



AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON NEW EDUCATION POLICY 2020

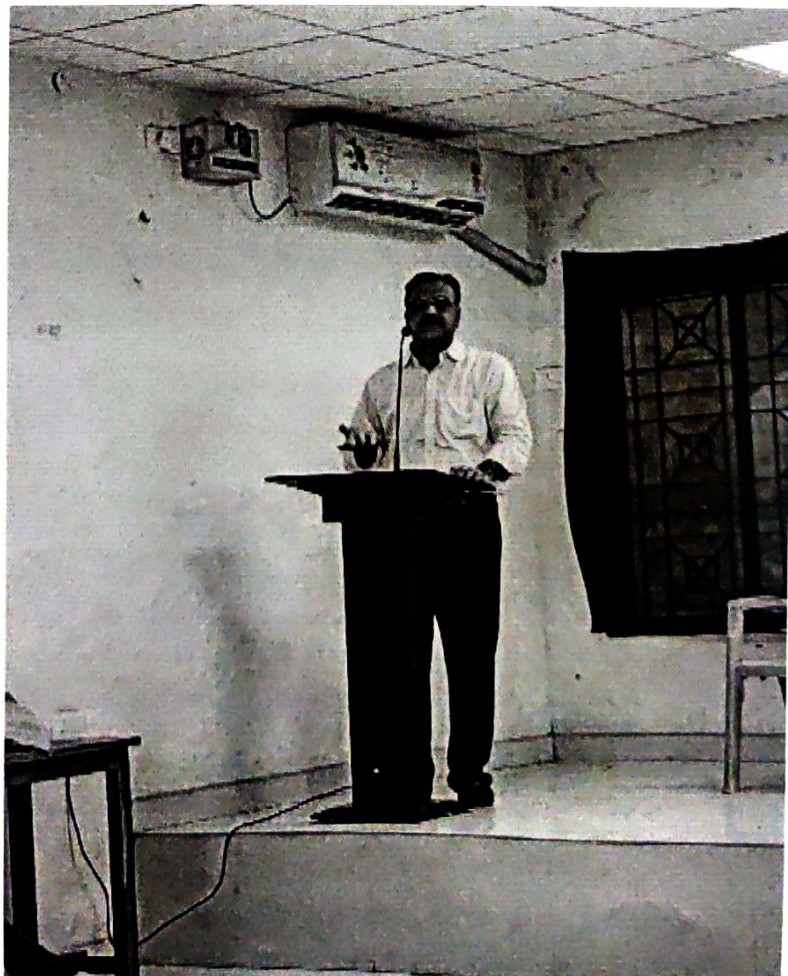

Thereafter, Dr. Sujit Metre Sir, Principal of Binjani Mahavidyalaya, Nagpur, Ex-Director of Datta Meghe Institute of Management Studies elucidated the difference between the New Education

Policy and National Education Policy. He said regarding NEP that in 2020 the child was born, we are celebrating its 3rd birthday but, the child is not yet out. New Education Policy is the brainchild of somebody sitting very high. He explained the necessity for this change in education policy but at the same time he highlighted the implementation barriers which the educational institutions are facing for the smooth implementation of NEP 2020.

His lecture was focused on the major, minor, structural drawback and the implementations of the policy. Sir mentioned the positive sides of the policy as well that 40% credits can be earned by the students outside of the institution with the help of vocational course, skill enhancement course, etc. Everything what students are doing right now for example, Yoga or any other activities will contribute in their credits itself hence, no activity apart from academics goes into waste.



Finally, Prof. Dr. Payal Thaorey, Head of the Post Graduate Teaching Department of Law, RTMNU in her concluding remarks explained that How the NEP 2020 is preparing the education institutes to prepare themselves for the global competition, Why the 4 years graduation course is necessary. In addition to this she said that RTMNU is precisely trying to implement NEP 2020, but this process of implementation is in its early stages and we need to wait for analysis its outcomes. of the presence of implementation lacunas.



After the lecture, there was a question answer session wherein the students have asked relevant question like how these choices will enhance job opportunities for them, can NEP 2020 deviate the teaching element etc to which the Resource person Dr. Sujit Metre aptly answered.
