technical activities/initiatives undertaken by these functional groups at the Centre during the period under report are briefly presented.

• Major Initiatives

Technology is a driving force in the contemporary education system. The Centre has taken up several initiatives based on its mission and objectives for the benefit of the academic and research community across India. All the major scientific & technical initiatives undertaken by the Centre can be broadly grouped into several categories as follows:

- Automation of University Libraries

The Centre proactively helps universities to automate their libraries by various means. The INFLIBNET Centre signed MoUs with 166 universities for library automation, which provides for universities to contribute their bibliographic records of documents available in their libraries to the IndCat: Union Catalogue of the INFLIBNET Centre.

- IndCat: Union Catalogue of Indian Universities

IndCat consists of a union catalogue of Books, Serials and Ph.D theses available in university libraries. It contains bibliographic records of 2,06,68,310 books from 223 university libraries, 36,912 unique journals having holding information for 238 universities and 4,43,869 bibliographic records of theses from 455 universities. OCS: Online Copy-Catalogue System contains 31559 records from 47 Universities.

i) GujCat (Online Union Catalogue of Gujarat Colleges): GujCat (Online Union Catalogue of Gujarat Colleges) developed by the INFLIBNET Centre was launched online by the Director of Higher Education - Govt. of Gujarat, Shri Nagarajan on 22nd September 2021. It contains bibliographic records of 7,10,556 from 39 Colleges of Gujarat.

• Software Development: SOUL 2.0 & 3.0 (Integrated Library Automation Software)

INFLIBNET Centre contributes towards the automation of libraries through in-house developed SOUL (Software for University Libraries) software. SOUL has a total of 4995 installations across the country. INFLIBNET Centre developed the new version of SOUL that is SOUL 3.0 which was launched online by Prof. D.P. Singh, Hon'ble Chairman, University Grants Commission, New Delhi and Hon'ble Chairman, Governing Council, INFLIBNET Centre on 24th February 2021. During the reported period, 843 SOUL installations have been done for institutions in the country.

• Open Access, Open Data Initiatives, and Plagiarism Detection Software (PDS)

- i. Shodhganga (A Reservoir of Indian Theses & Dissertations): The Centre has developed and maintains a full-text thesis repository called Shodhganga- a reservoir of Indian Theses. Currently, more than 4.10 lakh full-text theses are hosted which are contributed by 627 institutes and 758 MoUs Signed till 31st December 2022. During the year in 2022, 115 (71 Universities+44 INI/CFTIs) signed MoUs and 77,358 theses uploaded into Shodhganga.
- ii. Shodhgangotri (Repository of Indian Research in Progress): Shodhgangotri is a repository of research in progress that hosts a total of 9,774 Synopses /Major-Minor Research Projects (MRP)/ Post-Doctoral Fellowship (PDF)/Emeritus Fellowship contributed by 115 Institutes.
- iii. ShodhShuddhi Plagiarism Detection Software (PDS): The Ministry of Education, Govt. of India initiated to provide Plagiarism Detection Software (PDS) to all Indian Universities/ Institutions including Central Universities, State Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Private Universities, Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CFTIs), Institute of National Importance (INIs), Inter-University Centres of UGC (IUCs). The INFLIBNET Centre is the nodal agency to execute the project/initiative under the aegis of the Ministry of Education. A total number of 1086

- Universities were given access to anti-plagiarism software Ouriginal (Formerly Urkund). A total number of 1,36,356 users created and 27,59,934 documents scanned for plagiarism check under MoE scheme ShodhShuddhi since 2019 and 14,547 users added and 9,54,829 documents scanned in 2022.
- iv. ICSSR Data Service: Indian Social Science Data Repository: The project was assigned to the INFLIBNET Centre in 2015 by the ICSSR, hosts 147 datasets from MoSPI on the platform customized using NADA software. This has been quite popular in the research community and has over 53 lakhs+ resource downloads and there are a total number of 5,593 registrations. Further, the Centre has developed a data analytical tool called "ICSSR Data Analytic Tool" using "R" language that facilitates users to explore and visualize unit-level data available in datasets online.
- v. IR@INFLIBNET: The Centre has established an institutional repository called IR@INFLBNET using DSpace, open-source software accessible at http://ir.inflibnet.ac.in/. The papers published in the proceedings of the CALIBER and PLANNER are uploaded into the repository. The Repository also includes course materials, newspaper clippings, etc. The repository has 1904 full-text articles.
- vi. IR as a Service: The INFLIBNET Centre is assisting institutions of higher learning in the process of creation and maintenance of institutional repositories. The Centre is using self-developed expertise in open-source software like DSpace, Linux, Perl, Java, Apache Tomcat, PostgreSQL and MySQL etc. Under this initiative, the Centre has installed, configured, customized and hosted institutional repositories for various institutions.
- vii. INFOPORT (A Subject Gateway to Indian Scholarly Internet Resources): INFOPORT is designed to facilitate registering of an internet resource into the portal and extending its access to users. INFOPORT supports browsing of internet resources by Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) Scheme. Several features and functionalities of the subject gateway were enhanced based on feedback from users and additional internet resources were added to the portal. The interface is populated with 1,742 e-resources.
- viii. National Research Data Repository (NRDR): The National Research Data Repository is envisaged to build up a Research Data Repository with the research datasets generated by the academic and research institutions from across India. The research data generated by the faculty and research scholars would be considered for depositing into the NRDR. The National Education Policy 2020 (Point No. 24.4(C) encourages online education and emphasizes the creation of digital repositories. The Centre has developed a pilot instance of NRDR and it will be made available to the academic community as soon as it is officially launched.
- ix. Shodh-Chakra: Shodh-Chakra is an initiative of the Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre under the guidance of the University Grants Commission (UGC) to help the academic community during their research life cycle. Shodh-Chakra provides a unique space to the researcher, guide/supervisor and university to manage the research lifecycle of a research scholar. This will work as a digital workspace wherein researchers can collect, store, organize and cite their research work. The Shodh-Chakra would help researchers to create their profiles and manage their preferences. The process of using the portal starts with signing a MoU between the University and INFLIBNET Centre. The university/institute must provide valid information of the researcher and supervisor. Further, researchers can login into the system and avail the features of Shodh-Chakra. The system will generate login credentials for researchers, supervisors and universities. During the period, a total number of 73 Universities have signed an MoU with the INFLIBNET Centre to use Shodh-Chakra. And 6 in general and seven specific training programmes were organised in different universities, and a total of 180 & 190 participants attended the training programmes respectively.

- Library Consortium and its By-products
- i. e-ShodhSindhu: Launched in 2015, e-ShodhSindhu provides access to more than 10,000 e-journals, 1,99,500+ eBooks and 6 lakhs+ e-books (through NDLI) to more than 390 institutions that include universities, centrally funded technical institutions. NLIST is a college component of e-ShodhSindhu that provides access to 6,500+ electronic journals, 1,99,500+ e-books and Six lakhs+ e-books (through NDLI) to more than 6.7 lakh users spanned across 3800+ colleges
- ii. InfiStats: InfiStats, a by-product of e-ShodhSindhu launched in 2015 facilitates monitoring and evaluation of usage statistics of subscribed e-resources made accessible to the member institutes under e-ShodhSindhu.
- iii. Indian Access Management Federation (INFED): Started in a full-fledged manner in 2017 by the INFLIBNET Centre INFED provides off-campus access to e-resources to users in institutes covered under e-Shodh Sindhu. Currently, more than 222 institutions have signed the membership to join INFED, and 166 institutions are actively using the services. Further, a total of 43 publishers have joined INFED.
- iv. J-Gate Plus: The J-Gate Plus@e-ShodhSindhu is a virtual library of journal literature created as a customized e-journal articles access gateway and database solution for member institutions of e-ShodhSindhu. It provides article-level access to e-journals subscribed under the Consortium as well as e-journals subscribed by 25 university libraries designated as ILL Centres of the INFLIBNET Centre.
- e-learning, Content Development and MOOCs
- i. E-PG-Pathshala: Initiated in 2012, the INFLIBNET Centre has completed the e-PG Pathshala, an MoE initiative under its National Mission on Education through ICT (NMEICT), executed by the UGC. Currently, the Centre is maintaining the portal. Further, the Centre is deriving e-books from the e-PG Pathshala content. 23000+ modules including 700+ PG courses.
- ii. Vidya-Mitra: The Vidya-Mitra Project was assigned to the INFLIBNET Centre in May 2014. It is an integrated e-content Portal for all the e-content projects developed under the NMEICT, MoE. Vidya-Mitra hosts 66,000+ Videos (Self-learning/e-Tutorial) and 44,000+ e-Texts. Though the project has been completed, INFLIBNET Centre is providing free hosting services for e-contents developed by faculty members/ academia across Indian institutions on a request basis.
- iii. SWAYAM: Massive Open Online Courses (for PG Courses): Launched on 9th July 2017, the INFLIBNET Centre is a nodal agency for coordinating MOOCs for PG courses. The Centre is executing this project with the guidance of UGC. The major role of INFLIBNET is fund disbursement (before the 2021 session) to all course coordinators the development of a web interface for course proposals and a dedicated portal for UGC-MOOCs. The portal provides a dashboard for SWAYAM coordinators and mentors, information on PG-courses updates and workshop details etc. During this reported year, an Expression of Interest (EoI) for content creation was added to the UGC-MOOCs portal.
- iv. SWAYAM-PRABHA: The SWAYAM PRABHA, an MoE project under NMEICT, is conceived as a group of 34 DTH educational channels devoted to telecasting high-quality educational programmes on a 24/7 basis. The INFLIBNET Centre has continued the task of development and maintenance of the SWAYAM PRABHA portal and its hosting including the archiving of videos for all the channels. There are 12 channels assigned to school education and the remaining channels are assigned to Higher Education (HE). Total subscribers are 87,630 and have 9,511,642 views (for HE Channels) in the said report period.

- v. INFLIBNET Learning Management Service (ILMS): INFLIBNET Learning Management Service (ILMS) is a service offered by the Information and Library Network Centre to institutions of Higher Education across the country. This service is being offered to all the Central, State and Deemed universities. Some of the core features are Course creation, enrollment, assignment and assessment, Discussion forum, etc. During this reporting period, the INFLIBNET Centre deployed its free ILMS service for 28 institutions in the country. Further, 1000+ courses were added to the repository.
- Ranking of Institutions and Accreditation work for NBA and NAAC
- i. India Rankings 2022 (NIRF): The INFLIBNET Centre has been executing the yearly exercise of NIRF since its inception under the guidance of the NBA. The Centre has developed several modules of NIRF, such as a data capturing system, feedback system, ranking module, along with research data incorporation. The Centre was responsible for the development of the NIRF Web Portal, including the data capturing system, perception capturing system, the feedback mechanism and the ranking platform. The Centre also provided and verified data on publications, citations, patents and highly cited papers. The first edition of India Rankings was launched in 2016 under the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF). The Centre has continued the project NIRF and executed its 7th exercise of "India Rankings 2022" under the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF)" during the reporting period. India Rankings 2022 was released by the Hon'ble Minister of Education, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan on 15th July 2022.
- **ii. e-NBA: Accreditation Workflow Management System (AWMS):** The project, called "Accreditation Workflow Management System (AWMS)" is related to the accreditation of the technical institution's programme. The Centre is involved in developing a full-fledged online platform of accreditation workflow management system for technical institutes based on requirements provided by the National Board of Accreditation since 2018.
- iii. Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements (ARIIA): ARIIA is an initiative of the Ministry of Education to systematically rank all major higher educational institutions and universities in India on indicators related to "Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development" among the students and faculties. The INFLIBNET Centre has successfully executed the 3rd year exercise of the Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements (ARIIA) framework, which was launched by Hon'ble Minister of State for Education, Dr Subhas Sarkar, on 29th December 2021 during the report period. The Centre is a technical partner of the ARIIA project and has signed a MoU with AICTE for the same.
- iv. NAAC: The INFLIBNET Centre has been assigned the job of providing publications, citations, H-index and other related bibliometric data to NAAC for institutions that are to be accredited by NAAC since November 2017.
- VIDWAN and Indian Research Information Management System (IRINS)
- i. VIDWAN: Project assigned to the INFLIBNET Centre in May 2014 by NMEICT. VIDWAN consists of detailed profiles of more than 1,55,828 faculty members and scientists working in 14,997 academic institutions till the reported period. The VIDWAN project retrieved 21.14 lakh of publication metadata from various sources. And during the report period 46,598 numbers of profiles were created/added in VIDWAN.
- ii. Indian Research Information Network System (IRINS): Project assigned to INFLIBNET Centre from the Ministry of Education under NMEICT Phase-II in 2018. IRINS is a Web-based Research Information Management (RIM) service provided to Higher Education Institutions

in India. IRINS facilitates the academic, R&D organisations and faculty members, scientists to collect, curate and showcase the scholarly communication activities and provide an opportunity to create the scholarly network. The INFLIBNET Centre has created a total number of 661 IRINS instances for Institutions till the reported period and connected 105,405 faculty members through this project. The project retrieved 17.13 lakh of publications metadata from various sources and received 179 lakhs of citations & received 56.09 lakh of Altmetrics mentions till the reported period. And during the period under the report, 283 numbers of instances were created, where 38,763 number of faculty members got connected and 4,83,707 number of publications metadata were retrieved.

• INFLIBNET's Website Development and Maintenance

The Centre maintains a comprehensive website of its own both in English and Hindi available at https://www.inflibnet.ac.in/. The Centre uses web technology to provide organized and structured access to its services and resources to the academic community through the Centre's Website as well as through websites of its all services and products. Web 2.0 features and functionalities including Wiki, Blog, Chat and Discussion Forum, RSS feed, etc. have been incorporated into the Website. Also, the Centre maintains an Intranet Portal for storing & easy access to various official documents like rules and regulations, office circulars & notices, committees' details, list of holidays & presentations etc. at one place and an IHRMS Module (INFLIBNET Human Resource Management System), a web-based interface which facilitates routine administrative activities.

