REPORT

On 4th March, 2023, the Post-Graduate Teaching Department of Law, Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur had organized a National Webinar on "National Webinar on Evolution of Hybrid ADR Mechanism" from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. For this webinar, an esteemed Resource Person was invited namely, Mr. Chirag Balyan, assistant Professor of Law and Public Information Officer at MNLU, Mumbai and also Coordinator, of Centre for Arbitration and Research (CAR). The Webinar was co-ordinated by Ms. Padma Chobe, Assistant Professor, Post-Graduate Teaching Department of Law, Nagpur in the presence of dr. Payal Thaorey, Head and Senior Assistant Professor of Post-Graduate Teaching Department of Law, Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur.

Ms. Padma Chobe Assistant Professor, of Post-Graduate Teaching Department of, Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur made the introduction of the National Webinar as well as moderated the whole Webinar. Dr. Payal Thaorey HOD of the department, welcomes the resource person and deliver an introductory speech. In her short speech she mentioned the flexibility of hybrid dispute resolution and its customisable nature can help users to maximise the advantages of various dispute mechanisms. With the more complex nature of the disputes,. Ms. Bhumika Sahgal, student of Post-Graduate Teaching Department of Law, Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur, elaborated the academic qualifications as well as the professional excellences of the Resource Person.

The resource person Mr. Chirag Balyan, explains, a common hybrid dispute resolution mechanism is the mediation-arbitration mechanism ("med-arb"), where parties engage in mediation first and only proceed to arbitration should mediation fail. It is gathering momentum given the relatively lower costs and time investments, as well as the better preservation of business relationships associated with mediation over arbitration.

Sir later discussed in detail about the many other hybrid dispute resolution mechanisms are emerging as clients make the best use of the benefits offered by various mechanisms. They have the potential to reduce the perceived disadvantages of standalone arbitration or mediation, allowing parties great flexibility and creativity in shaping a resolution process.

Sir also put some light on the effective hybrid dispute resolution minimises costs through the efficient allocation of resources and effort to the various elements of a dispute with varying

complexities. Parties to a dispute might agree on several points underlying their disagreement while disagreeing on others. In such cases, the agreed points might be resolved in the initial shorter and less costly tiers, and only the remaining issues will be carried through to later stages of arbitration or litigation. This saves the time and money that would have been spent on these extra points. Benefits also arise through avoidance of some costs such as the diversion of management time from the effort from running the business and staff resources from normal business operations, as well as opportunity costs for expansion or further growth plans.

The eloquence and efficiency of the Resource Person drew the audience and held their attention throughout the session. The Webinar was concluded by question-answer session relating to the topic where all the resource persons had enthusiastically answered the queries of various participants. Dr. Vijayata Uikey, associate Professor, of Post-Graduate Teaching Department of Law, Nagpur proposed the formal vote of thanks for the Webinar. This Webinar was attended by more than 230 participants and received huge response as well as wonderful feedback from numerous participants across the country. The students of every stream from science to law actively participated in the webinar. Their constant support in maintaining the decorum is also well noticed. The students keenly listened and chalked out the highlights from the invited guest's insights and experiences.
