**ADMISSIONS AND EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE AWARD OF THE
DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF SOCIAL WORK WITH HONORS AND HONORS
WITH RESEARCH DIRECTION, 2024**

Whereas, Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 (VI of 2017) (hereinafter the Act) has come into force from 1st March 2017; and the same has been made applicable to the Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University (hereinafter the “University”).

AND

Whereas, the University has issued Direction to 27 of 2022 dealing with the composition of the four faculties, created by the Act, where under the existing different faculties of the University have been merged into the four new faculties created by the Act, by which the subject of social work has been included in the faculty of Inter-disciplinary Studies;

AND

Whereas, the Board of Studies for the subject of Social Work in its meeting held on 26/06/2024 vide item No. 1(A) has considered, accepted and recommended to the Faculty, for its acceptance, the syllabi with draft direction and the scheme of examination of semesters I to VIII of the Bachelor of Social Work (Semester Pattern) Four-year Honors/ Research Degree Course;

AND

Whereas, the University has issued Direction No. 29 of 2023 prescribing “conditions for conduct of undergraduate and post graduate examinations based on credit based/choice based credit system, in all faculties, Direction, 2024”, prescribing certain conditions relating to maximum and minimum passing marks in the theory /practical subjects prescribed in the semester of a course, the maximum theory and practical subjects in a semester, rules of exemption and ATKT, and also the coding pattern for the subjects in each semester of the course;

AND

Whereas, The National New Education Policy of India has come into force from 29th of July 2020;

AND

Whereas, the Board of Studies in Social work in its meeting held on 26/6/2024 and has now considered accepted and recommended to the faculty for its acceptance, the revised social work curriculum structure as per NEP 2020 and syllabi with draft Direction and the scheme of examination of semesters I to VIII of the Bachelor of Social work (semester Pattern) (Honors and Honors with Research Four year degree) course to be made effective from the session 2024-25;

AND

Whereas, the Faculty of Humanities in its meeting held on 19/7/2024 and has now considered accepted and recommendations of the Board of Studies regarding the revised social work curriculum structure as per NEP 2020 and syllabi with draft Direction and the scheme of examination of semesters I to VIII of the Bachelor of Social work (semester Pattern) (Honors and Honors with Research Four year degree) course to be made effective from the session 2024-25;

AND

Whereas, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor has accepted the recommendation of the Board of Studies in social work and the Faculty, regarding the revised social work curriculum structure as per NEP 2020 and syllabi on behalf of the Academic Council in exercise of the powers vested in him Under Section 12(7) of the Act;

Now, therefore, I, Dr. Prashant Bokare, Vice-Chancellor, in exercise of my powers under section 12(8) of the Act, do hereby issue the following Direction;

1. This Direction may be called "Admissions and Examinations Leading to the Award of Certificate, Diploma, Degree and Bachelor of Social Work, Honors and Honors with Research Direction, 2024".
2. The Direction shall come into force from the date of its issuance; this direction shall be applicable from the academic year 2024-25. However all earlier students shall be governed by the earlier direction no 29/2023
3. In this Direction unless the context requires otherwise;
 - a. "ATKT" means "Allowed to Keep Term" in the higher semester, as per the rules herein.



- b. "Board of Studies" means Board of studies of the University in the discipline/subjects concerned.
- c. "Course" means a theory, practical (or the combination of theory and practical) subject, and research project, prescribed for any semester and carrying maximum and minimum passing marks, which a student, admitted to the programme of the Bachelor of Social Work (Choice Based Credit System) has to study in order to become eligible for the award of the Honors and Honors with Research Degree under this Direction.
- d. "Credit" means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is measured in terms of weekly class hours assigned to a Course.
- e. "Credit Point" (CP): It is the value obtained by multiplying the Grade Point by the Credit i.e. No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Points secured for that course.
- f. "Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)": CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across all the semesters. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in all the semesters by the total number of credits in all the semesters.
- g. "Degree" means the Graduate Degree of Bachelor of Social Work (completing six semesters)
- h. "Honors" means the Honors degree of Bachelor of Social Work (Completing 8 semester)
- i. "Honors with Research" means Honors with research of Bachelor of Social Work (completing 8 semester with the focus on research in VII and VIII semester)
- j. "Grade Letter": It is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course/ Paper. It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper. It is indicated by a Grade letter O,A+,A, B+,B,C,P and F. There is a range of marks for each Grade.

- k. "Grade Point" : Grade Point is weight allotted to each grade letter depending on the marks awarded in a course/paper
- k. "Programme" means the Graduate Honors and Honors with Research Degree Programme of Bachelor of Social Work (Choice Based Credit System) (for short "B.S.W." programme) under this Direction.
- l. "Student" means a student admitted to the programme under this Direction.
- m. "Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)": SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. It is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.
- n. "University": means Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur.
4. **Eligibility for Admission to the course:** A Student passed with higher secondary examination (10+2 pattern), or Certificate course in social work or any other equivalent course, shall be eligible to take admission in the undergraduate course governed by this Direction.
5. The duration of the programme, Bachelor of Social Work (CBCS) shall be of four academic years consisting of eight semesters with the University examinations at the end of each semester.
6. **Medium of Instruction:** Medium of instruction shall be Marathi, Hindi or English.
7. Under this directive, there are two four-year degree programs: a Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.) with Honors and a Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.) Honors with Research. Students who have completed semesters I to VI with a C.G.P.A. of 7.5 or above and wish to pursue research are eligible for admission into Semester VII of the B.S.W. Honors with Research program.
8. **Programme Structure:** Following shall be the structure of the Bachelor of Social Work programme. This programme shall comprise theory papers, field work practicum and Research Project spread in various semesters as described and detailed herein;

9. Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit (MEME):

- a. A student may opt for the award of a Certificate upon completing Semesters I and II. This option allows the student to exit the program after fulfilling the requirement of a one-month block placement.