- Web Application Projects funded by the Ministry of Education, Government of India

 The Centre developed several web portals for various activities/initiatives of the Ministry of Education,
 Government of India such as PMMMNMTT, EBSB, Fit India and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan.
- i. Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT): PMMMNMTT is a Scheme launched by the Ministry of Education, Government of India. The scheme aims to improve the quality of the school and Higher Education by comprehensively addressing all issues related to more than 1,00,000 college and University teachers, teaching, teacher preparation, professional development, Curriculum Design, Designing and Developing Assessment. INFLIBNET Centre is providing web and technical development support.
- ii. Ek Bharat Shreshta Bharat (EBSB): The Centre has developed a portal to host the details of events being organized by different states. Events include a cultural programme, academic programme etc. EBSB is designed to promote the spirit of national integration through a deep and structured engagement between all Indian States and Union Territories through a year-long planned engagement between States. HEIs, different ministries and other government agencies are providing the data in different activities.
- **iii. Fit India:** The Ministry of Education assigned the task to design, develop and maintain Fit-India portal to INFLIBNET Centre. The Centre has developed a dedicated platform for the same.
- iv. Unnat Bharat Abhiyan: The Centre has developed an online application for Institutes through which institutes can join UBA and can opt for the villages and benefits of schemes. In addition, the admin dashboard including score module was created by the Centre.

• e-Governance @ UGC

The INFLIBNET Centre maintains several Indian Institutes/Universities websites starting from their development, management and hosting as a part of the Institute's assigned project to the Centre.

- i. UGC Website: The UGC has assigned the responsibility for the development and maintenance of its website to the INFLIBNET Centre, which includes automation of its various schemes, Grant Management System and e-Scholarship-Fellowship Award Registration Tracking System (e-SARTS), etc.
- ii. Automation of UGC-Schemes: INFLIBNET Centre has developed more than 30 web services for UGC for its scholarship, fellowships, travel assistance, General Development Assistance, Women's Hostel, Autonomous and Heritage Institutions, Distance Education, etc.
- iii. Web Portal for Distance Education Bureau UGC: The INFLIBNET Centre has developed a web portal for the Distance Education Bureau University Grants Commission. The main aim of the portal is to automate all the UGC-DEB activities. The Centre has automated the UGC-DEB activities such as inviting proposals, online meetings and virtual visits etc.

Other Academic Projects

- i. Study in India: Study in India is a web portal designed for foreign students seeking to study in India. It provides all the information one needs on Indian Education Institutions in India, how to plan their studies, how and where to stay in India, what kind of events are planned application processes, etc. The core part of the portal is the institute login (where institutes can define their seats to the foreign students) and student login (where a registered student can participate in the choice filling, including mock counselling and final counselling). The Centre is successfully executing the yearly exercise of Study in India.
- ii. National Testing Agency (NTA): INFLIBNET Centre provides website development and technical support to NTA. The portal facilitates a platform that automates the complete administration and management process of "Exam Observer", "Training Practice Centre", etc.
- iii. National Portal for Transgender Persons (Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment): The Centre signed MoU with the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Department of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India to create National Portal for Transgender Persons which enables a transgender person to apply for a certificate and identity card digitally from anywhere in the country without having to visit any office. The "GarimaGreh" module along with scholarship/health schemes was added. A total number of 26 training programmes were organised during the period.
- iv. Web Portal for Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi: The INFLIBNET Centre has developed an activity portal for the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). The AIU portal provides value-added services to its members in terms of completely automating the equivalence of foreign degrees with Indian Universities. The Centre has developed several modules such as AIU Stakeholders Management, Identification of best Department/Faculty in each Member University to facilitate national and AIU collaboration portal, Equivalence of Foreign Degrees/ PGDM / Doctorate Degrees, International Students Portal and sport event etc.
- v. Technical Services to Indian Universities/Institutions- The INFLIBNET Centre is providing several technical services including website development, web applications (i.e., recruitment system, admission system, etc.) to the different Universities/Institutions. Some of the stakeholders are Central University of Gujarat, Gandhinagar; Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Punjab State Open University (JGNDPSOU), Patiala; Shri Aniruddhadeva Sports University, Dibrugarh; Children University, Gandhinagar; Sardar Patel University, Vallabh Vidyanagar, Inter-University Centre of Teacher Education, Varanasi; and Doon University, Dehradun.
- vi. ISBN: The Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education has approved a proposal for the development of a new website for allotment of ISBN and its day-to-day maintenance to the

INFLIBNET Centre, Gandhinagar on 11th August 2022. The work of the same will be done in a phase-wise manner, i.e.,

- i) Retrieval of data of old portal and its restoration,
- ii) Development of new portal at applicant's end,
- iii) Development of new portal at Admin's end/Department's end and
- iv) Integration of old portal data into the new developed Portal. During the period, a total number of 11,156 new users were registered on the portal, 18,721 applications were received for the issue of ISBN numbers and 2,79,608 ISBN numbers were issued to Publishers, Authors, and Seminars against their titles.

Human Resource Development, Capacity Building Programmes & Consultancy

One of the important objectives of the Centre is to impart training in the use of ICT to library and information science professionals working in University and College libraries. Since its establishment, INFLIBNET Centre has been actively involved in various capacity building programmes, i.e., inhouse, and off-site workshops, conferences, seminars specialized training programs etc. During the period the Centre conducted 10 online/offline Training Programmes on Operations of Soul 3.0 and 9 offline specialized training programmes on various research related topics in which a total of 642 participants attended, 4 webinars (1184 participants), 26 training programmes on Transgender Persons 13 training programme on Shodh-Chakra (270 participants) respectively.

13th International CALIBER was organized by the INFLIBNET Centre in association with Banaras Hindu University (BHU) Varanasi at BHU on the theme "Envisioning Digital Transformation in Libraries for NextGen Academic Landscape" where a total number of 445 participants attended.

5.10 (b)(vi) UGC-DAE Consortium for Scientific Research (UGC-DAE CSR), INDORE

(I) About the Centre and Organisational Structure

UGC-DAE Consortium for Scientific Research, hereafter the Consortium, is an Autonomous research institute of UGC, India. The consortium has Three centres at Indore, Mumbai, Kolkata, and a node at IGCAR, Kalpakkam with a Head Office in Indore. The research program is run with the help of Scientists/Engineers (41 in number) technical staff (45 in number) and Ph.D. students. Each centre is headed by a Centre Director and the overall head of the Consortium is the Director.

(II) Focus area and objective

The Consortium has the mandate of making Three major "Big-Science" facilities of DAE available to the researchers in the University system. These Three facilities are the Dhruva Reactor at BARC, Mumbai, the Variable Energy Cyclotron at Kolkata, and the Indus Synchrotron Radiation Source at RRCAT, Indore. A Node at Kalpakkam has also been established in the recent past, where facilities in the field of Materials Science have been established with relevance to the IGCAR facilities. In addition to DAE facilities, the Consortium has also established sophisticated and advanced research facilities and has carved out a unique place in the country for providing Low Temperature and High Magnetic Field facilities to University researchers. The research activities of the consortium are focused on using radiation as a probe as well as a tool to investigate matter, both living and non-living in multiple thermodynamic parameters space.

(III) Major events/ New Developments

Access to the DAE mega facilities as well as the in-house facilities is provided through long-term

(~3years) Collaborative Research Schemes (CRS) mostly with project staff assistance. In addition to it access to in-house facilities is available for short-term experiments also. Both activities are managed through a recently developed CSR user portal (www.csruserportal.com).

The User Portal (www.csruserportal.com) developed and managed by the Consortium Staff is now fully operational. About 5000 researchers have registered on the portal by the end of 2022. Using a single account on the portal, researchers can now manage their proposals data and visits.

The Consortium in collaboration with DAE institutes and universities conducted awareness workshops and meetings to emphasize the capabilities of the facilities available to university researchers. A series of 6 online workshops were conducted in September 2022 before inviting fresh CRS proposals. Previous workshops conducted in the year 2021, had resulted in a large number (~600) of CRS proposals. After a review of proposals by the Users' committees of respective Centers about 300 proposals in 2022.

By the end of 2022, 435 long-term CRS were active and about 1373 experiments were successfully conducted for researchers from all over India. There were about 400 publications in peer-reviewed International journals of repute emanating from the CRS as well as in-house research. Our faculty and students also received several national awards for their work e.g., MRSI medal, best thesis award and young scientist award, etc.

A new beam line proposed by the Indore Centre in the energy range 1500 eV to 9000 eV at INDUS-II, RRCAT, and Indore is under consideration for funding.

5.10(b)(vii) Inter-University Centre for Teacher Education, Banaras Hindu University (IUC-TE., BHU), Varanasi

The Inter-University Centre for Teacher Education (IUCTE) was established by the University Grant Commission (UGC) under Section 12(ccc) of its act (No. 3 of 1956) and Regulations (establishment and maintenance of Institutions) 1985. The Foundation of the Inter-University Centre for Teacher Education (IUCTE) was laid by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri. Narendra Modi Ji on 25th December, 2014 at the BHU, Varanasi.

While laying the foundation of the Inter-University Centre for Teacher Education, the Prime Minister emphasized in his address that India as a country with the highest youth population should dream of developing "Quality Teachers" as there lies a huge demand of good teachers across the globe. He clearly proclaimed that "ACHCHHI SHIKSHA-ACHCHHE SHIKSHAK". Hence the IUCTE adopting it as its Motto and commits itself to evolve as knowledge Centre where not only policy framework relating to different aspects of preparation, induction and continuous professional uplifting of University and College teachers but also latest techno-pedagogical interventions for teachers are evolved and disseminated to help them become world-class teachers.

Goals for Key Areas: -

1. National Professional Standards for Teachers in HEIs:

"Teachers truly shape the future of our children - and therefore, the future of our nation. It is because of this noblest role that the teacher in India was the most respected member of society. Only the very best and most learned became teachers. The quality of teacher education, recruitment, deployment, service conditions, and empowerment of teachers is not where it should be, and consequently the quality and motivation of teachers does not reach the desired standards. The high respect for teachers and the high status of the teaching profession must be restored to inspire the best to enter the teaching profession" (para 5.1, NEP-2020).

The National Education Policy (2020) has given two significant recommendations for the quality assurance of teachers and teaching-learning process: i) the provision of mandatory 50 hours of Continuous Professional Development (CPD) for every teacher (para 5.15, NEP-2020); and ii) development of a common set of National Professional Standard for Teachers (NPST) by 2022 (para 5.20, NEP-2020). The need for these provisions was being urgently felt as a large number of countries around the world that have excelled in the field of education have ensured that their teachers are continuously updated and possess the necessary knowledge, skills, values and pedagogical competence to shape the future of their young generation. Across the world different countries have established that competent people enter the teaching profession. Similarly, they have also created congenial working conditions, opportunities of academic growth and training programmes for their teachers at regular intervals.

The vision and ideas of NEP-2020 may percolate in this NPST and pave new wave for Higher Education System. The spirit of the NEP-2020 must be retained in the NPST. Although NCTE has prepared a preliminary draft NPST for school education but for Higher Education Faculty there are no professional standards till date. Therefore, it is a new challenge and IUCTE intends to embark upon such an initiative which is aligned with the Vision of IUCTE (short term goals-point no. 14-17, page no. 16 and long-term goals-point no. 7-9, 16 & 17).

2. National Curriculum Framework for Quality Teachers and Teaching:

In NEP-2020, the central role of the teachers in developing the Nation into a global knowledge superpower has been emphasized multiple times. Hon'ble President, Hon'ble PM, Hon'ble MoE, Hon'ble UGC Chairman, Hon'ble Members of NEP-2020 Committee and other stakeholders have repeatedly emphasized the need for capacity building of teachers and improving the quality of teacher education across the spectrum from school education to higher education. For instance, for revamping the preparation of school teachers, the National Curriculum Framework for Teacher Education 2021 is proposed to be developed by NCTE in consultation with NCERT (para 5.28, NEP-2020). In the context of Higher Education, such a quality curriculum framework seems to be missing.

Although, at present there is no system/concept of pre-service teacher preparation for Higher Education, yet in-service continuing education/professional development is of University and College teachers has been a priority since 1950 and is also strongly advocated by the NEP-2020. In fact, this is also one of the prime objectives of the IUCTE. Hence, development of a "National Curriculum Framework for Quality Teachers and Teaching in Higher Education" and implementing it for the in-service continuing professional uplifting of teachers in Higher Education is another important thrust area (short term goalspoint no. 6, page no. 15 and long-term goalspoint no.16, 21 and page no. 17). IUCTE is prepared to take a leadership role in such initiatives and work closely with other stakeholders in the design and implementation aspects.

3. Ancient Indian Knowledge systems:

NEP-2020 has a sharp focus on Indian Knowledge Systems, Languages, Culture and Values. Higher education plays an extremely important role in promoting human as well as societal wellbeing. It must enable the individual to develop social and moral awareness, character, ethical, constitutional and universal human values of truth (Satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love (prem), nonviolence (ahimsa), intellectual curiosity, scientific temper, creativity, life skills, lessons in seva/ service and participation in communities (para 11.8, NEP-2020). Quality Higher Education therefore contributes to develop the cooperative communities, happier, cohesive, cultured, productive, innovative, progressive and prosperous Nation. A holistic education would aim to develop all capacities of human beings - intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and moral in an integrated manner.

IUCTE is committed in this direction and has set this mandate in its vision document (core values, short term goals-point 1, page no. 15): In order to implement this the IUCTE proposes: (a) Development of modules to train Teachers to enable them to promote Indian traditional knowledge and moral values in the formal Higher Educational curriculum; and (b) Initiation of research projects to explore the traditions of holistic and multidisciplinary learning from our Ancient Indian Knowledge Systems and Gyan–Parampara for development of the said training modules.

4. Continuous Professional Development and Internationalisation:

NEP-2020 emphasizes on Continuous professional development of teachers in HEIs. It is proposed that in-service continuous professional development for College and University teachers will continue through the existing institutional arrangements and ongoing initiatives; these will be strengthened and expanded to meet the needs of enriched teaching-learning processes for quality education (para 15.10, NEP-2020). Each teacher may be expected to participate in, say, 50 hours of CPD opportunities every year for their own professional development (para 5.15, NEP-2020).

In the light of above, IUCTE may design programmes/courses for continuous professional development for Teachers and Teacher Educators with appropriate inputs to energize the faculty, motivate and inspire them to be the best, motivated and capable faculty in HEIs (short term goals-point 14, page no. 16 and long-term goals - point no. 7, 9, page no. 17).NEP-2020 also advocates internationalisation of education. As part of its mandate and in sync with its Vision Document, IUCTE may establish MoU's and partnerships with globally recognized world bodies deeply involved in improving the quality of education such as UNESCO, UNICEF and World Bank etc. (short term goals-point 11, page no. 15 and long-term goals - point no.14, page no. 17). Additionally, IUCTE's collaborations may be strengthened with top ranked Universities/ Institutions in the field of Teacher Education nationally and globally.

5. Strengthening Faculty at the Entry Level:

NEP-2020 recommends that all fresh Ph.D entrants, irrespective of discipline, will be required to take credit-based courses in teaching/education/pedagogy/writing related to their chosen Ph.D subject during their doctoral training period. Exposure to pedagogical practices, designing curriculum, credible evaluation systems, and communication skills will be soon ensured since many research scholars will go onto become faculty or public representatives/communicators of their chosen disciplines. Ph.D students will also have a minimum number of hours of actual teaching experience gathered through teaching assistantships and other means. Ph.D programmes at universities around the country will be re-oriented for this purpose (para 15.9, NEP-2020).

One Major focus area may be in the form of relevant complementary and supplementary skill development initiatives in the Teacher Education space, there by enriching Teacher Education preparatory programs with multidisciplinary aspects.

IUCTE proposes to develop a training programme in Pedagogy in Teaching at the Entry Level for young faculty members for a period of Three months initially including few other electives like "ICT integration in Higher Education" and "Cooperative and Collaborative Pedagogy for Higher Education" for improving the quality of teachers and teaching in HEIs. It will orient them on various generic aspects of teaching-learning, pedagogic techniques & teaching and learning methods, instructional methodologies, assessment and evaluation techniques, ICT enabled teaching learning, and equip them with knowledge of University rules and regulations, basics of governance and administration which is in sync with the Vision of IUCTE (short term goals-point 13, page no. 15 and long-term goals - point no. 7, page no. 17).

6. Technology in Education

A. Digital Content, Online Courses, Technology Platform, Digital Infrastructure and Capacity Building

NEP-2020 has proposed a dedicated unit for the purpose of orchestrating the building of digital infrastructure, digital content and capacity building within Ministry of Education, Government of India to investigate the E-education needs of both school and higher education. Further, a lot of emphasis has been placed regarding the use of technology platforms such as SWAYAM/DIKSHA for online training of teachers so that standardized training programmes can be administered to large numbers of teachers within a short span of time (para 23.6, NEP-2020). Another important role of online digital education is to strengthen the ODL mode of education that may contribute significantly in this aspect. "Teachers require suitable training and development to be effective online educators. It cannot be assumed that a good teacher in a traditional classroom will automatically be a good teacher in an online classroom. Further, unless online education is blended with experiential and activity-based learning, it will tend to become a screen-based education with limited focus on the social, affective and psychomotor dimensions of learning (para 24.3, NEP-2020)." The recommended measures such as online courses and digital repositories, funding for research, improved student services, credit-based recognition of MOOCs, etc., will be taken to ensure it is at par with the highest quality programmes.

In the light of above, IUCTE may develop model courses (short term goals-point 10, page no. 15 and long-term goals - point no. 13, page no. 17) for Teacher Education to strengthen online education and liaison with the dedicated unit in MoE, Government of India to provide support for capacity building of Teachers and Teacher Educators ensuring its accessibility to the diversity of learners.

B. National Educational Technology Forum (NETF)

The National Educational Technology Forum (NETF) will be created to provide a platform for the free exchange of ideas on the use of technology to enhance learning, assessment, planning, and administration. Appropriate integration of technology into all levels of education will be done to improve classroom processes, support teacher professional development, enhance educational access for disadvantaged groups and streamline educational planning, administration and management.

IUCTE as an Apex body for Teacher Education may serve its role by becoming a core and integral member of the National Educational Technology Forum (NETF), especially to support teacher professional development (in-service professional development) (short term goals-point 8 & 9, page no. 15 and long-term goals - point no. 10 & 12, page no. 17).

The above-mentioned programme on Technology in Education has been conceived in the light of recommendations of NEP-2020 and Vision Document of IUCTE. Such programmes can be undertaken once after the digital infrastructure of the center is established at the permanent campus.

5.10 (b)(viii) Inter-University Centre for Yogic Sciences (IUC-YS), BENGALURU

Inter University Centre for Yogic Sciences (IUCYS) was registered on 27th July, 2018 under Karnataka Government Society Act, 1960. As per records, the address of IUCYS is C/o. National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), PO Box No.1075, Nagar bhavi, Rajeshwari Nagar, Bangalore-560072. Memorandum of Association and Rules were framed. The basic objective of IUC-YS is to act as a Resource Centre for serving the interests of institutions, teachers and students engaged in the field of Yogic Sciences, both for those within and outside India.

Focus Area and Objectives:

I. To undertake research in the field of Yogic Sciences.

- II. To develop curriculum and textbooks for teaching of Yoga, and resource books for teachers.
- III. To provide training to teachers and students in various aspects of Yoga education, and conduct Continuous Professional Education programs for academic staff.
- IV. To conduct seminars and conferences in the field of Yoga Education.
- V. To act as a fulcrum for development and growth of Yoga in the country and guide other institutions.
- VI. To establish Regional Centers of IUC-YS as and when required.

Land-Related Issue:

The decision taken by the Government of Karnataka, vide Order No. ED/21/UBV/2020 dated 17th March, 2020, sanction was accorded under section 3(4) of the Karnataka Universities Act,2000 for transferring the extent of land measuring 15 acres within the precincts of the Bangalore University at Jnana Bharati Campus, Bangalore to Inter-university Centre for Yogic Sciences, (IUC-YS), Bengaluru.

The allotment of land to IUC-YS was challenged in the Honorable High Court of Karnataka by an Advocate on the ground that the allotted land falls under the Bio-Park having fully grown trees. The matter was pending for decision since 11/01/2021 and finally the writ petition No. 681/2021 was dismissed on 03/08/2022 citing no merits in the petition filed by the Petitioner.

However, there have been subsequent developments in the land issue as per the decision taken in the special meeting of Syndicate (Bangalore University) held on 09/12/2022 to withdraw land allotted to IUC-YS and cancel the lease deed along with the return of considerate money with admissible interest.

Webinars/ Workshops for Commemoration of International Yoga Day – 2022:

To Commemorate International Yoga Day on 21st June 2022 and as per the circular issued by the University Grants Commission to the Vice-Chancellors/Registrars of Central Universities, deemed to be Universities and State Universities on 8th April 2022 to organize Webinars/Workshop/ Training in their respective university/institution. Around 150 Universities/Institutes were contacted out of which Thirty-Seven (37) Universities/ Institutes responded to the request and organized programmes through online// Offline mode at the university level during April, May, June and July 2022. An amount of ₹ 34, 07,700/-sanctioned and 29 Universities submitted their Reports and Utilisation. An Amount of ₹ 29, 25,140/- was released. The remaining Eight Universities/Institutes are yet to submit their reports and UC's.

5.11(i) Crystal Growth Centre, Chennai

About the Centre:

Vision...

Anna University, Chennai, is striving to achieve a world class institution by producing professionals with high technical knowledge, professional skills and ethical values. The institution looks forward to be a preferred partner to the industry and community for contributing towards their economic and social

development by providing high quality manpower through equipping students with core competency and technical skills in the area of Engineering, Technology, Scientific Research, Teaching and Consultancy.

Profile:

- The Crystal Growth Centre was established in 1982 by Anna University as an interdisciplinary Autonomous center to develop crystalline materials for various technological applications through research and development.
- The active involvement and great contributions of eminent and hardworking faculty members and researchers resulted the establishment of CGC: UGC-AU Facility for Crystal Growth in 1990.
- UGC continues to support the CGC: UGC-AU facility for crystal growth through which Researchers/ Faculty members working in National labs/Universities carry out research activities on areas of their specific interest under the able guidance of the faculty/researchers of the Centre.
- The Centre has implemented several major national and international research projects supported by National and International funding agencies such as AICTE, BRNS, CSIR, DAE, DOE, DRDO, DST, ISRO, IUAC, IUC-DAEF, MNES, UGC, Tamil Nadu Government, ICTP-Italy, European Union, etc.
- The mandate of the Centre is also to promote the research interests of the researchers from all over India under the visitors' program. The Centre has also been continuously organizing several National /International conferences/Workshops/refresher courses/seminars/symposiums constantly to promote research and development activities.
- More than 250 students have obtained their Ph.D. title from the Centre and are currently well-placed in Universities/National Laboratories in India and foreign countries such as USA, UK, Japan, Korea, Singapore, Germany, France, Italy, The Netherlands, Spain, China, etc. Collaborative research activities are carried out with National and International Laboratories funded by National/International funding agencies. The Centre has state-of-the-art facilities required for the growth of crystals and crystalline thin films from almost all well-known crystal growth techniques.

5.11(ii) Western Regional Instrumentation Centre (WRIC), Mumbai

Western Regional Instrumentation Centre (WRIC), Mumbai is an Autonomous institute and was established in the year 1977. It is fully funded by the University Grants Commission (UGC), Government of India, New Delhi in association with University of Mumbai as a part of UGC's comprehensive programme of establishing Four Regional Instrumentation Centres (RICs) and University Science Instrumentation Centres (USICs) all over the country.

(a) Organizational structure:

Since 1981, WRIC has been functioning as a Registered Society with a Governing Council of which the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Mumbai is the ex-officio chairperson. At present, WRIC is the only Regional Instrumentation Centre in India and which has now been recognized as a **National Facility Centre for Instrumentation** by UGC.

The major responsibilities of WRIC are to conduct various activities in the field of instrumentation in association with various colleges, universities, national research institutes and industries in the country.

(b) Research, Design and Development (RD&D):

The Centre has modern RD&D facilities and expertise in different areas. It carries out projects and collaborative activities with industry, R&D institutions and Government Organizations. The Centre also offers consultancy services to industries.

(c) Training Programmes:

WRIC conducted training programmes/workshops at different colleges, university departments and institutes. This has result edit to a strong interaction between WRIC and various academic institutes and industries that has benefited all.

(d) Test and Calibration of Instruments:

WRIChasvarioustypesofcalibrationstandardequipmentwhichisusedforcalibrationofavarietyof instruments from Educational Institutions, Government Organization and Industries For the report period out of 66 instruments received for calibration 62 instruments were calibrated and 4 instruments were returned to the users as they were beyond repairs.

(e) Repairs and Maintenance of Instruments:

WRIC offers its expertise in repairing and servicing laboratory electronic electrical analytical and optical instruments to various colleges institutions and universities in the country. During the report period 20 instruments were repaired.

(f) Optical and Glassblowing:

WRIC offers its expertise in fabrication work and repairing/servicing of laboratory microscopes other optical instruments of department so University of Mumbai & Colleges. Were pair these instruments at Training Programmes.

(g) Library and Information Service:

The total number of books in the library is now 4539. In addition to WRIC staff, the library facilities were used by project students and others.

Internet connectivity has been set up and is being used by staff members and other users. This gives access to many full-text journals, so they have the latest documents and need-based information about solar panel solar cell photovoltaic solar simulator electronic components, instruments circuits, etc.

(h) Analytical Instrumentation Laboratory:

WRIC has an Analytical Instrumentation Laboratory, which is open to research scholars and teachers for their research work either free of charge or at very nominal charges. Teachers from colleges and Universities along with research scholars pursuing their Ph.D., M.Phil. and M.Sc. Degrees, avail of these facilities.

(i) Mechanical Workshop:

The mechanical workshop has conventional mechanical as well as two CNC Machines which are used in fabricating the various mechanical components required for the R&D projects undertaken by the Centre. In addition, several specialized mechanical components required for the repair & maintenance, calibration, training programme activities of the Centre were designed and fabricated in-house.

(i) Focused areas Objectives:

- I. Resource Centre to create necessary facilities for Instrumentation programmes.
- II. To act as a role model for providing instrument services
- III. Design and development of new teaching aids to facilitate teaching and research.
- IV. Conduct training programmes in various aspects of instrumentation including their repair and maintenance.
- V. R&D in instrumentation for Education, Research and Industries

The overall impact of the Centre's activities since its inception has been to further the UGC's efforts in creating adequate, self-supporting infrastructure in the Indian Universities by providing research, maintenance, testing and measurement services in the field of instrumentation.

The major activities of WRIC are as follows:

i. Research, Design and Development (RD&D): -

The Centre has modern RD&D facilities and expertise in different areas. It carries out projects and collaborative activities with industry, R&D institutions and Government Organizations. The Centre also offers consultancy services to industries.

ii. Training & Education Division (TED): -

WRIC routinely conducts training programmes in diverse areas of instrumentation for teachers and technical staff of colleges, university departments in the country. We conduct such program in rural areas in state as well as at national level. The strategy adopted here is to identify and select a prominent college/University department/deemed University. The neighboring colleges and other educational institutes around them are requested to bring their non-working laboratory instruments which are then repaired by the participants under the guidance of WRIC technical staff. During this training all the participants are given training of basic repair and maintenance of the laboratory instruments. This builds up the confidence of the teachers and technicians and helps them in overcoming their inhibitions in handling the instruments.

Major academic activities at Regional/all India level: -

- Short-term courses for USIC staff.
- Need-based short-term training programmes for university/college teachers and laboratory staff.
- Orientation training programmes for college teachers whose institutions are implementing the UGC scheme for vocational subject of instrumentation at B.Sc. degree level.
- Refresher courses in instrumentation for USIC officers/Teachers from Science and Engineering colleges for fulfillment of UGC norms of career advancement.

Maintenance Camps:

Maintenance Camp is an outreach and high-performance activity started during 2004-05. Aim of this activity is to provide repair & maintenance services at the doorsteps of colleges thereby maximizing the effectiveness of the activity. These programs aimed at creating maintenance culture in colleges and awareness about the instruments and their problems. These programs offer professional services at an affordable cost to various colleges in and around Mumbai.

Laboratory Instruments such as CRO, Power Supply, pH Meter, Colorimeter, Rotarod, Analgesia meter, So nicator water bath and Sophisticated Instruments such as UV Visible Spectrometer, FTIR, AAS, HPLC etc. were repaired during the maintenance camp. (Cost of these instruments is approximately 45 lacs).

WRIC takes very nominal charges for these maintenance camps.

Impact Value of Maintenance Camps

WRIC organises Maintenance camps at various colleges. We inspect laboratory instruments of entire college and repair non-working instruments at a nominal cost. We assist the colleges to scrap-out the non-repairable instruments.

A total no. of 219 instruments worth ₹80.00 lakh was repaired. Thus, a savings of ₹20.00 lakh for colleges mentioned during the year of 2022.

Total Grants released to the Centre under 36, 31 & 35 head = ₹ 550.35 Lakh.