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- b. A student may choose to exit the program after completing Semesters I to IV and request the award of a Diploma in Social Work. To do so, the student must complete an online NSQF course or a one-month internship.
- c. A student may choose to exit the program after completing Semesters I to VI and request the award of a Bachelor Degree in Social Work. To qualify, the student must complete a one-month internship as specified in the syllabus.
- d. A student who has opted to exit the program at any level before completing the four-year degree may re-enter the program, provided they complete the degree within seven years from the date of their first admission.
- e. Following table shows the credit required for Multiple exit :

Multiple Entry: Students from other disciplines may opt for or be admitted to specific theory courses of 4 or 2 credits that do not have a fieldwork component.

10. Number of Theory papers, social work practicum and Group Research Project:

There shall be a total of 44 theory papers for the BSW Honors Programme and 45 Papers in Social work Honors with Research Programme. All the papers are compulsory to all students. Social work Practicum shall be mandatory from 1st. to 8th. Semester in Honors Degree Rural Camp of 5-7 days duration shall be a part of social work practicum during 4th semester and study tour shall be a part of 6th semester. The study tour should be conducted within Maharashtra region. Each student shall require undertaking the Individual Research Project, in a subject relevant to the area of social work practice. The semester wise allocation of subject, credits and Teaching hours as follows.

11. Assessment/Evaluation structure :

- a. Marks structure for theory papers: Programme consist of two types of theory paper i.e. 100 Marks (4 Credits) and 50 Marks (2 Credits). Theory paper shall be of 4 Credits(100 marks)with 80 Marks for University /Theory Examination and 20 Marks for Internal Assessment. While 2 Credits (50 Marks) with 40 Marks for University /Theory Examination and 10 Marks for Internal Assessment.
- b. Internal assessment shall be based on submission of one assignment/ seminar/ workshop/ presentation from each paper/subjects. Student must appear for the internal assessment in the paper/subject.
- c. Attendance in each component of Social Work Practicum is mandatory. Student remaining absent in any component will liable to forfeit marks on the components.
- d. Internal and External Viva Voce is mandatory.
- e. The scheme of examination for Social Work Practicum and instructions for the

Individual Research Project for BSW Honors and Research honors is as given in this Direction.

- f. Study Tour and Residential Village camp is compulsory; there is no substitute component for this activity.
12. CGPA is (Cumulative Grade Point Average).: University/Institution /Colleges, CGPA is used to measure the overall academic Achievement of a student by awarding O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P, and F grades CGPA is as calculation of Average point obtained in all subjects except in additional subjects as per the study scheme.

Credit Point (C)—Credit Point is calculated for each and every successful papers/course as per following formula.

$$\text{Credit Point (C)} = \text{Credit} \times \text{Grade Point}$$

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester. SGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points.

Calculating SGPA and CGPA

- The grades upto C D awarded to student in all the courses shall be converted into a Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).

Where, P_j = Grade points earned in the j^{th} course;

C_j = Credit of j^{th} course upto semester for which CGPA is to be calculated.

$J=1,2,\dots,m$ represents the number of courses in which a student is registered upto the semester for which CGPA is to be calculated.

CGPA will be calculated after clearing all courses of semester I to IV.

Equivalent percentage calculation will be based on the following formula:

$$\text{Equivalent \%} = (\text{CGPA}) \times 10$$

Note: Final Mark List will only show the Grade and the Grade Points and not the marks.

13. Examination Pattern: -

Pattern for Four units paper : Four units in each theory paper. Thus the students will have to answer four questions with two internal options and fifth question will be compulsory.

Pattern for two unit paper : Students will have to answer four questions with two internal options and fifth question will be compulsory.

14. Passing Heads:- The students will have to pass independently in theory and practical exams. The criteria for passing will be 40% marks in respective subject. However there shall be no separate passing in Theory written and Internal component of the theory papers. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in Direction No.13 of 2017 or the corresponding promotion in next semester passing in **Social Work Practicum** is mandatory.

15. Evaluation System:- Examination of all subjects of Under Graduate Programmes shall be conducted by the R.T.M. Nagpur University as per the scheme of Examination prescribed by the relevant Ordinances/Regulations. Every student desirous for appearing at BSW examination will have to complete practical work as per the directions of the concerned teachers and obtain completion certificate to that effect duly signed by Head of the department. The student who fails to produce completion certificate will not be eligible to appear for the related practical or theory examination.

- a. The end-term examination for each semester, as well as the supplementary examination, shall be conducted in accordance with the notifications and directions issued by RTM Nagpur University from time to time.
- b. Academic calendar showing dates of commencement and end of teaching, internal assessment tests & term end examination shall be duly notified before commencement of each semester every year by the University/ Department/ Affiliated Colleges.

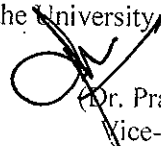