5.11(iii) Indian Institute of Advanced Study (IIAS), SHIMLA

i. Historical Background:

The Inter-University Centre for Humanities and Social Sciences came into existence in January 1991 at the Indian Institute of Advanced Study (IIAS), Shimla, with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Institute. The IIAS, in its fifty-seven old years of existence, has created a niche for itself in the world of scholarship by way of pursuit of higher research and life of scholarly reflection and contemplation. It has a residential scholarly community of

over thirty-five Fellows, each engaged in his or her research, but, at the same time, taking active part in the academic life of the community. The Associates of the Inter-University Centre are drawn from colleges and universities across the country and in addition to benefitting from the academic ambience; they also gain from the culture of interdisciplinary.

ii. Objectives:

The academic programme of the Centre has Three basic components: (i) scheme of Associate ship; (ii) organization of Research Seminars in different parts of the country; and (iii) holding of Study Weeks on issues of national and international interest at the Institute in Shimla.

iii. IUC Associates 2022-23:

During the year 2022-23, 104 University and college teachers i.e., 42 Women (Gen-31, OBC-6, ST-1, SC-4) & 62 (Gen-46, OBC-9, ST-1, SC-6) visited the Institute as IUC Associates from all over the country for a month each at the Institute. All the Associates who visited the Institute, were highly appreciative of the UGC programme, as is evident from their feedback. The IIAS provides an Associate with adequate library facilities, a quiet, natural academic ambience, an opportunity to interact with the best academic minds—the Associates leave the Institute refreshed and intellectually recharged to pursue their teaching career. The Associates use this period to (a) complete research they might have been engaged in for some time; (b) revise their doctoral dissertation; (c) catch up with their reading in the Institute's library; and (d) write a paper what is presented to their peers and (e) interact with Fellows of the Institute and distinguished occasional visitors from India and abroad.

The Associates take part in the Seminars and Conferences, both national and international, which are among the regular activities of the Institute. The Associate who visits the Institute have to make one presentation on the topic of their choice specialisation before the academic community of the Institute. During the period under report, 104 IUC Associates, who visited the Institute, gave their presentations.

iv. Authorities:

The Director of the Indian Institute of Advanced Study is also the Director of the Centre. The Centre has an Academic Committee with Director as its Chairman, which advises it on all academic matters. The Committee consisting of academicians from different parts of the country, and representing different disciplines, meets at least once a year. The highest decision-making body of the Centre is a Coordination Committee with the Chairperson of the UGC as its Chair and the Director, IIAS, as its Co-Chair.

5.11(iv) UGC-SVU Centre for MST Radar Applications, SV University, Tirupati

To create scientific awareness about the potential use of the sophisticated radar and other instrumentation facilities for advanced research in the area of atmospheric sciences and to attract bright and young researchers to utilise the MST Radar, Lidar and other co-located Facilities available at NARL, Gadanki University Grants Commission(UGC) has established an UGC-SVU Centre at S.V. University, Tirupati to serves as a common platform for the University system in India for the exchange of scientific knowledge and the centre is accessible to scientist and researcher from Indian Universities working in the area of Atmospheric Sciences.

Objectives & Salient Features:

- UGC-SVU Centre is accessible to scientists and researchers from Indian University working in Atmospheric Sciences.
- UGC-SVU Centre provides necessary facilities for research and basic computational and other support for carry in such research.

- UGC-SVU Centre offers a for exchange visit sin the area of Atmospheric Science so that the Indian Atmospheric scientific Community will benefit from such co operation.
- UGC-SVU Centre helps in training post graduate students and research fellows in several challenging tasks in the thrust area of Atmospheric Physics.
- UGC-SVU Centre assists in coordinating the experimental programme around Atmospheric Dynamics using MST Radar and other co-locatable instrumentation facilities with special reference to the location of these facilities.
- UGC-SVU Centre organizes comprehensive National data bank/archrivals in specified areas of Atmospheric Sciences especially out of the large volume of processed data obtained from MST Radar and other collocated facilities.
- UGC-SVU Centre helps in the generation and updating models for the middle atmosphere over Indian latitudes. Use of such models and data in turn will help in forecasting and prediction by IMD and other concerned national organisations.

New Developments: -

- Micro Pulse Lidar (MPL) observations for understanding diurnal variability in boundary layer altitude, aerosol vertical distribution and cirrus clouds.
- The Validation of NASA mission MIGHTI on ICON spacecraft using SVU meteor radar measurements.

6.1 Major Research Project for Teachers

Research keeps the inquisitive minds vibrant and knowledge updated. The teacher working in the field of Higher Education must perform three basic duties - Teaching, Research and Extension. Thus, the universities and colleges equipped with labs, libraries and other essential facilities are major training grounds for the Researchers. Since past early seventies, UGC has been providing financial assistance for the Research Proposals of the permanent, regular, working/retired teachers in the Universities and Colleges which are enlisted under sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. The Major Research Projects scheme enables them to carry out intensive and in-depth research studies in specific subject areas with their regular job or after superannuation. Research Project may be undertaken by an individual teacher, a group of teachers, or a department. It can also be undertaken by a retired teacher up to the age of 70, provided the age at the time of applying is not more than 67 years. Priority is given to interdisciplinary research and inter-institutional collaborative research.

Selection of Projects:

The proposals received online from teachers are pre-evaluated by a Screening Committee of subject experts constituted for this purpose. The subject expert committee again evaluates the shortlisted proposals through an interface discussion with the teacher concerned to assess the proposal's merit, novelty and viability. The emphasis would be on supporting such areas that cut across disciplines and subjects like Health, Gerontology, Environment, Biotechnology, Stress Management, WTO & its impact on the Economy, History of Science, Asian Philosophy, Defence and Strategic Studies, which include national security affairs, insurance and banking and many other areas as would be identified by subject experts.

Quantum of Assistance:

Major Research Project in Sciences including Engineering & Technology, Medicine, Pharmacy Agriculture etc. – ₹20.00 lakhs

Major research projects in humanities, social science, languages, literature, arts, law and allied disciplines – ₹15.00 lakhs

The assistance provided for a Major Research Project includes funding for Equipment, Books and Journals, Chemicals and Consumables, Contingencies, Travel and fieldwork, Hiring Services, Fellowship to Project Fellows and other items required for the project.

Total Amount of ₹ 1.28 Crore released to 120 beneficiaries during 2022-23

6.2 Research Award/Research Scientist

Research Award:

The main objective of the scheme is to provide an opportunity to permanent teachers of Universities/ Institutions having doctorate degrees to pursue research in their area(s) of specialization without undertaking any research guidance for a period of two years extendable by one year on the recommendation of the expert committee in exceptional cases. Selections are made for 100 slots in alternate years for all the disciplines of Sciences, Humanities, Social Sciences, Engineering and Technology based on the recommendations of an expert Committee constituted by the UGC.

An expenditure of ₹ 0.24 Crore was incurred during 2022-23.

During 2022-23, the scheme was re-launched as "Research Grant for In-Service Faculty Members." Only the old cases are being settled.

Research Scientist:

The scheme of Research Scientist was originally initiated in 1983 to attract meritorious scientists of Indian origin who may be working abroad to promote high-quality research in Science, Engineering and Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences at three levels:

- a. Research Scientist' A' (Lecturer)
- b. Research Scientist' B' (Reader)
- c. Research Scientist' C' (Professor)

The scheme has now been discontinued. Only the old cases are being settled.

An expenditure of ₹ 4.95 Crore was incurred during 2022-23.

6.3 Post-Doctoral Fellowships

6.3(i) Post-Doctoral Fellowship for SC/ST Candidates:

The scheme's objective was to provide fellowship to SC/ST candidates who have obtained a doctorate and published research work to their credit for doing advanced research in their chosen areas. The total no. of slots available under this scheme was 100 per year.

During 2022-23, the scheme merged with the newly launched "Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship". Only the old cases are being settled.

An expenditure of ₹ 2.05 crore was incurred in the Financial Year 2022-23.

6.3(ii) Post-Doctoral Fellowship for Women:

The objective of the scheme was to provide an opportunity to unemployed women candidates holding Ph.D. degrees and intending to pursue post-doctoral research in Science, Engineering and Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences. The total no. of slots available under this scheme was 100 per year.

During 2022-23, the scheme merged with the newly launched "Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship'. Only the old cases are being settled.

₹ 2.34 crore was incurred in financial year 2022-23.

6.3(iii) Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship in Humanities & Social Sciences including languages:

The scheme's objective is to provide an opportunity to carry out advanced studies and research in Humanities and Social Sciences, including languages, to candidates with a Ph.D. degree in the relevant subject. The total no. of slots available under this scheme is 200 per year. The scheme has been merged with the newly launched "Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship". Only the old cases are being settled.

An expenditure of ₹ 2.21 lakh was incurred during 2022-23.

6.3(iv) Dr. D.S. Kothari Post Doctoral Fellowship

Under this scheme, the research fellows are provided financial assistance to pursue post-doctoral research in basic Sciences / Medical / Engineering and Technology. The selections are made throughout the year. The tenure of the fellowship is 3 (three) years.

The applications received up to 28.01.2021 have been considered for selection, and the result was declared in September 2021; after that, no fresh selection was made under the scheme. The scheme has been merged with the newly launched "Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship". Only the old cases are being settled.

₹25.99 crores were released to 506 PDFs from 2022-23.

6.3(v) UGC-BSR Faculty Fellowship

To provide an opportunity for the continuance of research contributions in Basic Science Research by talented teachers who are nearing superannuation in State/Central Universities, UGC has implemented the "BSR Faculty Fellowship." The scheme's main objective is to facilitate productive research for an additional three years after superannuation and to play a research mentorship role for young researchers and Ph.D. students.

Tenure

The tenure of the fellowship is three years or age of 68 years, whichever is earlier.

Financial Assistance

A Fellowship of ₹50,000/- p.m. (exclusive of the pension and/or other retirement benefits) and a research grant of 5,00,000/- p.a. (every year) is provided under the scheme.

The Research grant can be utilized to purchase equipment, computers/laptops, printers, chemicals, glassware and consumables, contingency, hiring project/technical assistant, fieldwork, travel (within India), etc. Depending on the needs, the fellow can decide the quantum of funds under these heads. The grant cannot be utilized for international travel and purchase of furniture.

The awardee is to execute an undertaking to UGC along with the University for joining the fellowship, abide by the norms and guidelines of the UGC pertaining to this fellowship from time to time, and send the bi-annual progress reports.

₹6.01 crores have been released to 78 BSR Faculty Fellows from 01.01.2022 to 31.12.2022.

6.3(vi) Emeritus Fellowship:

The objective of the scheme is to provide an opportunity to superannuated teachers up to the age of 70 years of all recognized universities and colleges under the UGC Act to pursue active research in their respective fields of specialization. The eligibility for this fellowship is based on the quality of research and published work contributed by the teachers in their service careers. The number of slots available under the scheme is 100 for science streams and 100 for Humanities, Social Sciences and Languages (total of 200 slots) at any given time basis. An expenditure of ₹ 1766/- was incurred during 2022-23.

During 2022-23, the scheme has been re-launched as "Fellowship for Superannuated Faculty Members". Only the old cases are being settled.

Fellowship for Superannuated Faculty Members (Emeritus Fellowship)

The purpose of the fellowship is to provide opportunities to superannuated faculty members of Universities/Institutes/Colleges, hereinafter "Institutions" to pursue research in their area(s). Faculty members at the level of Professors/Associate professors (who are going to superannuate within six months or already superannuated are eligible. The tenure of fellowship is three years or 70 years of age, whichever is earlier.

6.4 Research fellowship (for M.Phil. / Ph. D)

6.4(i) Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) in Science, Humanities and Social Sciences

The objective of the scheme is to provide an opportunity for scholars to undertake advanced studies and research leading to M. Phil/Ph.D. degrees in Science, Humanities and Social Sciences, including languages. University Grants Commission provides JRF to the candidates who qualify for National Eligibility Testing (NET/JRF) of the UGC and the UGC-CSIR Joint Test conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). The total tenure of the fellowship is for five years.

With effect from 01.01.2019, the amount of JRF and SRF fellowship have been enhanced from $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{?}} 25,000$ /- to $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{?}} 31,000$ /- and $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{?}} 28,000$ /- to $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{?}} 35,000$ /- respectively. The other terms and conditions remain the same as per the XII plan guidelines. The pattern of the fellowship is as follows: -

An expenditure of ₹1206.21 crore has been incurred during the year 2022-23 under JRF in Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences. There are 9400 slots per annum under JRF. At present, 34,782 (approx.) Beneficiaries are pursuing M. Phil/Ph.D. under JRF. UGC makes payment through Direct Benefit Transfer directly to the accounts of beneficiaries w. e. f., December 2012 (UGC NET JRF qualified candidates) and Dec 2012 (UGC-CSIR Joint Test qualified candidates) onwards and from 1st July 2016, all JRF & SRF fellowships for legacy cases.

The following are the achievements during 2022-23: -

- a. Fellowship to all the JRF/SRF Scholars are being made through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) mode.
- b. An amount of ₹ 1206.21 crore has been transferred to 30,335 JRFs/ SRFs scholars during the year 2022-23.
- c. Monthly Payment System has been initiated on the portal.
- d. A Public Notice was issued on 29.03.2022 for Extension of validity of JRF award letter, Due to COVID-19 situation in the country.
- e. A dedicated option to resolve grievances has been provided to candidate in their UGC Scholarship Portal login to raise and track their grievances.
- f. A Public Notice was issued on 27.01.2023 regarding ensure the inclusion of external expert in the committee constituted for the up gradation from JRF to SRF.

6.4(ii) National Fellowship for Scheduled Caste (SC) Students

The objective of the scheme is to provide financial assistance to selected candidates belonging to the SC category for pursuing an M.Phil/Ph.D. on a full-time/regular basis in Univs./Instts. /Colleges in India.

Eligibility:

The candidate should belong to SC and should have passed the Post Graduate examination.

The selection will be made based on the merit of the candidates. The candidate must be registered for M.Phil./Ph. D. at the time of filling up the application for the fellowship. Prior clearance of the CBSE/NTA-UGC-NET/CSIR-NET examination is mandatory for selection from the selection year 2018-19.

6.4(iii) Maulana Azad National Fellowship for Minority Students

The objective of the scheme is to provide financial assistance to selected candidates belonging to Minority Communities viz. 1) Buddhist, 2) Christian, 3) Jain, 4) Muslim, 5) Parsi, 6) Sikh for pursuing M.Phil./Ph.D. research on full time/regular basis in Universities/Institutions/Colleges in India. There are 1000 slots for each year.

UGC implemented the scheme till September 2022 only. W.e.f. 01.10.2022, the scheme has been returned to the Ministry of Minority Affairs. During the financial year 2022-23 till September, an amount of ₹ 49.79 crore was disbursed to 2145 beneficiaries.

6.4(iv) Swami Vivekananda Single Girl Child Fellowship for Research in Social Sciences:

The scheme, launched in 2014-15, was applicable to a single girl child who has been admitted to a regular, full-time Ph.D. program in Social Sciences in any recognized University/Institute. The objective of the scheme was to promote single-girl children in society, increase the sex ratio in favour of women and promote small family norms in the society. Currently, there is no cap on the number of fellowships to be awarded annually. Therefore, all the eligible applicants could receive the fellowship for pursuing research leading to the award of a Ph.D. The scheme has been re-launched as "Savitri Bai Jyoti Rao Phule Fellowship for Single Girl Child" in 2022. Only the old cases are being settled.

During the period under reporting, ₹ 6.15 crore was disbursed to 187 beneficiaries.

6.4(v) BSR Fellowship for Meritorious Student (RFSMS)

The objective of the scheme was to provide opportunities for meritorious candidates to undertake advanced studies and research leading to Ph.D. degrees in sciences. The tenure of the fellowship was five years. Since, 2016 BSR Fellowship has been merged with the UGC-NET JRF Fellowship. An amount of ₹ 0.55 crores were released to 75 JRF/SRF candidates during 2022-23.

6.5 Post-Graduate Scholarships

6.5(i) Post-Graduate Scholarships for Professional Courses to SC/ST Students:

Keeping in view the social background of the candidates from deprived sections of society, the scheme

has been implemented since 2011-12 to provide them an opportunity to undertake postgraduate-level studies in professional courses. The tenure of the scholarship is for two/three years, depending upon the duration of the PG course. The number of slots is 1000 every year.

6.5(ii) Indira Gandhi Post-Graduate Scholarships for Single Girl Child:

The objectives of the scheme are to support the Postgraduate education of single girl children to promote single girl children in society, increase the sex ratio in favour of women and promotion of small family norms in society.

The scheme was started in the academic session 2006-07. Only a single girl child of her parents and who has been admitted to a regular, full-time first-year Master's degree course (Non-professional course) in any recognized university or a postgraduate college is eligible for the scholarship. Girl students up to the age of 30 years at the time of admission in PG courses are eligible. Since this is an incentive scheme, there is no cap on the number of scholarships awarded yearly. All the eligible applicant girl children get the scholarship.

The scheme has been on-boarded on the National Scholarship Portal since 2017. During the underreporting period, the AY 2022-23 selection processes were started. ₹ 13.90 crore was disbursed to 3839 beneficiaries during the financial year 2022-23.

6.5(iii) Post-graduate Scholarships for University Rank Holders

The scholarship was started in 2006-07 with the broad objective to promote and nurture talent and to reward meritorious students with outstanding performance at the Undergraduate level for pursuing Postgraduate studies. The first and second rank holders at the Undergraduate level and admitted in any Postgraduate course are eligible for this scholarship. The scheme applies to students who have been admitted to regular, full-time master's degree courses in any recognized State/Deemed University and Autonomous or PG college and are below the age of 30 years at the time of admission in the PG course. There is provision for scholarships to 3,000 students every year.

6.5(iv) Post Graduate Scholarship for M.E/M.Tech/M.Pharma to GATE/GPAT Qualified Students

The scheme aims to help and attract young talented graduate students to pursue technical education at Post Graduate level in Higher Education Institutions. GATE/GPAT-qualified students can receive financial assistance through scholarships for pursuing M.E./M.Tech/ M.Pharma through full-time/regular mode in Universities/ Institutes/ Colleges in India. The scholarship was launched in 2016-17.

6.5(v) Radhakrishnan UGC Post-Doctoral Fellowship

These fellowships aim to provide an opportunity to carry out advanced studies and research in Sciences, Engineering and Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences, including languages, in Indian Universities/Institutions. Only the unemployed candidates who have been awarded the Ph.D. degree are eligible to apply under the scheme. There are 900 slots, and the fellowship tenure is three years.

6.6 Under - Graduate Scholarships

6.6(i) 'ISHAN UDAY' Special Scholarship Scheme for North-Eastern Region

The Ministry of HRD and the University Grants Commission have taken a special interest in promoting higher education in the NER. To improve the GER, promote higher education and encourage children belonging to economically weaker sections of the NE region, the scheme was launched in academic session 2014-15. Before launching the scheme, the UGC undertook wide-ranging consultations with State Governments and Central and State Universities of the NE region, the Ministry of HRD, the Ministry of Development of the North-Eastern Region, the North-Eastern Council, Shillong and other stakeholders.

Under the scheme, there is a provision for financial assistance through scholarships to 10,000 students annually. The students with domicile of NER, who have passed Class XII or equivalent exam from a school situated within NER through any recognized Board of Education and have secured admission in general degree course, technical and professional courses including medical and para-medical courses (Integrated courses included) in Universities/Colleges/Institutions recognized by UGC, Institutions of National Importance/ Institutions recognized by other Statutory councils within as well as outside the States of NER. For availing of a scholarship under this scheme, the income of the parents of the student should not exceed ₹4.5 lakh per annum.

The scheme has been on-boarded on the National Scholarship Portal since 2017. During the period underreporting, the selection process for AY2022-23 was started. The final merit list is yet to be declared. ₹ 142.43 crore was disbursed to 25131 beneficiaries during the financial year 2022-23.

6.7 Basic Scientist Research (BSR) Programmes in Universities (Strengthening of Basic Science Research)

6.7(i) Faculty Recharge Programme (FRP)

Operation Faculty Recharge was launched in 2011, under which various faculty positions at the levels of Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors were created to be filled at the national level through advertisement. The faculty positions shall be made available to both central and State universities. The faculty shall receive emoluments at par with the teachers in Central Universities as approved by UGC occasionally.

The tenure of appointment of faculties, i.e., Professor / Associate Professor / Assistant Professor, is initially for five years, extendable until the age of superannuation following a peer review after every 5 years.

In its meeting held on 2nd September 2016, the Commission resolved to withdraw the FRP Programme prospectively under the scheme of Basic Scientific Research.

Currently, 145 faculties are in position out of the total 373 faculties selected under the scheme.

UGC has organized a peer review assessment of 149 faculty members through online meetings of the Selection Committee in November 2022 for the extension and promotion of faculties working under the Faculty Recharge Programme. The Commission, in its 564th meeting held on 23.12.2022, has approved the recommendations of the Selection Committee. Accordingly, the tenure of 147 faculties has been extended; out of 147 faculties, 135 faculties have also been promoted to the next higher level. During 2022-23, a total of 47.99 cr. has been disbursed to 149 faculties.

6.7(ii) Start up Grant for Newly Recruited Faculty

All teachers who are newly appointed at the level of Assistant Professor against permanent post in the faculties of Basic Science, Engineering and Technology are eligible to receive financial support under the scheme. The Assistant Professor should apply within a period of one year from the date of joining the post in the Department/University. The purpose of the research grant is to provide opportunities to regularly appointed faculty members of universities to pursue research in their area(s). The selections are made throughout the year. The tenure of the scheme is two years, extendable up to one year. The financial assistance provided is ₹10.00 lakh.

The applications received up to January 28, 2021, have been considered for selection, and the result was declared in September 2021 and thereafter, no fresh selection was made under the scheme.

An amount of ₹9.12 Crores was released to 161 faculty members for various Universities/Institutions during 2022-23

6.7(iii) Mid-Career Award to Teachers under BSR Programme

The scheme aims to provide an opportunity for regularly appointed teachers to pursue research in their specialized areas. The applicants who have a minimum of 3 years of service left in the University from the date of submission of the application are eligible. The selections are made throughout the year. The scheme's tenure is two years, extendable up to one year. The financial assistance provided is ₹10.00 lakh.

The applications received up to 28.01.2021 have been considered for selection and the result was declared in September 2021. After that, no fresh selection was made under the scheme.

₹0.76 crores were released to 17 teachers pursuing their research in various Indian Universities/ Institutions during 2022-23.

6.7(iv) Research grant for In-Service Faculty Members

The scheme aims to provide opportunities to regularly appointed faculty members to pursue research in their area(s). Faculty members up to the age of 50 years, who have a minimum of 10 years of service left in the University, are eligible under the scheme. The tenure of the fellowship is two years and there are 200 slots or, as may be decided by the Commission. One-time financial assistance of ₹10.00 Lakh is provided to the selected candidates.

The scheme was launched in September 2022 and online applications were called. The selection process for the year 2022-23 is underway.

6.7(v) Dr. D.S. Kothari Research Grant for Newly Recruited Faculty Members

The purpose of the research grant is to provide opportunities to regularly appointed faculty members of Universities/ Institutes/ Colleges (hereinafter "Institutions") to pursue research in their area(s). All teachers who are newly appointed at the level of Assistant Professor against permanent posts in the University shall be eligible to receive financial support under the scheme. There are 132 slots under the scheme and the tenure of the fellowship is two years. One-time financial assistance of ₹10.00 Lakh is provided to the selected candidates.

The scheme was launched in September 2022 and online applications were called. The selection process for the year 2022-23 is underway.

7.1 Development of Women's Studies in Indian Universities and Colleges

The UGC, in its commitment to achieve increased participation of women in higher education, has undertaken several initiatives such as:

- i. Scheme for development of Women's Studies Centres in Indian Universities & Colleges
- ii. UGC (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women Employees and Students in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2015.
- iii. Guidelines for Gender Champions in Educational Institutions.
- iv. Toll-Free Number: 1800111656 for registration of grievances related to women and sexual harassment.

The UGC programme for the promotion of women's Studies envisages financial assistance to universities and colleges for setting up centres and cells for Women's Studies. The Centres/Cells are required to undertake research, develop curricula, and organize training and extension work in the areas of gender equity, economic self-reliance of women, girls' education, population issues, issues of human rights, social exploitation, etc. These activities are expected to contribute not only to social awareness and change but also to academic development.

- At present, 159 Women's Studies Centres have been established in various Universities and Colleges under this scheme.

Objectives of the Scheme:

- (i) To provide financial assistance to Women Studies Centres for expansion of Women Studies through teaching, research and field action.
- (ii) To encourage Inter disciplinary approach and theoretical grasp to enhance the understanding of society by highlighting feminist perspectives on social transformation, development and processes of exploitation.
- (iii) To encourage constant interaction with field reality through field action programmes that feed into academic activity.

7.2 Programmes for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes (excluding Creamy Layer), Economically Weaker Section, Minorities and Persons with Disabilities

7.2(i) Reservation for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes, OBC, EWS and persons with Disabilities in the matter of appointment to teaching posts and admissions in Universities/Colleges

The University Grants Commission is making continuous and special efforts for ensuring facilities for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes at the level of higher education in the light of suggestions made by the Government of India and the Commission for Scheduled Castes/Tribes from time to time. These measures include reservation of seats in various courses offered by the Universities & Colleges, reservation in recruitment to teaching and non-teaching post, provision of seats in Hostels, Scholarships, fellowships, remedial courses, special assistance to colleges in Tribal areas etc.

According to the Central Education Institutions Act, 2006, 15% and 7.5% reservation in admission is reserved for SCs, and STs respectively, which encourage SC and ST students to continue Higher Education and make it mandatory on the part of the Institutions to enroll a certain percentage of SC and ST students in their intake. Efforts are taken for continued implementation of the act. The UGC has forwarded the central Educational Institutions (Reservations in Admission) Amendment Act, 2012 to all Universities vide letter No.F.1-5/2006 (SCT) dated 19.12.2012 for compliance and necessary action as per the Gazette Notification no. 31 of 2012.

The Central Education Institutions (Reservation in Teachers' Ordinance, 2019 dated 7th March 2019 Published by the Govt. of India, Ministry of Law and Justice and Ministry of HRD (Department of Higher Education) Notification published dated 7.03.2019.

As per direction of Ministry of HRD, Department of Higher Education, the UGC forwarded a copy of the Ministry Letter No. F 38-11/2018-CU. V dated 07.03.2019 along with notification No. 1013 dated 07.03.2019 regarding 'The Central Education Institutions (Reservation in Teachers' Cadre) Ordinance, 2019 vide UGC letter no. F.1-5/2006(SCT) dated 07.03.2019 and 8.03.2019 which is also posted on UGC Website.

The Central Government hereby specifies that there shall be reservation of posts in direct recruitment out of the sanctioned strength in teachers' cadre in a Central Educational Institution in the manner specified in the Office Memorandum, No. 36012/2/96-Est.(res) of the Department of Personnel and Training, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, dated 2nd July 1997 to the extent as follows, namely: -

- (a) Fifteen percent of Scheduled Castes
- (b) Seven- and one-half percent for Scheduled Tribes, and
- (c) Twenty Seven percent of socially and educationally Backward classes

UGC issued instructions from time to time to all Central/State/Deemed to be Universities and Grants-in-aid Institutions for (i) implementation of SC/ST/OBC/EWS and PwD Reservation Policy of the Govt. (ii) display of reservation roster on the University website as per instructions issued by the DOPT O.M. No.36012/2/96-Estt.(Res.) dated 2nd July 1997 and (iii) filling up of remaining identified backlog reserved vacancies of these categories in teaching and non-teaching posts. Letters have been issued vide this office letter No.1-8/2014(SCT) dated 12.06.2023 & 14.07.2023.

7.2(ii) Establishment of SC/ST Cell in each of the institution is mandatory as per instructions of the Govt. of India vide letter no. 43011/153/2010-Est. (Res) dated 04.01.2013. Further, UGC vide its D.O. letter no. F.1-5/2006(SCT) dated 8th June 2015 requested all Central Universities and UGC funded deemed to be Universities to comply the instructions of DoPT for setting up of special Reservation Cell for enforcement of orders of reservations in Posts and services and other related works. The Commission in its 535th meeting held on 27th September 2018 resolved to establish a SC/ST cell in newly established centrally funded universities where the SC/ST cell does not exist. For the establishment of Cell, the Commission has approved the non-teaching positions.

7.2(iii) Guidelines for implementation of Tribal Sub Plan (TSP) and Scheduled Caste Sub Plan (SCSP)

Guidelines for implementation were released after approval in the 529th Commission meeting of UGC dated 8th February, 2018. The Ministry of HRD allocates earmarked funds for SCSP and TSP to the extent of 15% and 7.5%. As a consequential step, UGC should monitor that funds to the extent earmarked for

SCSP and TSP are not diverted elsewhere. For this purpose, a separate sanction letter should be issued for SCSP and TSP funds. UGC should obtain a utilization certificate for each of the three components viz general category, SCSP and TSP, indicating inter alia the funds utilized during the year and unspent balance to be carried forward in the next financial year. UGC has also opened separate bank accounts for SC and ST funds management.

7.2 (iv) Prevention of Caste Based Discrimination:

UGC has advised all the Universities/Colleges that: -

- 1. The official/faculty members should desist from any act of discrimination against SC/ST students on the grounds of their social origin.
- 2. The University/Institute/College may develop a page on their website for lodging such complaints of caste discrimination by SC/ST students and place a complaint register in the Registrar/Principal office for the purpose. If any such incident comes to the notice of the authorities, action should be taken against the erring officials/faculty member promptly.
- 3. The University/College should ensure that no official/faculty member indulge in any kind of discrimination against any community or category.
- 4. The University may constitute a committee to look into the discrimination complaints received from SC/ST/OBC students/Teachers and Non-teaching staff.

Information has been received from the 665 HEIs during the year 2021-22 & 2022-23.

7.2(v) Coaching Schemes for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) & Minorities:

UGC has been contributing towards social equity and social economic mobility of the under privileged section of society through following special coaching schemes in Universities/Colleges. All the concerned Universities/Colleges are informed about the continuance of the UGC Schemes – Remedial Coaching/Coaching Classes for Entry into Services /NET Coaching for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) and Minority Community Students, Equal Opportunity Cell & PwD Schemes have been extended up to 31.03.2024 as per office memorandum F.No.1-8/2018(CPP II) dated 28.04.2023.

7.2(vi) Establishment of Centers in Universities for the Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusive Policy:

The University Grants Commission had introduced a new scheme, namely Establishment of Centres in Universities for Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusive Policy during the X Plan period, i.e. 2006-2007, to support research on the issue of Social Exclusion which has theoretical as well as policy importance. The need to establish such centres was felt considering that certain communities such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and religious minorities experience systemic exclusion in the matter of taking advantages of development.

The core objectives of the scheme are -

- Conceptualizing discrimination, exclusion and inclusion based on caste/ethnicity/ and religion.
- Developing understanding of the nature and dynamics of discrimination and exclusion.
- Contextualizing and problematizing discrimination, exclusion and inclusion.
- Developing an understanding of discrimination of an empirical level.
- Formulating policies for protecting the rights of these groups and eradicating the problem of exclusion and discrimination.

35 Centres were established in the Universities across the country.

The primary functions of the Centres are -

- Teaching Courses at the M.A. and M.Phil levels, leading to full-fledged M.Phil and even M.A. Programmes in Social Exclusion Studies.
- Undertaking M.Phil and Ph.D. supervision.
- Undertaking empirical studies with theoretical perspective and build time series data bank for comparative studies and policy/programmes evaluation.
- Carrying out detailed rigorous analysis based on the socio-economic data generated by government agencies.
- Organizing conferences, seminars and symposia on the theme of Social Exclusion.
- Publishing regularly the research findings of the faculty and students.
- Organizing public lectures on the subject by eminent scholars.
- Reaching out to scholars, especially young scholars, in other universities and colleges through an active programme of inviting Visiting Faculty.
- Establishing links with civil society Organizations engaged in combating social Exclusion.
- Short-term Orientation courses for political leaders, Parliamentarians, government officials, trade unionists and media personalities.

Eligibility

- Financial assistance under the Scheme would be available to such Universities and Deemed Universities, which come within the purview of Section 2(f) or Section 3 and are fit to receive central assistance under section 129B) of the UGC Act, 1956.
- The University should have registered under PFMS portal and obtained NAAC Accreditation.

This scheme will continued during the year 2023-24.

During the financial year 2022-23, an amount of ₹1,20,50,109/- has been released to Manipur University, Imphal.

7.2 (vii) Facilities for Persons with Disabilities

The Constitution of India ensures equality, freedom, justice and dignity of all individuals and implicitly mandates an inclusive society for all, including persons with disabilities. In recent years, there have been vast and positive changes in the perception of society towards persons with disabilities. It has been realized that most persons with disabilities can lead a better quality of life if they have equal opportunities and effective access to rehabilitation measures.

The Protection of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 indicates that differently abled persons should have access to education at all levels. In the higher education sector, the University Grants Commission has been supporting universities and colleges in the country and involving them in special education activities to empower differently abled persons.

The UGC, from time to time, has been conveying to the Universities and Deemed Universities the policy decisions, including reservations in admissions and employment in the Government of India pertaining to persons with disabilities. In addition, the decisions taken and the guidelines framed at the level of the Commission in this regard have also been circulated to all universities for implementation. The Commission had also circulated the Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 2016, to the universities, requesting them to strictly follow the provisions contained therein.

Reservation in Higher Educational Institutions- All Government institutions of Higher Education and other higher education institutions receiving aid from the Government shall reserve not less than **five** percent of seats for persons with benchmark disabilities.

Reservation - Every appropriate Government shall appoint in every Government establishment not less than **four** percent of the total number of vacancies in the cadre strength each group of posts meant to be filled with persons with benchmark disabilities.

UGC has also issued the instruction to all Institutions to implement the following recommendations in your university/constituent and affiliated colleges in compliance with the Hon'ble Supreme Court orders dated 15.12.2017 in WPC No.292 of 2006 vide D.O.Letter No.F.6-1/2018(SCT) dated 14.2.2020 and dated 02.09.2020.

- (a) Compliance with the provision of Section 32 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, while dealing with the issue of reservation of seats in the admission of students in each course and notifying the compliance each year to UGC. "To this end, they shall submit a list of the number of disabled persons admitted in each course every year to the Chief Commissioner and/or the State Commissioner (as the case may be). It will also be the duty of the Chief Commissioner as well as the State Commissioner to enquire as to whether these educational institutions have fulfilled the aforesaid obligation. Needless to say, appropriate consequential action against those educational institutions, as provided under Section 89 of the Disabilities Act, 2016, as well as other provisions, shall be initiated against defaulting institutions."
- (b) Adoption of the Harmonized Guidelines and Space Standards for Barrier-free Built Environment for persons with disabilities developed by the Ministry of Urban Development, which has been notified by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment as accessibility standards for public buildings. University and its affiliated colleges to submit a detailed accessibility action plan to be implemented in a time-bound manner.
- (c) Formation of an Internal Committee comprising teachers, staff, students and parents to take care of the day-to-day needs of differently abled persons as well as for implementation of the schemes.
- (d) Ensuring the proper functioning of Equal Opportunity Cell in the Universities, Colleges, and other higher education institutions.

As per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, new guidelines have been prepared pertaining to persons with disabilities by the UGC entitled "Accessibility Guidelines and Standards for Higher Education Institutions and Universities". On 12th July 2022, these Guidelines were posted on the UGC website and letter no. F.No.6-11/2021(SCT/Review-Accessibility Guidelines) dated 12.07.2022 have been issued to all the Higher Education Institutions for the compliance of these Guidelines.

The UGC is also implementing plans/schemes for the benefit of persons with disabilities. UGC has to monitor the effective implementation of the reservation policy for Persons with Disabilities in employment and in admission in Universities/ Colleges.

Financial Assistance under the following schemes is available to the universities & colleges that come within the preview of section 2(f) and fit to receive central assistance under section 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956.

The Following Schemes for Persons with disabilities in Universities and Colleges have also been extended up to 31.03.2024 as per the office memorandum dated 28.04.2023 wide F.No.1-8/2016 (CPP-II)

7.2(viii)(a) Higher Education for Persons with Special Needs (HEPSN)

The scheme is basically meant to create an environment at higher education institutions to enrich higher education learning experiences for differently abled persons. Creating awareness about the capabilities of differently abled persons, construction aimed at improving accessibility, purchase of equipment to enrich learning, etc., are the broad categories of assistance under this scheme.

7.2(viii)(b) Financial Assistance to Visually Challenged Teachers

The Scheme has been formulated to help visually challenged permanent teachers pursue teaching and research with the help of a Reader and by using teaching and learning aids by way of providing Reader's Allowance and funds for the purchase of Braille books, recorded materials, etc. and help such teachers achieve self-dependence by using various aids for teaching, learning and research.

7.2(ix) Other Backward Classes

Non-Teaching Posts:

The UGC had received a letter No. 36012/22/93-Estt. (SCT) dated 22nd October 1993 from Govt. of India, Ministry of Personnel, PG & Pensions, Department of Personnel & Training, New Delhi regarding reservation for Other Backward Classes in Civil Posts and Services under the Government of India.

All the Registrar of the Universities were requested vide this office letter No.F.1-4/94 (SCT) dated 21st April 1994 that the reservation for Other Backward Classes in Civil Posts and Services may now be implemented as per the instructions contained in the above letter of Department of Personnel and Training, New Delhi. It was also requested that the contents of the above letter may also be brought to the notice of all the affiliated colleges under intimation to UGC.

Teaching Posts:

The Commission in its meeting held on 27th December 2006 decided to approve the implementation of reservation for Other Backward Classes at the level of Lecturer in all Grant-in-aid institutions funded by the Central Government except minority Institutions under Article 30 (1) of the Constitution of India which is duly recommended by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Secondary & Higher Education, Government of India, New Delhi vide D.O letter No.F.22-1/98-U.5 dated 09th October 2006.

All the Registrar of Central Universities, Institutions Deemed to be Universities and State Universities were requested vide this office letters no. F.1-9/94 (SCT) dated 24th January 2007, 25th January 2007 and 26th September 2007, respectively, to implement the reservation Policy of the Government of India in respect of Other Backward Classes for filling up the Teaching Posts at the level of Lecturer with immediate effect except for Minority Institutions under Article 30 (1) of the Constitution of India. All the State Universities were also informed that affiliated/constituent colleges and other institutes functioning within the State can follow the percentage of reservation for Other Backward Classes as prescribed by the respective State Government.

All the State Governments were also requested vide this office letter No.F.1-4/94 (SCT/OBC) dated 23rd October 2007 to initiate action for implementation of reservation for Other Backward Classes in the Teaching and Non-teaching Posts in Central Universities, Institutions Deemed to be Universities, State Universities and their affiliated/constituent colleges as per the instructions contained in the above letters except Minority Institutions under Article 30(1) of the Constitution of India.

Further, the UGC has forwarded a copy of the Ministry of HRD (Department of Higher Education) Letter No.F.38-11/2018-CU. V dated 07.03.2019, along with notification No. 1013 dated 07.03.2019 to all grant-in-aid Universities regarding the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Teachers' Cadre) ordinance, 2019.

Notification.S.O.1013 dated 07.03.2019: - In exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Teacher's Cadre) Ordinance, 2019 (Ordinance 13 of 2019), the Central Government hereby specifies that there shall be reservation of posts in direct recruitment out of the sanctioned strength in teachers' cadre in a Central Educational Institution in the manner specified in Office Memorandum, No. 36012/2/96-Estt. (Res.) of the Department of Personnel and Training, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, dated 2nd July 1997 to the extent as follows, namely: -

- (A) Fifteen percent for Scheduled Castes.
- (B) Seven and one-half percent for Scheduled Tribes, and
- (C) Twenty-seven percent for socially and educationally backward classes

7.2(x) Admission

As per the direction of Ministry of earstwhile HRD, UGC has forwarded the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Amendment Act,2012 to all Universities vide letter No.F.1-

5/2006(SCT) dated 19.11.2012 for compliance and necessary action as per the Gazette Notification No.33. According to Para 3 of the aforesaid Act, as per the Policy out of annual permitted Strength in each branch of study or faculty, 15% seats are to be reserved for Scheduled Castes, 7.5% for scheduled Tribes and 27% for Other Backward Classes.

"Specified north-eastern region" Means the area comprising the state of Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, Tripura and the Tribal areas of Assam referred to in the Sixth Scheduled to the Constitution: "State Seats" in relation to a Central Educational Institutes, means such seats, if any, out of the annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty as are earmarked to be filled from amongst the eligible students of the State in which such institutions is situated.

Central Universities are statutory Autonomous Organizations established under an Act of Parliament and the Statutes and Ordinances made there under. All administrative academic decisions, including admission, are taken by the Universities with the approval of their Statutory Bodies. It is the responsibility of the University to ensure effective implementation of the reservation policy of the Govt. of India.

UGC issued instructions from time to time to all Central/State/Deemed to be Universities and Grants-in-aid Institutions for (i) implementation of SC/ST/PWD /OBC Reservation Policy of the Govt. (ii) display of reservation roster on the University website as per instructions issued by the DOPT O.M. No.36012/2/96-Estt. (Res.) dated 2nd July 1997 and (iii) filling up of remaining identified backlog reserved vacancies of these categories in teaching and non-teaching posts.

7.2(xi) Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Higher Education Institutions

UGC informed all the Universities and Chief Secretaries of all the State Governments/UTs regarding the implementation of reservation for economically weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Higher Educational Institutions in accordance with the One Hundred and Third Amendment of the Constitution of India for its immediate implementation and compliance. It is also requested to give effect to the provisions of the constitutions (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 for all higher educational Institutions funded/aided, directly or indirectly, by the State Government in such manner that the provision for reservation for EWS is operational from the academic year 2020-21 onwards.

The Commission started the Area Studies Programme in 1963 in different universities. It has evolved in the last five decades with all its strengths and limitations. These Centers are working with the following major objectives.

- b. To promote alternative paradigms of area of studies from the perspective of post-colonial societies.
- c. To contribute towards Indian perspectives of the region and issues.
- d. To provide critical inputs to the policymakers, particularly in India's economic, strategic and political interests.
- e. To bring knowledge of regions of the world to the core of intellectual disciplines.
- f. To conduct research to promote an inter-regional comparative perspective.

8.2 Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India

India has produced great thinkers and social leaders who, by their revolutionary and path-breaking thoughts and actions, have left a lasting impact on India and the world. They have developed indigenous ideas and have provided cultural and ethical identity to India. There is a great need to acquaint the teachers and students with their thinking and work and to involve them in studies, research, and fieldwork-based extension service programmes of constructive work. The Scheme of Epoch-Making Social Thinkers of India (Special Studies) was initiated by the UGC in the year 1983. Under this scheme, assistance is provided by the UGC to set up Centers for Special Studies in the areas of Gandhian, Nehru, Dr. Ambedkar, Buddhist, Dr. Zakir Hussain, Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya, Indira Gandhi Studies, etc., in Universities/Colleges/ Institutions for pursuing studies related to the thought and programmes of these great thinkers and social leaders. There are 394 study centers established in various universities/colleges under the Scheme 'Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India. To acquaint teachers and students with the thoughts and ideas of great social thinkers of India, there are 394 Study Centers established in various Colleges. No reimbursement was given under the scheme during 2022-23. Grants released in level -1, 60.00 lakh and level-2, 40.00 lakh and level-3, 25.00 Lakh Universities.

9.1 e-Governance Cell/e-Office/UGC Website

9.1(i) e-Governance

The e-Governance Cell was established in the office of the University Grants Commission, New Delhi, in 2019 with the help of the INFLIBNET Centre (an IUC of UGC). A team of dedicated technical staff has been appointed in the e-Governance Cell to speed up e-Governance in UGC. Web portals and Applications have been developed for inviting online applications and information from HEIs under various UGC schemes and activities to make the work environment transparent and paperless. The Webportal is successfully operational with the provision for the generation of MIS reports as follows:

- UGC Commission Meeting Management System

UGC has organized various meetings/seminars and training programme through virtual mode with the help of the e-Governance Cell.

9.1(ii) e-Office

e-Office premium version software of the National Informatics Centre (NIC) to achieve a simplified, responsive, effective and transparent working in the office of UGC has been implemented with the help of NIC.

To ensure the optimum use of the e-office module of NIC (including e-Noting), UGC has organized an e-office training programme for all UGC Officers and Officials from time to time with the help of NIC.

All the modules of e-Office facilities, including e-Noting, e-filing, etc., are fully functional in the office of UGC. The UGC officials can access e-Office facilities by using Digital signature or through their Aadhar card number for Work from Home (WFH) by registering on e-office portal at https://sacess.nic.in. The NIC email services are also activated in the UGC Regional Offices.

9.1 (iii) UGC Website

The UGC website's main objective is to share important information of various UGC schemes to End Users / Stakeholders. Also, stakeholders can submit/upload various information, including University

reports, proposals for schemes, apply for scholarships/fellowships/jobs, etc., through UGC web portals. The UGC website is being updated on a regular basis. A new UGC Website is being developed. "UGC is redesigning the UGC website to make it more user-friendly, informative, and dynamic. All information is categorized according to the type of stakeholders, such as students, faculty and Universities. It will help to ease in getting information". The section is also handling the work of various portals with the provision for generating MIS reports as follows:

9.1(iii) (a) University Activity Monitoring Portal (UAMP)

The University Activity Monitoring Portal of UGC serves as a one-point stop for events/activities undertaken by HEIs from time to time. This portal is facilitating Universities to upload details of various events /activities undertaken by them. Universities are requested to log in to this portal with the same user ID and password as provided to them by UGC for the UGC University portal. Also, Universities may regularly update their contact details on this portal. In the year 2022-23, UGC captured action-taken reports from Universities and Colleges for the following activities:

9.2 Productivity by engaging in Online learning

9.2(i) Production of courseware E-content for postgraduate subjects (https://epgp.inflibnet.ac.in/)

e-PG Pathshala: The National Mission on Education through Information Communication Technology (NME-ICT) is envisaged as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme to leverage the potential of ICT in the teaching and learning process for the benefit of all the learners in Higher Education institutions at anytime, anywhere mode.

The content developed under this initiative is of high quality, curriculum-based, and interactive in different subjects across all disciplines of social sciences, arts, fine arts and humanities, natural, mathematical sciences, linguistics and languages under this initiative named e-PG Pathshala. It is available in open access and hosted on the INFLIBNET server.

The objectives of the project were as follows:

- i. Developed e-content in 700+ courses at the PG level, drawing expertise from subject experts in colleges and universities.
- ii. Impart training to subject experts in the process of e-content creation.
- iii. Make e-content available to students and peers using different delivery modes to impart formal and informal education and supplement and complement the process of teaching and learning in higher education and
- iv. Promote usage of e-content amongst students and peers.

e-PGPathshala provides high-quality e-content for PG programmes for the benefit of teachers and students. It addresses disparities of various kinds such as rich/poor, urban/rural, cast, religion-based disparities, geographical disparities, regional disparities, etc. e-PG Pathshala content is being used by universities for blended learning.

Status of e-content developed so far is shown below in the table and the e-PG Pathshala Project got over on 30.09.2017.

Total expenditure incurred in the Project during 2022-23 is ₹28,02,100/- (Rupees Twenty-eight lakhs two thousand and one hundred only.

9.2(ii) Massive Open Online Courses for SWAYAM Platform (www.swayam.gov.in)

The Government has launched the SWAYAM portal that provides an integrated platform for online courses using information and communication technology (ICT). Through this, it would be possible for any student to join virtual courses offered by the best teachers in the Country, interact with the teacher, take tests, earn academic credits, and transfer them to their academic record.

The Major achievement under the SWAYAM by UGC is as follows:

- 1. Two hundred and eighty-nine (289) Universities have come on board to accept credit transfer for courses offered through the SWAYAM platform.
- 2. To make the last mile connectivity a possibility, UGC has collaborated with the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (Meity) to integrate its e-resources with Common Service Centres (CSC) and Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) centers across the country. The Chairman, UGC launched the UGC e-resources portal (https://ugceresources.in/) on 29th July 2022 to mark two years of NEP-2020. The portal provides digital online courses to students in rural areas through the 2.5 lakh CSCs/SPVs of MeitY centers in Gram Panchayats and five lakhs plus CSCs/SPVs centres across the nation.

The e-resources include:

- 27 MOOCs in 8 Indian Languages (Hindi, Gujarati, Marathi, Bangla, Telugu, Kannada, Malayalam, Tamil)
- Non-Technology archived MOOCs (135 PG Courses, 243 UG Courses)
- EPG Pathshala (e-Content in 67 PG Subjects).

Through this single portal of UGC e-resource, the learner can view high quality, curriculum-based, interactive online e-contents in different subjects across all disciplines of sciences, social sciences arts, fine arts and humanities, natural & mathematical sciences, linguistics and languages developed by Faculty Members of Central Universities and Institutes of national importance in the country. The translated courses address language barriers, promote Indian languages, and provide learning flexibility in the mother tongue.

4 lakh students/learners/faculty members had visited the UGC e-resources portal (*https://ugceresources.in/*).

- 3. UGC constituted the Subject Matter Expert Committee on the development of MOOC on Arctic/Polar Studies for the SWAYAM Platform. On the recommendation of the said Committee, UGC advertised an expression of Interest (EOI) for the development of MOOCs on the six pillars of India's Arctic Policy (IAP) on 12.04.2022. In response to UGC's EOI, 92 MOOC proposals were received. Two members from the UGC Expert Committee shortlisted 37 proposals, which were again seen by the Expert Committee and ten proposals were invited for presentation and face-to-face interaction before the Expert Committee based on which the Expert Committee has finalized 4 Proposals for the development of MOOC on SWAYAM Platform. To create awareness among universities and colleges about the availability of courses, jobs, and research opportunities in Arctic/Polar Studies, UGC organized a National Webinar on "India's Arctic Policy: Scope & Opportunities" on 9th December 2022.
- 4. UGC provided an Extension to Agencies/Vendors for Multimedia Works for SWAYAM on a Rate Contract basis for another year, i.e., from 08.03.2023 to 07.O3.2O24.
- 5. Chairman, **UGC** launched UGC **MOOCs** for the **SWAYAM** 6thplatform for the January 2023 semester **February** on 2023.

These MOOCs include:

- i. History of Indian Buddhism-four credits
- ii. Abhidhamma (Pali), four credits.
- iii. Buddhist Philosophy, for four credits,
- iv. Community Engagement & Social Responsibility, -two credits,

The registration to enroll in these courses was opened for students/lifelong learners/working professionals on 15th January 2023, and the last date for registration was 15th March 2023. The recommendation for the development of the first three MOOCs for Buddhist Studies on the revival of India as a Global centre of Buddhist Culture and Tourism was made in the meeting of Committees of Secretaries (Cos), Cabinet Secretariat on 31st August & 29th October 2020. UGC constituted an Expert Committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. Geshe Ngawang Samten, Vice-Chancellor, Central Institute of Higher Tibetan Studies, Sarnath, Varanasi. The Buddhist Studies courses have been developed under the Coordinatorship of Prof. Samten and the Central Institute of Higher Tibetan Studies, Sarnath, Varanasi, is the Host University for these MOOCs. The students who enrolled in Universities/Institutions/Colleges can avail of Credit Transfer as per UGC SWAYAM Regulations, 2021 for this course. The Host University for this Credit Transfer will be the Central Institute of Higher Tibetan Studies (CIHTS), Sarnath, Varanasi. The fourth MOOC developed is Community Engagement and Social Responsibility, which is a major recommendation of NEP 2020, as part of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) in India. Dayalbagh Educational Institute, Agra, is the Host University for this MOOC. In December 2022, UGC issued the Guidelines on Fostering Social Responsibility and Community Engagement in HEIs in India 2.0. As the Guidelines recommend teaching a two-credit Community Engagement and Social Responsibility course, the UGC identified seven Regional Centres for Capacity Building of faculty as Master Trainers (MTs) for Community Based Participatory Research (CBPR) under UBA. Towards this, UGC has conducted two online training programmes for nominated faculty members from the seven centres on January 27 and February 15, 2022, and three-day face-to-face training programmes conducted in each of the seven UGC Regional Centres from April to July 2022 as supervised by UGC Subject Expert Group (SEG) resource persons and supported by local resource persons.

Total expenditure incurred in the Project (MOOCs for SWAYAM) during 2022-23 was ₹ 1,62,27,889.62 (Rupees One Crore Sixty-Two Lakhs Twenty-Seven Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-Nine and Sixty-Two Paise Only).

9.3 National Academic Depository (NAD)

National Academic Depository (NAD) is a permanent scheme of the Ministry of Education (MoE) implemented by the University Grants Commission (UGC) through a single depository DigiLocker. It is an online storehouse of academic awards (Degrees, Mark-Sheets, etc.) lodged by the Academic Institutions (Universities, INIs, School Boards, etc.) in a digital format. This facilitates students to get authentic documents/certificates in digital format directly from their original issuers anytime, anywhere without any physical interface.

Achievements & Initiatives

- UGC is operating NAD Cell from UGC-NAD Cell, South Campus, University of Delhi, Benito Juarez Marg, New Delhi 110021.
- Designated staff has been appointed for the Cell which includes 1-System Analyst and 1-Data Analyst. A designated email has been provided on the website to report grievances related to NAD.
- UGC to be authorized to implement NAD as a permanent scheme in co-operation with the DigiLocker, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) as a single entity of NAD without levy of any user charge.

- All academic institutions have been also requested to create a hyperlink of NAD on their website and requested to set up a NAD cell for implementation of NAD.
- Regularly guiding institutions about registering and uploading of data on NAD either telephonically and if necessary, through video conference. The video conference support link is available on the website to join directly between 2.30pm to 5.30 pm.
- All the Academic Institutes who have registered with DigiLocker has appointed a nodal officer for NAD, whose contact details (email and mobile phone) are available with depository.
- List of universities (central, state, deemed and private) has been provided to DigiLocker time to time.
- NAD Cell keeps asking all the Universities from time to time to upload the maximum data of students.
- NAD cell has sent the monthly status report to Ministry.

9.4 Academic Bank of Credit (ABC):

National Education Policy (NEP)-2020 proposes several reforms to create a system that is aligned with the aspirational goals of 21st century education. Towards attainment of such education, the flexible and innovative curriculum of all HEIs shall include Credit Based Courses with provision of multiple entry/exit options. The Policy recommends establishment of an Academic Bank of Credit (ABC), which would digitally store the academic credits earned from various recognized HEIs so that the degrees from an HEI can be awarded taking into account credits earned.

Academic Bank of Credit (ABC), as envisaged in the NEP-2020, shall be a National-level facility to promote flexibility of curriculum framework and interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary and academic mobility of students across the Higher Education Institutions in the country with appropriate "Credit Transfer" mechanism. It shall be a mechanism to facilitate the students to choose their own learning path to attain a Degree/Diploma/PG-diploma etc., working on the principle of multiple entry-multiple exits as well as anytime, anywhere, and any level learning. ABC shall enable the integration of multiple discipline of higher learning leading to the desired learning outcomes including increased creativity, innovation, higher order thinking and critical analysis.

The ABC shall provide to each of the students the facility to open a unique/individual Academic Bank Account in digital form. Each account holder would be provided with a unique id. The major functions of ABC are registration of HEIs under the ABC scheme and, opening, closure and validation of academic accounts of students, credit verification, credit accumulation, credit transfer/redemption of students and also promotion of the ABC among the stake holders.

ABC shall not be, by itself a degree-awarding organisation. The Statutory degree-awarding power shall continue to be vested with the eligible HEIs which have registered with ABC. The credit requirements as well as essential components of study for award of any UG/PG degree or course work requirements for the Ph.D programmes would be defined by the respective Universities or Autonomous institutions participating in the ABC scheme. The scheme would be implemented under the overall supervision of the

Departement of Higher Education, Ministry of Education or an autonomous/statutory body under MoE designated by it. The IT support will be given by NeGD (National e-Governance Division) of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY). It will leverage the existing DigiLocker system. The ABC portal (https://www.abc.gov.in/) is open for registration of both Students and Universities.

For the effective implementation of this student-centric facility, it is essential that all Central Universities, with the approval of their statutory authorities/ amendment of extant ordinances, register with the ABC and monitor the development and operationalization of the ABC programme at the university level. In this regard ABC has conducted an online meeting as follows:

- On 29th December 2022 meeting with Vice-Chancellors of Central Universities & Directors of IITs.
- In January 2023, meeting with Dean of Examination, Delhi University regarding uploading of NAD & ABC data.
- Scheduled the review meeting with **All Central Universities VC's** from 24-01-2023 to 31-01-2023 regarding the ABC data uploading.
- Scheduled the meeting with all Registrar/Controller of Examination/Nodal Officer of State, Private & Deemed to be universities of Bihar and Gujarat on 14-02-2023 at 11:00am, regarding the upload the data (credits data) for ABC and created the bulk ID's of students in ABC.

9.5 e-Samadhaan

UGC e-Samadhaan Portal was officially launched on 5th September 2022, replacing the existing Student Grievance Redressal Portal, which has some issues and concerns of various stakeholders. Because of the non-availability of a single window system, the stakeholders were lodging multiple complaints / grievances at various places. Due to that, the redressal mechanisms were at a slow pace, which was also causing further concerns to the stakeholders. To resolve the above issues, UGC came up with the "e-Samadhaan Online Grievance Registering and Monitoring System" (https://samadhaan.ugc.ac.in/). It is a digital platform for Stakeholders to identify and apply for grievances/feedback/queries. This platform ensures a time-bound mechanism for redressal of grievances.

"UGC e-Samadhaan: A step forward: Service to Stake Holders" (https://samadhaan.ugc.ac.in/) which would be:

- A Single Window system for all the stakeholders to register their complaints/grievances on the portal, which would be available 24x7 with a click of a mouse. A toll-free No., 1800-111-656, will also be available on the UGC website 24x7 for lodging complaints by the stakeholders on any issue faced by them.
- The user would be able to register a grievance by following a simple procedure with the help of a mail ID /making a phone call to a toll-free number.
- The complaint gets recorded, and a docket number shall be allotted, which would be automatically reflected in the concerned Bureau Head's accounts.
- The concerned bureau shall resolve the issues within the stipulated time as per the details given below:

10.1 National Skills Qualifications Framework

The UGC is implementing three schemes viz. Community Colleges, B.Voc Degree Programme, and Deen Dayal Upadhyay Centres for Knowledge Acquisition and up-gradation of Skilled Human Abilities and Livelihood (KAUSHAL) under NSQF.

Since all these three schemes serve a common purpose and share similar objectives, they have been merged under **National Skills Qualifications Framework** (NSQF) in the year 2019 and separate guidelines for providing skill-based education under NSQF have been issued. National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF) is a competency-based framework that organizes qualifications according to a series of knowledge, skills and aptitude. The NSQF levels, graded from 4 to 10, are defined in terms of learning outcomes which the learner must possess regardless of whether they are obtained through formal, nonformal or informal learning.

University Grants Commission has been facilitating Higher Educational Institutions to offer skill courses at the level of Certificate, Diploma, Advanced Diploma, B.Voc, M.Voc and Ph.D. under **National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF).** These are full-time credit-based modular programmes, wherein banking of credits for skill and general education components are permitted so as to enable multiple exit and entry. These programs not only address the employment issue but also build linkages between academia and industry.



12.1 Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF)

UGC has prepared a document on the Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework after consultation with various subject experts. The basic premise of the Learning Outcomes based curriculum approach is to align the curriculum of a discipline with Programme Learning Outcomes and Academic Standards defined for the discipline. It is a student-centric learning approach. LOCF aims to equip students with knowledge, skills, values and attitudes. A new curriculum in 31 subjects based on LOCF has been developed and uploaded on the UGC website to facilitate universities to revise the curriculum.

Following the notification of the Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes, the LOCF needs to be developed afresh as the program duration, curriculum content, and learning outcomes changed after the National Education Policy 2020 announcement.

12.2 Evaluation Reforms

UGC has initiated Evaluation Reforms to revamp the current evaluation system to promote assessment-driven learning with continuous evaluation. It has been envisaged that by clearly specifying the subject-wise learning outcomes, a complete restructuring of the present system can be attempted.

An effective education system relies on the integrity and efficacy of the existing evaluation system. Unless evaluations are designed to be the best identifiers of the performance of students, students won't put in their best efforts in learning and understanding concepts.

It is imperative that an Educational Institute has a robust yet flexible evaluation system that is also in consonance with NEP 2020 objectives. These objectives, in the context of evaluation, can be summarized as:

- 1. Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation
- 2. Criterion-based grading system
- 3. Learning Outcome-Based Education and Evaluation

NEP 2020 proposes that HEIs should adopt continuous and comprehensive evaluation rather than high-stakes examinations. Continuous and comprehensive evaluation embraces horizontal assessment modes instead of one single vertical mode. It can be used to assess the overall development of students, for example, critical thinking, problem-solving ability, right application of knowledge, and adherence to ethics.

Accordingly, UGC has developed "Innovative Pedagogical Approaches & Evaluation Reforms" and published it on 22.12.2022.

12.3 Life Skills (Jeevan Kaushal) for Students

Background: - One of the Quality Mandate initiatives undertaken by the University Grants Commission to accomplish Quality in Higher Education is imparting Life Skills learning for students. There is an immense demand in the country for employable, exceptionally performing graduates with skills, knowledge, values, and ethics crucial for a fresh professional. To introduce the Life Skills curriculum in non-technical undergraduate education, UGC, with the help of a committee, has developed a curriculum for Life Skills (Jeevan Kaushal) in 2018. This curriculum has been revised as per the recommendations of NEP 2020. UGC has also prepared "Facilitators' Guidelines for the Curriculum on Life Skills (Jeevan Kaushal)" to effectively implement this Curriculum. The "Draft Curriculum on Life Skills (Jeevan Kaushal) 2.0" and "Draft Facilitators' Guidelines for Life Skills Curriculum (Jeevan Kaushal)" were uploaded on the UGC website on 24 February 2023 to solicit views/suggestions from stakeholders, including teachers, students, researchers and those involved in the related field latest by 10.03.2023.

UGC is in the process of incorporating the feedback and suggestions received from the stakeholders, and after finalization, the same will be placed in the commission for approval.

12.4 Scheme for Trans-disciplinary Research for India's Developing Economy (STRIDE)

The main objective of the scheme:

- 1. To identify young talent, strengthen research culture, build capacity, promote innovation and support trans-disciplinary research relevant to national development and to enhance the overall well-being of society.
- 2. To fund high impact national network projects in the identified thrust areas in Humanities and human sciences, and Indian knowledge systems.

The scheme has been discontinued since 31.03.2023.

Grant released during the financial year 2022-23 is ₹ 2.17 Crore. Number of Beneficiaries are 14 Universities/ Colleges.

12.5 Consortium for Academic Research and Ethics (UGC-CARE)

UGC-CARE- A Quality Mandate for Indian Academia:

To match global standards of high-quality research in all academic disciplines under its purview, the University Grants Commission (UGC) aspires to stimulate and empower the Indian academia through its "Quality Mandate". A public notice was issued by the UGC on the 28th of November 2018 to announce the establishment of a dedicated Consortium for Academic and Research Ethics (CARE) to carry out this mandate.

Objectives of the UGC-CARE:

- To promote quality research, academic integrity and publication ethics in Indian universities.
- To promote high-quality publications in reputed journals that would help in achieving higher global ranks.
- To develop an approach and methodology for the identification of good-quality journals.
- To prevent publications in predatory/dubious/sub-standard journals, which reflect adversely and tarnish the image of Indian academia?

• To create and maintain a "UGC-CARE Reference List of Quality Journals" (UGC-CARE List) for all academic purposes.

Need for UGC-CARE List:

- 1. The credibility of research publications is extremely important because it represents the academic image of an individual, the institution, and the entire nation.
- 2. The number of research articles published in reputed journals is one of the globally- accepted indicators considered for various academic purposes such as institutional ranking, appointments, promotions of faculty members, membership of academic committees, award of research degrees, etc.
- 3. The problem of predatory/dubious/sub-standard journals has become a cause of serious concern all over the world.
- 4. The percentage of research articles published in poor-quality journals is reported to be high in India, which has adversely affected its image.
- 5. Publications in dubious/sub-standard journals reflect adversely, leading to long-term academic damage and a tarnished image of an individual, institution and nation.

The Scope of the UGC-CARE List:

- UGC-CARE has taken the responsibility of preparing the "UGC-CARE Reference List of Quality Journals" (UGC-CARE List).
- A list of Indian journals, especially from disciplines of Arts, Humanities, Languages, Culture and Indian Knowledge Systems is being prepared and updated quarterly (UGC-CARE Group I).
- The UGC-CARE List includes journals from all disciplines indexed in globally accepted Databases, such as those indexed in Scopus (Source list) or Web of Science (Arts and Humanities Citation Index Source Publication, Science Citation Index Expanded Source Publication, Social Science Citation Index Source Publication). These journals are to be considered for all academic purposes. Journals indexed in Scopus and / or Web of Science is part of UGC-CARE List Group II.

Extension of UGC-CARE project:

The project is extended up to March 2024 (Public notice No. F.No.1 -8/201 6 (CPP-II) dated April 2023)

UGC-CARE List: Release and updation:

UGC-CARE List for the year 2022-23 was published quarterly on the following days.

- 1st March 2022 12th Quarter.
- 12th July 2022 13th Quarter.
- 3rd January 2023 14th & 15th Quarter.
- 1st April 2023 16th Quarter.

Empower committee meetings:

Six online meetings of the Empower committee and nodal officers of UGC-CARE were organized.

Financial grant:

Financial grant was released to UGC-CARE Cell journal analysis at SPPU and to four regional

UGC-CARE Universities in this year. A total grant of ₹ 50,00,000/- for two years, 2021-2023

to Centre for Publication Ethics, Savitribai Phule Pune University and ₹ 5,00,000/- for each of the regional universities was released.

12.6 Paramarsh Mentoring of Non-Accredited Institutions

UGC has implemented the scheme of "Paramarsh"- a new initiative for mentoring non-accredited institutions to enable them to get accredited by 2022.UGC invited proposals from eligible institutions i.e., those having NAAC scores of 3.26 and above. The mentor institution shall be provided with financial assistance up to ₹ 30 lakhs. In the case of mentoring any institution in the North-Eastern region, an additional amount of ₹ 2 lakhs shall be provided to the mentor institution. The UGC will consider the performance outcomes of the mentoring institutions based on innovative steps initiated by them to motivate the non-accredited institutions, performance level of the Mentor institutions on Key indicators vis-à-vis the expected levels of performance, and number of mentee institutions accredited and their score. 167 Institutions have been identified as mentor institutions.

12.7 Guidelines and Curriculum Framework for Environment Education

Environment Education

In the National Statement at the UNFCCC CoP 26 Global Leaders' Summit in Glasgow, the Hon'ble Prime Minister's mantra was Lifestyle for Environment, and he also stressed setting a target for Net Zero Carbon Emissions by 2030.

- On October 20th, 2022, the Prime Minister launched Mission LiFE (Lifestyle for Environment), a global movement to safeguard our environment from the impact of climate change. LiFE (Lifestyle for Environment) is an India-led global mass movement for "mindful and deliberate utilization, instead of mindless and destructive consumption" to protect and preserve the environment. LiFE was also a cover page item of CoP 27 in Egypt.
- LiFE is part of India's updated Nationally Determined Contributions to propagate a healthy and sustainable way of living based on the ancient Indian traditions and values of conservation and moderation.
- LiFE highlights Indian traditions and love for nature and draws upon this to nudge individual and community behavior.

Activities done by UGC towards Mission Life in the financial year 2022-23: -

- 1. UGC wrote a letter to all HEIs regarding the Panch Pran and Lifestyle for Environment (LiFE) Movement on 2nd November 2022, requesting all HEIs to take part in the LiFE movement.
- 2. UGC, through its letter dated 27th December 2022, requested HEIs to develop Nagar Vans/Vatikas in their institution in coordination with the Forest Department.
- 3. UGC conducted a Webinar on LiFE Lifestyle for the Environment on 21st March 2023 with the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change & UNDP for all HEIs.
- 4. UGC, through its letter dated 8th February 2023, invited comments/suggestions/ feedback from all stakeholders on the draft guidelines of Environment Education at *https://uamp.ugc.ac.in/*/latest by 22nd February 2023.

12.8 Student Career Progression and Alumni Network

Tracking of Student's Progress –UGC, in its 550th Meeting, considered and approved the report on "Student Career Progression and Alumni Network" to track the students' career progress after completion of the course.

Alumni Connect Cell:

Alumni of foreign origin, as well as Indian alumni living abroad, can play a crucial role in brand building of the Indian Higher Education Institutions abroad and making India a global study destination. Higher education institutions in India need to create a culture for alumni to reconnect, devise suitable vehicles for brand building and give due recognition to their contributions. The "Alumni Connect" encourages Indian HEIs to engage with Alumni (of foreign origin and Indians living abroad). To maintain a continuous engagement with the alumni, the HEIs may undertake several activities, such as:

- Establish an alumni cell and maintain a detailed database of the alumni living abroad (both Indian and foreign)
- Sharing with the alumni regarding the latest initiatives of the institution
- Virtually connecting with the alumni and inviting them to participate in conferences/webinars.
- Networking get-togethers among the alumni, including through video conferencing.
- Providing brochures, pamphlets and other advertising materials about the institution, programmes, and courses for its dissemination abroad
- Engage in community service activity with the help of Alumni.
- Honoring distinguished alumni for supporting in brand building exercise as well as the overall development of the institution

UGC has already issued necessary guidelines to all Universities to set up the Alumni Connect Cell. So far, 164 Universities have set up the Alumni Connect Cell.

12.9 Quality Improvement Programme

To give effect to one of the major reforms of NEP 2020, the UGC developed guidelines for multiple entries and exits in academic programmes in HEIs and was notified on 29th July 2021. The system provides learners with varied certification options and paves the way for seamless student mobility between or within degree-granting Higher Education Intuitions (HEIs) through a formal system of credit recognition. Credit accumulation, credit transfers, and credit redemption. The flexibility in academic programmes will enable learners to seek employment after any level of award and join back as and when feasible to upgrade their qualifications. The advantages of multiple entry and exit options curtail dropout rates and improve Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in higher education.

UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedures for award of Ph.D. degree) Regulations

The UGC regulations, which set the minimum standards and procedure for the award of Ph.D., have been revised according to the recommendations of National Education Policy 2020 and the UGC has notified the new UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for the award of Ph.D.) Regulations 2022 in the official Gazette on 07th November 2022. These new regulations are framed to encourage research scholars to become well-trained researchers and inquisitive explorers.

Curriculum Framework and Credit System for Undergraduate Programme

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 highlights that quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals. The way to achieve such capabilities is only through holistic and multidisciplinary education with the freedom for students to shape their studies.

Keeping in view of NEP's recommendations, the UGC has revised the Choice-Based Credit System and developed a new Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes. The framework reflects the NEP's recommendations, such as restructured degree programmes, multiple entry, and exit. Flexible degree options with single major, double major, multi-inter-disciplinary choices, and a curriculum built with employability skills in addition to academic subjects.

The draft framework was placed in the public domain for feedback and shared with IITs, IISERs, NITs, IIMs, Statutory Councils and Industry bodies for input. Based on the inputs thus received, the framework was revised and the revised one was submitted for the consideration of the Commission through e-circulation and approved. The Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme was published on 12.12.2022 on the UGC website.

Guidelines for Transforming Higher Education Institutions into Multidisciplinary Institution.

The quintessence of Higher Education Institution (HEI), as envisioned in the National Education Policy 2020, builds vibrant communities of scholars and peers, breaks down harmful silos between disciplines and enables students to become well-rounded individuals. However, a substantial number of HEIs in the country are either single-stream institutions or multidisciplinary institutions with rigid disciplinary boundaries. To transform the HEIs into multidisciplinary institutions within the timelines suggested by the NEP 2020, therefore, is a challenge.

To enable the transformation of HEIs into multidisciplinary institutions, the UGC constituted a committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. R. P. Tiwari. The Committee has suggested multiple ways, such as collaboration, merging and clustering between institutions, to achieve the characteristics of a multidisciplinary institution. The guidelines have been published on 02.09.2022 at UGC Website.
